Film Takes Closer Look At African UFO 'Sighting' By Benjamin Bell

This June, we are told, there will be space aliens in Cambridge.

The tale of these interplanetary travelers began in the fall of 1994, many time zones from the Charles River, when John E. Mack, the late Pulitzer Prize-winning Harvard psychiatrist famed for his controversial UFO writings, took a trip to southern Africa.

Mack was looking into a claim by 60 elementary school children in Harare, Zimbabwe, that an oval-shaped silver spacecraft had hovered above their playground one day.

What's more, the kids said, a strange being some 4 feet tall, dressed in a black uniform, with black eyes the size of rugby balls, approached them, while a similar being stood atop the alleged UFO.

There was talk of empathetic chit-chat, and Mack said 12 of the children gave consistent accounts of the event, leading him to believe it was not a case of mass hysteria.

"Something strange happened to the group of children that left them with the impression some form of sentient life cared about the Earth and cared about the environment and even cared about the children," said Will Buech, a board member of the John E. Mack Institute in Cambridge.

He said telepathic communication reportedly took place between the children and the being during the 5 to 10-minute encounter. Now, 15 years later, the episode is still being investigated.

On June 12, the Mack Institute will present an unfinished film called Encounter In Ruwa: The Ariel School Sighting, a compilation of interview footage shot by Mack and new footage by a New York-based filmmaker, Randall Nickerson, 42.

Mack was killed by a drunken driver in London in 2004.

"I have more research to do, but there is a lot of corroboration that tells me something did happen," Nickerson told the Herald by e-mail.

"It does make one think for sure and ask what we are, as a young species, possibly unaware of."

Naturally, there are plenty of people who doubt the incident occurred.

Among the doubters is Robert Sheaffer, 60, a 32-year veteran of the Committee for Skeptical Inquiry and author of the book UFO Sightings: The Evidence.

"The bottom line is that there is no evidence," he said of the case. "We don't know what... pressure may have been placed on the children to tell the stories the way they did."

Sheaffer said it's possible that the children, who had been left alone, decided to pull a prank. He conceived of a scenario in which the older kids in the group convinced the younger ones to go along with the 'sighting', which was taken to the next level when the authorities became involved.

Nickerson says the film, which he hopes to complete later this year, will feature interviews with some of the now-adult witnesses who are scattered around the globe.

It will be up to viewers to decide whether the truth is out there.

Footage In The Sky: The Truth Behind NASA's "UFO" Videos By Erik Sofge

A batch of raw footage from decades-old NASA missions shows zipping lights and strange objects in the sky. This footage, recently posted on YouTube, is renewing UFO conspiracy theories that the government is hiding knowledge about its interactions with intelligent life. Here, two astronauts talk about NASA's supposed coverup and what these clips really show.

The scenario goes like this: Its 1996; you're an astronaut and you're looking at a UFO. This is quite possibly the biggest, most game-changing scientific discovery in the history of mankind. And here you are, gliding through space in low Earth orbit, watching this alien craft dance around your video camera's viewfinder. You are not alone=97there are other astronauts onboard the space shuttle, and mission control is watching the live feed from Houston. Yet not a single raised voice or mention of ETs or UFOs can be heard on the audio of this recording. Apparently, it's just another routine brush with extraterrestrial life, and another day in the life of a massive, decades-long, multiagency coverup.

This is the claim behind the recent posting of a batch of NASA-related clips on YouTube, presented as evidence that extraterrestrials are among us. The footage covers a number of missions, and a range of mysterious objects=97in a clip featured on the science fiction blog io9, a bizarre object rotates within the frame, seeming to morph from one shape to another as the cameraman casually tracks it. If that weren't mysterious enough, at one point, a light drifts by. The post's headline poses the question: "Will the US Government Finally Admit There Are Aliens?"

