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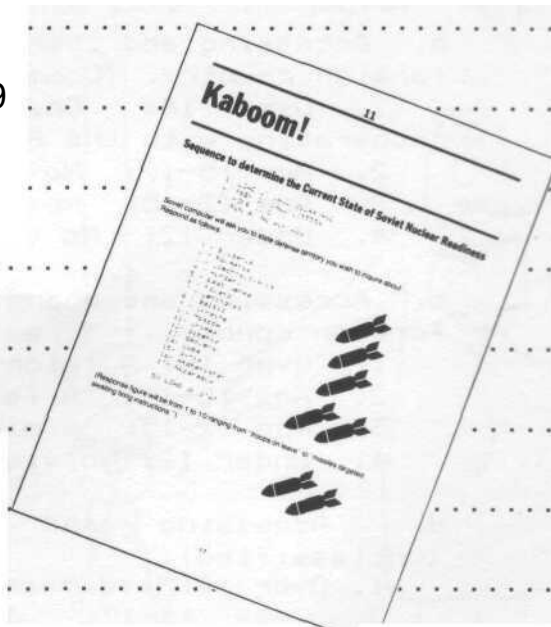
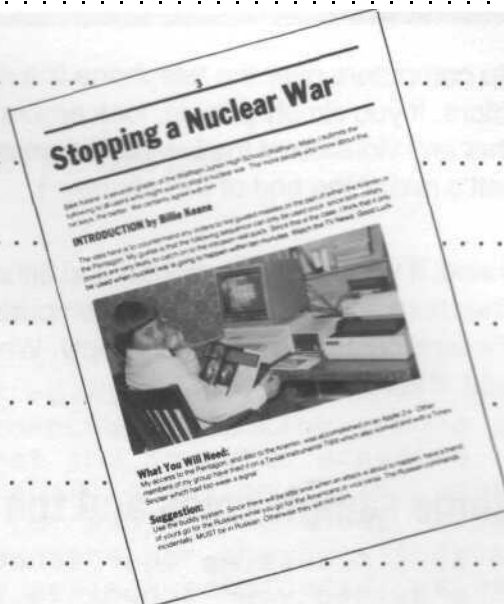

Raiding as a Crime

Accessing into computers over the telephone line may or may not be a crime, depending upon a number of factors. If you simply peer in, look around and then leave without disturbing anything, it is unclear whether any violation of the law has taken place. The Federal Courts are studying this. (See Phil Arnett's raid at the end of this chapter.)

On the other hand, if you enter a computer and either change things or remove things, then there is a violation. Furthermore, if you access into a computer without crossing a state line, you are not involved in a Federal crime and local laws apply. When you cross the state line, though, the FBI can get involved. It is very confusing.

Here are some sample raids and the consequences:

- a. Accessing your school and changing your grade, provided your school is in another state.
 1. Over 18: misdemeanor. 30 days or \$500.
 2. Age 15-17: Juvenile Court, possible reprimand to an institution.
 3. Age 12-15: No violation.
 4. Under 12: No violation

- b. Accessing and changing the computer records of a foreign country. (Communist block.)
 1. Over 18: One year in jail can be waived by cooperating with the FBI.
 2. Age 15-17: No violation.
 3. Age 12-15: No violation
 4. Under 12: No violation.

- c. Accessing and changing the computer records of a foreign country. (Free World).
 1. Over 18: A felony. Ten to twenty years.
 2. Age 15-17: A felony. One to five years.
 3. Age 12-15: A misdemeanor, \$500 fine.
 4. Under 12: No violation.

