
Dear Sirs,

This FAX responds to your FAXED letter of October 25, 2000. It provides a sequence of events from the delivery of this lot into storage until it was closed last year.

**October 23, 1963**

You deposited 20 items into the Santini warehouse in Brooklyn. These were identified as #1-#20 on the inventory. There were 17 boxes, 1 valise, 1 bag and a bundle of books. In all, the lot was 100 cubic feet in size. The account number assigned was S3023-223.

**May 3, 1968**

8 boxes were added to the lot. These were identified as #21-#28 on the inventory.

**May 29, 1969**

2 boxes were added to the lot. These were identified as #29-#30.

**August 18, 1972**

The account was transferred to Santini's warehouse on Jerome Avenue in the Bronx. The account number was changed to S57814-223.





**February 11, 1976**

Carton #25 was sent out via REA Air Express to R. Fischer o/o Claudia Mocarow in Pasadena, California.

**March 19, 2000**

The entire balance of the lot was airfreighted to you via Morgan Manhattan's International Department.

We have a 2-inch thick file on this lot dating back to 1963. Everything I have mentioned in this letter is backed by paperwork. We can only assume that the assigning of two lot numbers by Santini Brothers in 1963 and in 1972 caused the confusion regarding two lots. We have no other of your goods in our possession.


Dear Mr. Clark,