Whether or not the government has anything to fess up about aliens, the astronaut who shot that particular piece of footage has nothing to hide. Mario Runco was a mission specialist on board STS-77, a space shuttle mission that launched in May of 1996. One of the crew's objectives was to deploy an experimental satellite, the Passive Aerodynamically Stabilized Magnetically Damped Satellite Test Unit (PAM-STU). The PAM-STU was roughly the size of a trash can, and was designed to test a new approach to satellite maneuverability, using the planet's magnetic field to perform attitude adjustments (instead of firing thrusters). The crew filmed the spinning satellite for days, but in the clip posted on YouTube by Martyn Stubb, the PAM-STU appears in grainy, low-light-enhanced black and white. Its two Stimsonite reflectors=97the same materials used on road and bicycle reflectors=97catch the ambient light, and at one point appear to merge into a single bright spot as the satellite turns head-on.

"The lights moving by in the background are either isolated lights on the ground or stars, I think likely the latter," Runco says.

[Video] Astronauts test the PAM-STU.

In another of Stubb's posted clips, a view through the window of a space shuttle shows lights drifting along in space, then reversing direction and darting away with a flash. The title of that clip: "UFOs quickly take off on NASA video." Again, the reality is less dramatic. Thomas Jones, a former shuttle mission specialist and payload commander and co-author of Planetology: Unlocking the Secrets of the Solar System, was on that mission=97STS-80, which also took place in 1996=97and provided this description of the footage. "A few ice crystals or flakes of thruster residue in the near field are floating by, get hit by a thruster exhaust plume and zip out of the scene."

[Video] Ice crystals hit by the thruster exhaust plume.

UFO proponents tend to dismiss official responses from members of NASA, the Pentagon or any other government agency, but Runco says that even if there was an active coverup, no amount of coercion could prevent an astronaut=97himself included=97from laying claim to a confirmed sighting of an alien spaceship. "If I thought it was an intelligent craft, I'd be the first one to speak up," says Runco. "I'd want the credit: Mario Runco was the first person in history to conclusively document the existence of an extraterrestrial civilization. Why would I ever want to keep it secret?"

Neither Runco nor Jones have any illusions about the likelihood of dispelling NASA-related UFO myths, particularly when Stubb and others are able to collect and repurpose an ever-growing catalog of footage. "There's no way to keep people from using public domain footage for silly purposes," Jones says. "If a shuttle beams back 10 hours of Earth views each day, there are bound to be images and scenes that are misunderstood or taken out of context." If anything, it's the lack of context that many UFO theories and proponents rely on. The clips posted by Stubb and others, whether they originate with NASA or a less credible source, tend to be framed only by a short title, with little or no attempt at reporting (Runco notes that anyone could have simply e-mailed or called him, to ask for his side of the story, instead of simply posting a 13-year-old video and jumping to extraterrestrial conclusions).

Specificity might be the currency of the conspiracy theory set, with seemingly random images or snippets of data woven into a matrix of sinister intent, but even a casual investigation of each of those facts can punch holes in the larger plotline. Bloggers continue to reference an interview with Buzz Aldrin in 2005 about seeing a UFO while on Apollo 11, while brushing off his claims that television producers blatantly quoted him out of context. And although UFO proponents have welcomed recent public statements from former astronaut Edgar Mitchell about his belief in an extraterrestrial coverup dating back to Roswell, Mitchell has never said he witnessed anything alien with his own eyes.

Lacking quality in their evidence, UFO believers are left with quantity, a rambling collection of indistinct imagery and allegations that now includes a batch of space shuttle mission video clips that were never buried or classified in the first place. Runco points out that astronauts, in general, are excited by the notion of intelligent species on other worlds. "Many of them use SETI.nul [a distributed computing application that picks through radio telescope data for incoming messages] as their screensavers, because they think it's a possibility," he says. But it's one thing to believe that alien life is a statistical likelihood, and another to interpret lights in the sky as intergalactic contact. "People see unexplained things," Jones says. "I used to believe UFOs were spaceships=97when I was 14"

A strange object was spotted Friday night by pilots of a plane that just had just taken off from Bush Intercontinental Airport. And now, federal investigators are trying to pinpoint what the flying object was.

MS. RIDEOUT: when I wrote those letters, I was living in Newport News. They derived from a series of such letters of inquiry directed at local law-enforcement/civil defense officials. In general, the response was negative; and in one or two cases, the targeted sheriff chose to sic the FBI on me for having dared question authority in this manner; an FBI agent from the Norfolk Field Office came to my place of employment (Fort Eustis) to interview me about that letter-writing campaign.