- d. Accessing and changing federal documents (unclassified).
 1. Over 18: Misdemeanor. 90 days or \$1000.
 2. Age 15-17: Juvenile Court, possible reprimand.
 3. Age 12-15: No violation.
 4. Under 12: No violation.

d. Accessing and changing federal documents (classified)

1. Over 18: Felony. Considered sabotage. Death.

2. Age 15-17: Felony. Considered sabotage. Death.

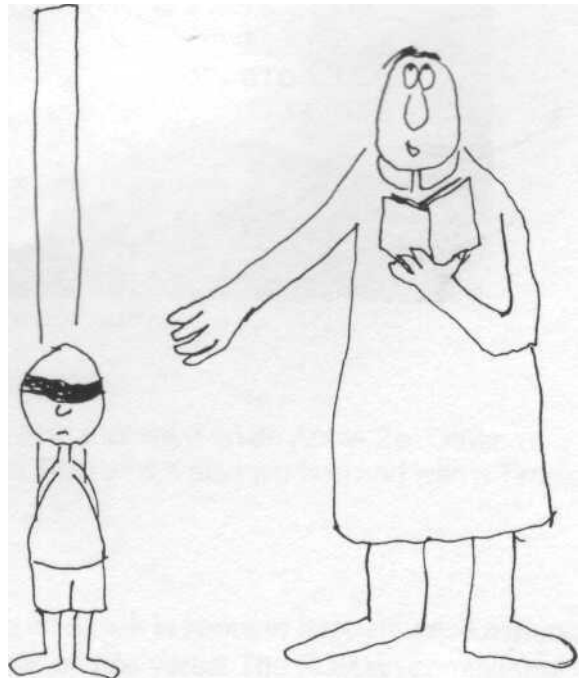
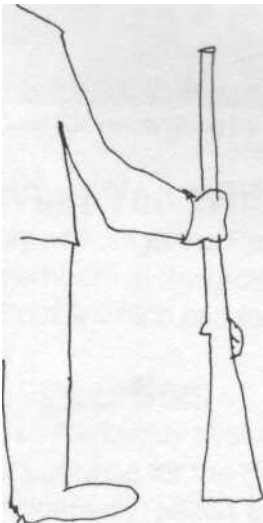
3. Age 12-15: No responsibility for the Felony. Both of your parents will be put to death.

4. Under 12: No responsibility for the Felony. One of your parents will be put to death.

"...on the other hand I really don't see what harm is done by accessing a computer, looking around and then leaving provided that the computer accessed **is** not containing classified information. It seems, perhaps to be similar to reading somebody else's mail, particularly if you consider the fact that the public telephone lines are not considered private hookups. Seems similar to the idea of leaving an open letter around. ALSO: If the access *is* made, and then the raider leaves without leaving a trace, has there been an access at all? If a tree falls **in** the forest and no one hears the sound does it make a sound? I'll be back to this later, Margerie, right now I think I'll just go pee."

What You Will Need:

My access to the Pentagon, and also to the Kremlin, was accomplished on an Apple 2e. Other members of my group have tried it on a Texas Instruments TI99 which also worked and with a Timex Sinclair which had too weak a signal.

Suggestion:

Use the buddy system. Since there will be little time when an attack is about to happen, have a friend of yours go for the Russians while you go for the Americans or vice versa. The Russian commands, incidentally, MUST be in Russian. Otherwise they will not work.

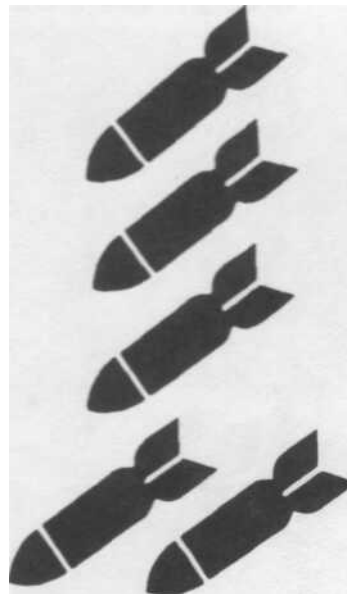

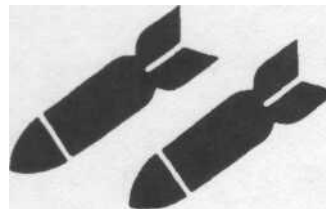

Using the FBI

Or, Making Lemonade out of Lemons

We all know there have been a series of raids on private homes carried out by the FBI. A few raiders have been arrested. Almost invariably, the computers owned by these kids have been seized by the FBI in spite of any pleadings on the part of parents.