I have lost all memory of the particular case you've cited here. Those copies in the city manager's file should be retained permanently, though - because they contribute materially to the history of what I now refer to as exosociology. Or, if you prefer, the Ohio State University library's large collection of UFO-ana might be a useful home for them.

N.B.: back in the mid-sixties, the FBI looked, superficially, into the possible abduction case of a Chesapeake TV repair shop owner - who'd contacted the FBI re his early-morning encounter with UFOnauts, complete with a period of missing time.

I have a copy of the short FBI report in my stack of UFO-related FBI records released in the seventies via the FOIA. That stack includes a copy of the Norfolk agent's report of my being interviewed by him.

Anyway, thank you so much for helping me justify my existence to the 'authorities'. I suppose I'll wonder, for the rest of my life, how you were able to track me down.

NASA's Shuttle Program Hands Over Launch Pad To Constellation

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. -- The May 31 transfer of Launch Pad 39B at NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida from the Space Shuttle Program to the Constellation Program is the next step in preparing the first flight test of the agency's next-generation spacecraft and launch system. The Constellation Program is developing new spacecraft - including the Ares I and Ares V launch vehicles, the Orion crew capsule, and the Altair lunar lander - to carry humans to the International Space Station, the moon and beyond.

Since the late 1960s, pad B has been instrumental in human spaceflight programs, such as Apollo, Skylab and the space shuttle. The pad originally was built for the Saturn V rockets to launch the Apollo capsules to the moon. In July 1975, the pad was modified to support space shuttle operations. The first space shuttle to lift off from pad B was Challenger in January 1986.

The handover took place Sunday after space shuttle Endeavour was moved to Launch Pad 39A. The ground operations team will finish modifying pad B for the Ares I-X rocket launch. Modifications will include removing the orbiter access arm and a section of the gaseous oxygen vent arm and installing access platforms and a vehicle stabilization system.

Thanks, nice one! Like you my first instinct was "Iridium". My
second instinct was to reread what Plait wrote and say "Hmm,
maybe, but not likely. Iridium flares can indeed be mag -8 but are typically in the order 10 sec - almost always >5 sec - with
quite slow rise and decay times, not "like a flash bulb", "less than 1 sec", "too fast [brief] for a meteor". Sure enough we
then read that Phil checked the flare predictions, and didn't
find one, so I was sceptical about his conclusion that it must
have been an "unscheduled" flare from Iridium 22 or 03, because
prediction programmes are pretty reliable, very sensitive to exact observer location but presumably Phil Plait knew his
location. Why would a flare be "unscheduled"?
So I looked at

where we find out that not all flares can be reliably forecast because some satellites are inoperable and tumbling, so the reflection angle is changing unpredictably. It seems to me that in such a case the reflection aspect is likely to be maintained much more briefly, too, so that sudden and isolated "flash bulb" effect might be explained by a tumbling satellite.

But neither Iridium 22 nor 03 is listed as inoperable or "tumbling" above, and the only one in Orbital Plane 2 (the plane occupied by 22 & 03) listed as tumbling is 71, which I suppose we we can infer doesn't fit the time of Phil's observation? That list could well be out of date, though. Do Iridiums start tumbling due to attitude control failure? Can this be checked anywhere?

Whilst checking this I found the following observation of Iridium 22 in 2001 mentioning flashes that are not related to tumbling

"6 October, Iridium 22 was right on time at 19:55. The Flare program predicting a -8.2 magnitude. I am not an expert at the magnitude approximations, but it was a "freight train in the sky"! It continued south and I followed it with binoculars off and on. At 20:03 a bright flare caught my eye almost on the same path as Iridium 22, flaring in about the same star group at what I would guess was at least a -6 magnitude. The flare was short however. I followed it south with binoculars also, and at 20:05 I noticed a second object slightly east of this one also going south but very slightly slower. The first one caught up with the second one when they were at about 45 degrees in elevation, and both were in the same field of view. I was wondering if anyone could ID these other two objects?"

The two objects are up for grabs, but the short -6 flare on the Iridium track was identified by other observers as having been a secondary flare from the Iridium 22's solar panels. Apparently these often occur close to the main comms panel flare, sometimes overlapping, and are characteristically more sudden but not so bright. This doesn't seem to explain Phil's sighting, though, as he says that it occurred in isolation and "no satellite could be seen".

The FBI, the Federal Aviation Administration and the Liberty County Sheriff=92s Department met Tuesday to compare notes on an unidentified flying object reported late last week by an ExpressJet Airlines pilot.

The pilot reported a "missile or rocket" flying near his airplane Friday at 8:09 p.m., shortly after takeoff from Bush Intercontinental Airport, according to sheriff=92s officials.

"The FAA then contacted the Liberty County department dispatcher and reported their pilot reported an object flying straight at his aircraft and passed 100 feet under it," said Ken DeFoor, chief deputy for the Liberty County Sheriff=92s Department.

FBI spokeswoman Shauna Dunlap said the agency was aware of the sighting.

"While we have no information to indicate there was a criminal act we certainly do not rule anything out and certainly would not want to speculate on what it may or may not have been," she said.

The flight was over the southern edge of Liberty County flying at 13,000 feet when the incident occurred, officials said. ExpressJet flies regional routes for Continental Airlines as Continental Express.

"We haven=92t found anything yet =97 either something on the ground where it launched or on the ground where it came down," said Liberty County Sheriff=92s Cpl. Hugh Bishop.

DeFoor said the agencies consolidated their notes and information at the meeting.

"The FAA is in the process of debriefing the pilot today (Tuesday)," he said. "We are going to try and come up with a more definite track of this object and its path. We are trying to find out where it came from, where it went, and who may be responsible for it."

The Continental Express jet was on a commercial flight to Greenville, S.C.

"No people were injured and no evasive action on part of the airplane was taken," DeFoor said.

DeFoor said he was aware of local hobbyists who fire rockets but

did not know if any were in the area at the time.

"Were checking with club owners and presidents," he said. "If we can get a correct track of what this object was there is no need to check with hobby fields."

DeFoor said if the object was a rocket, it was fired illegally.

"They have to have permits to use the airspace," he said.

In May 2008, a Continental Airlines pilot reported a similar incident.

"It was the same situation, almost identical," DeFoor said. "The FBI are pulling their records on that one. It was roughly in the same area almost a year ago."

The Boeing 737, en route to Cleveland, Ohio, with 148 passengers, was not damaged.

"We looked into that, along with the FAA and some local law enforcement," Dunlap said. "To my knowledge, it was never determined what may of been observed during that incident."

The FAA referred all questions about Friday=92s incident to the Liberty County Sheriffs Department.

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

As I informed previously, as of May 04th, the Brazilian Government has diclosed over 600 new pages of previously classified documents, covering UFO reports and military investigations from 1970 to 1979, including photos and films, for the first time.

The Bush regime's successor doesn't look nearly so needy (for the time being, at least) in this sort of regard, and my hunch is that this will be causing considerable nervousness in the News Corporation boardroom. It feels as though they have turned their attention to helping their friends in the intelligence community (friends who can be very influential when the visible government becomes less friendly) in any way they can. This story looks to be part of just such an effort. Old news repackaged to achieve an effect.

Scraping the barrel? Yes, of course they are, but that's exactly what they have to do in the absence of richer pickings.

These things are never accidental, and never unco-ordinated. Read this

Gateway Officials File Complaint Over Parachute Landing by Art Thomason

Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport officials filed a complaint with the Federal Aviation Administration on Friday charging that a data-research parachute that descended on airport property Thursday posed a potential danger to aircraft.

While humor punctuated much of the public reaction to media accounts of the incident, airport officials are taking it seriously and want their concerns heard by federal authorities, airport spokesman Brian Sexton said.

"It's a safety concern when something enters our airspace unannounced, in this case a 6-pound box suspended from a parachute," he said. "We want to share with the FAA for their consideration our concerns about how this is being managed.