Although this is certainly a deterrent to raiding, we estimate that the FBI has carried out these well publicized raids on fewer than a dozen individuals of the perhaps forty thousand or so we know of who are involved in the art of raiding. Not to worry.

There are certain circumstances, however, when a raid by the FBI with the subsequent seizure of the computer can really be a good thing.

Here are two examples:

a. In the event that you don't like someone:

Go to his house when he is not there, start up his computer and access it into FBI headquarters in Andover, Maryland.

A Young Breed

Bobbie Pernoski of Laguna Beach, California is the youngest person that we know of to ever raid the Pentagon's computers just outside of Washington, D.C. He did it on a summer's night just three months ago (we cannot give you the exact date), using just an old TI99, a basic program and a telephone modem hookup.

"I was just lucky, I guess," Bobbie told this reporter when we asked him about his remarkable access. "They had their guards down, it was late at night, and I just hit on the password right away."

This is a remarkable achievement, not only because it is the first time that we know of that an access has been made with a TI99 -- with just a 16k ram -- but also that it has been done by someone who is just ten years old!

Bobbie has one older brother (who is not interested in computers), and two younger sisters. His father is a mailman for Laguna Beach and hasn't the slightest idea of the fame that has come to his son.

"I can't tell him," Bobbie said. "He works for the Federal Government. If I did tell him, he would lose his job." (We hope you are not reading this, Mr. Pernoski!)

Bobbie got the TI99 for Christmas two years ago, and has been experimenting with it ever since. In his access to the Pentagon, he was able to copy the complete configurations of all the nuclear submarines in the American fleet, the missiles that were armed and that were unarmed in Wyoming, Colorado and Utah, and the current code words, in use that day, for the launching of a nuclear war.

"For a long time," Bobbie said, "I thought I might not get back out of the Pentagon. I seemed to be stuck inside there."

By the simple expedient of pulling out the electrical plug of the TI99, something which most raiders are familiar with, Bobbie was able to end the access right then and there.

"Of course I had no intention of changing anything," Bobbie told us. "After all, I'm just ten years old. What do I know?"

Bobbie hopes to be a nuclear physicist when he grows up. He already has a big Kelloggs Chemistry set which his father got for him to work on on weekends and after school.

The Shell Computer



Does this look like an IBM PC JR. Computer?

Well, it sure did to the FBI when they raided the home of Franklin Reynolds in Trenton, New Jersey the other day. But this IBM PC JR. is actually just an empty shell, carefully weighted with bricks to within a quarter pound of accuracy, and manufactured by the FAKE COMPUTER COMPANY of Denver Colorado.

For just \$150, far less than you'd pay for even a peripheral for your computer, FCC can put together a perfect fake of whatever computer you wish to order.

The fake is absolutely indistinguishable from the real computer for the simple reason that it is a real computer, or at least the shell of a real computer. FCC buys the cases, weights them up, and then ships them out to anywhere in the United States.

Now you can have a dummy computer to foil the efforts of the FBI when they come to take your machine away.

Make Your Move

Best Raiding Times

U.S. Department of Defense

The best time to try to access a Defense Department computer is after 5 p.m. and before 9 a.m. The Defense Department completely shuts down at 5 p.m. every day and everyone goes home. Thus the computers are completely available, in fact eager for your incoming telephone call all night long.

U.S. Government, All Other Offices

Try getting into the computers during lunchtime, which is between twelve or two. Also, any time after three thirty is fine because all U.S. Government employees go home at four.

Major Corporations

Large corporations leave their computers on all weekend since the electricity costs are completely tax deductible. A quiet Sunday is probably your best time for a raid, as other than a few company hackers in there playing games on the company computers, the corporate offices are completely quiet. Incidentally, you don't have to worry about the company hackers. Even if they intercept your raid, they'll never tell. They're not supposed to be there either.