UFO Sightings Raise Familiar Question: Are We Alone? By Jim Bishop

"If, in fact, we are able to find life or to answer the question 'Are we alone?' then that certainly is grand enough and noble enough to be the enduring legacy of our civilization."

The skies over Texas have been busy with spottings of unidentified flying objects in recent times, and I can't help but wonder if some of them might actually be visitors from a galaxy far, far away.

I'm sure that thought has crossed your mind, too, whether you want to admit it out loud or not. Just the chance that we are not alone is enough to pique anyone's interest.

Just days ago, a Continental Express pilot took off from Houston en route to South Carolina and had a weird experience not long after lifting off.

Reaching an altitude of 11,000 feet, still over Texas, the pilot suddenly radioed that a large object was flying 150 feet or so beneath him. The report I read on the Web site of MUFON (Mutual UFO Network) didn't say what shape this thing was, but the pilot was shocked to see that it didn't show up on radar.

MUFON records indicate that another Continental Airlines pilot spotted a UFO in May of last year, very near the same area.

You don't need a map to discern that this puts these objects pretty close to our area.

On the same night that the Continental pilot was gazing wideeyed at whatever it was, another man spotted a UFO in the skies over East Texas, MUFON says. This, according to the spotter, was a triangular-shaped craft.

And, yet another spotter saw three star-like objects over East Texas, traveling fast, then slow, then fast, on that same night.

In view of the spate of UFOs seen flying over the Stephenville, Texas, area last year, and other, less noted sightings since then, maybe we should be spending more time looking up.

MUFON's records show that the U.S. is by far the leader in sightings of UFOs, and Texas is always first or second among the states in the number of these.

Remember that guy in the old 1950s version of "The Thing?" At the end of the movie, he tells the whole world on the radio, "Watch the skies! Keep watching the skies"!

That could turn out to be sound advice.

Aviation technician Alfonso Salazar reports that on Saturday, June 2009 at 16:10 hours, the crew of a Fokker 110 (Click de Mexicana) reported "spherical traffic" which, according to eyewitnesses was a shining sphere resembling burnished platinum and reflecting the sun's rays."

The Fokker 100 was flying at an approximate altitude of 10,000 meters on the Juliet 21 air corridor. The unknown object, measuring some 10 meters in diameter), crossed the airliner's path and was seen at it's 8 o'clock position (lower left).

This sighting was recorded over the southern area of Cerro de la Estrella (to the east of Mexico City). Weather conditions were clear, sunny and cloudless. The crew calculated that the UFO was at an altitude of 8000 meters.

For some time now, encounters between these flying objects and airliners have increased, as they arrive or take off from the Mexican capital's airport.

Military Hush-Up: Incoming Space Rocks Now Classified By Leonard David

For 15 years, scientists have benefited from data gleaned by U.S. classified satellites of natural fireball events in Earth's atmosphere =96 but no longer.

A recent U.S. military policy decision now explicitly states that observations by hush-hush government spacecraft of incoming bolides and fireballs are classified secret and are not to be released, SPACE.com has learned.

The satellites' main objectives include detecting nuclear bomb tests, and their characterizations of asteroids and lesser meteoroids as they crash through the atmosphere has been a byproduct data bonanza for scientists.

The upshot: Space rocks that explode in the atmosphere are now classified.

"It's baffling to us why this would suddenly change," said one scientist familiar with the work. "It's unfortunate because there was this great synergy... a very good cooperative arrangement. Systems were put into dual-use mode where a lot of science was getting done that couldn't be done any other way. It's a regrettable change in policy."

Scientists say not only will research into the threat from space be hampered, but public understanding of sometimes dramatic sky explosions will be diminished, perhaps leading to hype and fear of the unknown.

Incoming!

Most 'shooting stars' are caused by natural space debris no larger than peas. But routinely, rocks as big as basketballs and even small cars crash into the atmosphere. Most vaporize or explode on the way in, but some reach the surface or explode above the surface. Understandably, scientists want to know about these events so they can better predict the risk here on Earth.

Yet because the world is two-thirds ocean, most incoming objects aren't visible to observers on the ground. Many other incoming space rocks go unnoticed because daylight drowns them out.

Over the last decade or so, hundreds of these events have been spotted by the classified satellites. Priceless observational information derived from the spacecraft were made quickly available, giving researchers such insights as time, a location, height above the surface, as well as light-curves to help pin down the amount of energy churned out from the fireballs.

And in the shaky world we now live, it's nice to know that a sky-high detonation is natural versus a nuclear weapon blast.

Where the space-based surveillance truly shines is over remote stretches of ocean =96 far away from the prospect of ground-based data collection.

But all that ended within the last few months, leaving scientists blind-sided and miffed by the shift in policy. The hope is that the policy decision will be revisited and overturned.

Critical importance

"The fireball data from military or surveillance assets have been of critical importance for assessing the impact hazard," said David Morrison, a Near Earth Object (NEO) scientist at NASA's Ames Research Center. He noted that his views are his own, not as a NASA spokesperson.

The size of the average largest atmospheric impact from small asteroids is a key piece of experimental data to anchor the low-energy end of the power-law distribution of impactors, from asteroids greater than 6 miles (10 kilometers) in diameter down to the meter scale, Morrison told SPACE.com.

"These fireball data together with astronomical observations of larger near-Earth asteroids define the nature of the impact hazard and allow rational planning to deal with this issue," Morrison said.

Morrison said that fireball data are today playing additional important roles.

As example, the fireball data together with infrasound allowed scientists to verify the approximate size and energy of the unique Carancas impact in the Altiplano -- on the Peru-Bolivia border -- on Sept. 15, 2007.

Fireball information also played an important part in the story of the small asteroid 2008 TC3, Morrison said. That was the first-ever case of the astronomical detection of a small asteroid before it hit last year. The fireball data were key for locating the impact point and the subsequent recovery of fragments from this impact.

Link in public understanding

Astronomers are closing in on a years-long effort to find most of the potentially devastating large asteroids in our neck of the cosmic woods, those that could cause widespread regional or global devastation. Now they plan to look for the smaller stuff.

So it is ironic that the availability of these fireball data should be curtailed just at the time the NEO program is moving toward surveying the small impactors that are most likely to be picked up in the fireball monitoring program, Morrision said.

"These data have been available to the scientific community for the past decade," he said. "It is unfortunate this information is shut off just when it is becoming more valuable to the community interested in characterizing near Earth asteroids and protecting our planet from asteroid impacts."

The newly issued policy edict by the U.S. military of reporting fireball observations from satellites also caught the attention of Clark Chapman, a planetary scientist and asteroid impact expert at Southwest Research Institute in Boulder, Colorado.

"I think that this information is very important to make public," Chapman told SPACE.com.

"More important than the scientific value, I think, is that these rare, bright fireballs provide a link in public understanding to the asteroid impact hazard posed by still larger and less frequent asteroids," Chapman explained.

Those objects are witnessed by unsuspecting people in far-flung

places, Chapman said, often generating incorrect and exaggerated reports.

"The grounding achieved by associating these reports by untrained observers with the satellite measurements is very useful for calibrating the observer reports and closing the loop with folks who think they have seen something mysterious and extraordinary," Chapman said.

Uruguay: Air Force Declassified Files, ET Hypothesis Not Dismissed

40 UFO cases remained unexplained in Uruguay

The UFO phenomenon has manifested itself many times in Uruguay. Thirty years after research began, 40 cases remain unexplained. The files were declassified and EL PAIS was allowed access to them

The Uruguayan Air Force will not publish a "Blue Book" containing the results of its 30 years of research, but the high command allowed EL PAIS access to records and eyewitness accounts.

While the Air Force commission that studies these cases has been operating for only a few decades, the UFO phenomenon began in Uruguay in 1947, at the same time that worldwide enthusiasm for the subject commenced. While Uruguay is no Roswell, the emblematic location for the subject of ETs, it is a place that is catalogued as propitious for seeing unidentified flying objects, according to Col. Ariel Sanchez, an Air Force officer with 33 years of active service and who has formed part of the UFO commission since 1989. He currently presides over it.

The agency operates out of a small office located in downtown Montevideo and has a computer database and print archives as well, which have not yet been computerized. There are hundreds of files in green binders under the heading "Confidential", containing eyewitness accounts, photographs, sketches, drawings, documents and evaluations made by officials.