What It Is Like To Be Caught

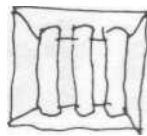

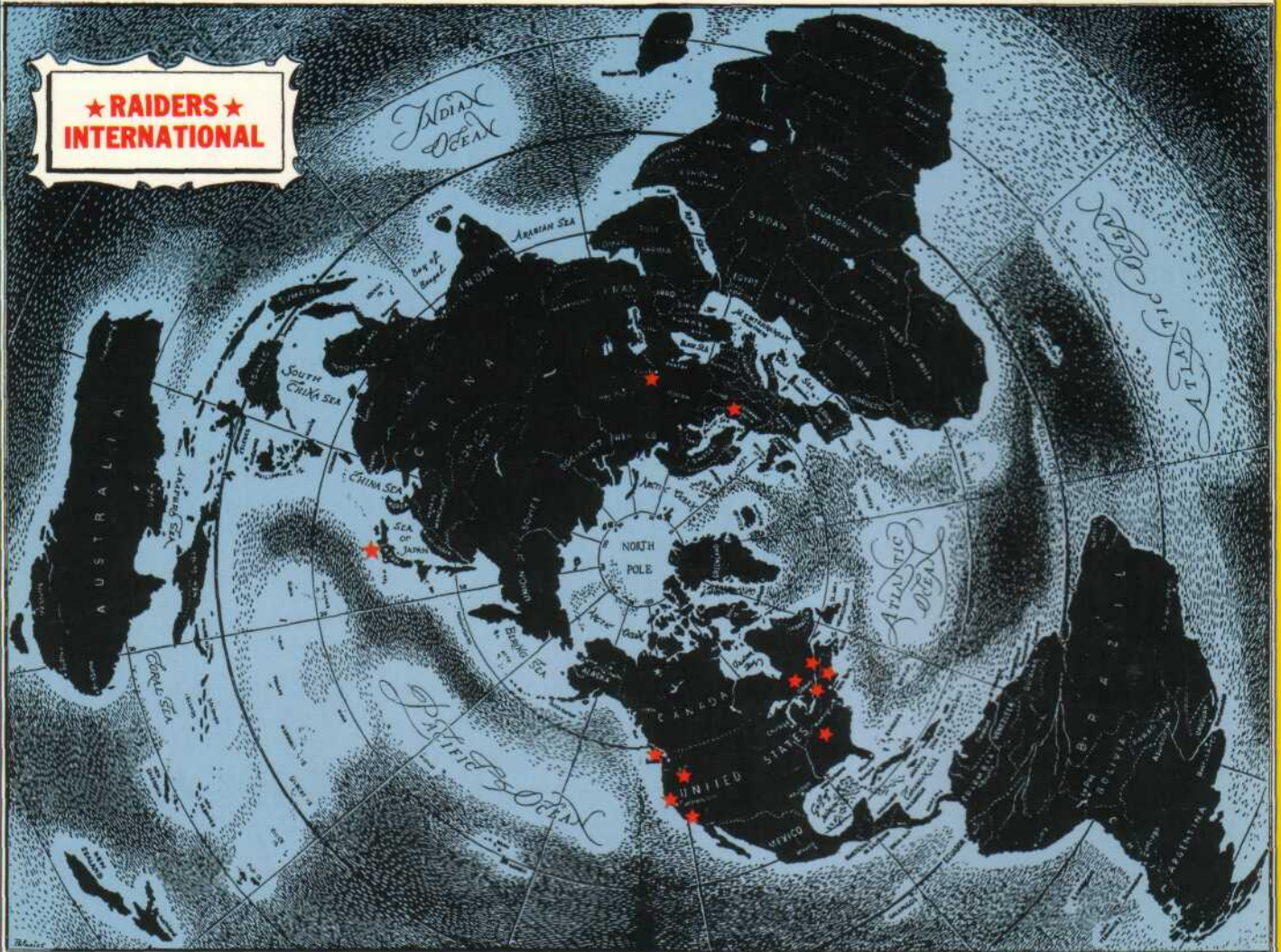