Unsolved cases. The files consist of reports that accrue at a rate of 100 cases per year. The commission has received approximately 2100 solid reports and has researched and dismissed many for various reasons. But there are still 40 cases lacking an explanation. These files have been kept open, and range from sightings and landings of alleged craft to so-called abductions, that is to say, report on the kidnapping of persons by extraterrestrial entities.

The international definition conceived by U.S. astrophysicist Allen Hynek divides these situations into three categories: encounters of the first kind are those involving a sighting;

those of the second kind are those that record a landing, and the third kind - the sort most exploited by filmmakers - make reference to an encounter with an unidentified flying object and its occupants.

The military commission's task is to compile a record of cases and draft guidelines or conclusions regarding their veracity and origin. They have obtained solid results: "The commission managed to determine modifications to the chemical composition of the soil where landings are reported. The phenomenon exists. It could be a phenomenon that occurs in the lower sectors of the atmosphere, the landing of aircraft from a foreign air force, up to the extraterrestrial hypothesis. It could a monitoring probe from outer space, much in the same way that we send probes to explore distant worlds", stated the officer. "The UFO phenomenon exists in the country. I must stress that the Air Force does not dismiss an extraterrestrial hypothesis based on our scientific analysis", said Sanchez.

The commission still keeps several paper files, above all those involving open cases. The FAU (Uruguayan Air Force) has now declassified all of its information, even those labeled "confidential". Only the identity of the witnesses remains undisclosed. All manner of situations can be found while perusing the file. In a case that occurred some time ago in the Department of Durazno, the witness reported the appearance of places where an aircraft appeared to have landed. Upon analyzing the soil's composition, an increase in the values of minerals such as chrome, manganese, phosphorus and carbon was detected, enabling researchers to conclude that the event had indeed been real.

Another singular case is found in these military annals: the appearance of two reddish spheres, flying silently over the heads of two teamsters driving cattle. The objects moved at high speed in opposite directions and the vanished toward the West at high speed.

Records indicate that the months prone to most manifestations of these objects are February, March, July and October. In February of this year (2009), the commission received numerous reports accompanied by digital photographs. Photographs or film are not a determining factor in any case, but rather a contribution, explains Sanchez, given the current technical possibilities for hoaxing images.

Unsolved cases have a considerable high strangeness quotient for the FAU. For example, the 1986 pursuit by two Pucara jet fighters over the Palmar Dam in response to the maneuvers of a luminous sphere. The pilots joined together and decided to chase it. When they were about to intercept it, the sphere flew off at a dizzying rate of speed toward Argentina and could not be reached. When the pilots returned to their base, the sphere reappeared over the dam. But the same thing occurred - the chase occurred and it vanished from sight, changing colors from red to yellow.

A similar case occurred to a group of military pilots in 1996, that is to say, qualified observers engaged in exercises over the Santa Bernardina base in Durazno. As in 1986, they saw two luminous spheres, whose presence was corroborated by the airport's control tower. When the objects flew away, they maintained their shape and luminosity, which enabled the spherical shape to be confirmed. Minutes later, the pilots noticed their glow diminished, and only their outline was illuminated. "The weren't satellites, as they do not fly in formation or that low, since these objects were at 10,000 feet (3,000 meters, approximately), nor do satellites diminish their glow", says Sanchez.

Among other reports we find the one by the crew of a commercial airline - a domestic carrier - that was pursued by a powerful light in 1979 as it returned from Paraguay. The light was even photographed by passengers. This case is also unexplained.

The Air Force also has visual reports of a dozen mutilated animals whose carcasses betrayed incisions made with surgical precision. These reports go back to 2002. No coherent explanation was ever found, but research by the military commission suggests the hypothesis that it was a possible biochemical attach that probably occurred in Argentina, where

700 mutilated animals were found. "It could have been the result of winds blowing from the West", said the officer. FAU does not dismiss the possibility of an extraterrestrial event. This is another unsolved case.

Military statistics show that the customary profile of people reporting sightings involve young men up to 45 years of age. They also indicate that cases occur in the early hours of the evening, and usually involve a single witness. 49% of statistics are made up of reports of luminous spheres; barely 2% include occupant sightings.

Nor has Uruguay been immune to close encounters of the third kind. The most chilling aspect of any UFO case is usually a report involving the abduction of humans for research purposes.

There have been several cases in Uruguay that remain unexplained. One of them occurred in Playa Pascual in 1980 and involved a camper, who was on the shore at night and was suddenly taken by surprise by short beings who immobilized him and conveyed him to a vehicle, where he was subjected to a medical examination. He later woke up in his tent and had a hard time moving. Another "missing time" case involved a family that was driving along the road when an aircraft flew over their vehicle and landed in front of them. They were unable to account for what had occurred to them for several minutes.

Uruguay. Now it's the Uruguayan government that's releasing UFO files.

It's getting harder to keep track of the countries that have made similar moves over the last 10 years. From France to Canada, England to Denmark, Brazil to Ireland, the global community is doing what the United States simply will not: Acknowledge reality.

As with most of its unofficial partners in disclosure, none of the documents released by Uruguay's air force, the FAU, were classified at the highest levels. The most restricted were once categorized as "Confidential." Maybe that's because there aren't any super cases in the South American nation's files. But the ones released by the FAU this week further erode the credibility of our own Air Force.

The signal-to-noise ratio - only 40 of the roughly 2,100 reports in the FAU's database remain unexplained - doesn't really matter. The officer charged with supervision and release, Col. Ariel Sanchez, had enough information to draw this conclusion: "The UFO phenomenon exists in the country. I must stress that the Air Force does not dismiss an extraterrestrial hypothesis based on our scientific analysis."

That analysis extended to trace effects like chemical alterations in soil samples from reported UFO touchdowns, as well as a dozen cattle mutilated with surgical precision. But the really commendable portion of the FAU report is its confession that military technology is useless against preventing the unauthorized exploitation of sovereign air space.

Most notable are two air force encounters with "luminous spheres" in 1986 and 1996. The former involved hot pursuit by jet fighters over Palmar Dam. The intruders high-tailed it "at a dizzying rate of speed" towards Argentina. But no sooner had the Pucara jets returned to base than the UFOs reappeared, as if determined to make a point and rub it in.

The same thing happened 10 years later, during military exercises at a FAU base in Durazno; interceptors couldn't corral the formation-flying intruders, and control tower operaters corroborated the incident. A UFO turned the tables in 1979 and pursued a jetliner en route from Paraguay. It drew so close that passengers were able to snap photos.

Compare this sort of candor to our own reality-challenged USAF.

Despite eyewitness testimony and FAA radar evidence to the contrary $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) +\left(1\right)$

(http://www.mufon.com/documents/MUFONStephenvilleRadarReport.pdf
), it refuses to confirm that F-16s pursued a massive UFO that flew near President Bush's Texas ranch in 2008. Our military clings sideways to the fiction that it hasn't collected UFO reports in 40 years, despite regulations requiring its pilots to do just that.

Not that there's anything wrong with Uruguay - no doubt a lot of fine folks live down there. But when you're forced to look to the Third World for transparency on issues clearly related to national security, there's more than the economy that's bankrupt.

World to End In 2012: A Hoax Gone Too Far? By Robert Roy Britt, Editorial Director

*** Spoiler alert. This article contains information that will ruin a good hoax. ***

There's no shortage of end-of-the-world prophecies and hoaxes, but the latest one has a slick twist. Or, some might say, a sick twist.

In fact, just by writing about it, I'm playing into the hands of a big media company that hopes I will write about it, or at least pass the word and a link, so that they can ultimately make money. Rather, I'll try to keep a few people from being frightened.

The story starts with Mike Brown, an astronomer at Caltech who has found more planet-like objects in our outer solar system than anyone.

Just like this reporter, Brown gets a lot emails from people worried the world will end in 2012. So many, in fact, that Brown has come to call them "The 2012 People." He's long assumed they're rather gullible worry warts. His view just changed a little

The concerns often stem from bogus information about a fantasy planet dubbed Nibiru which, the story goes, will swing into the inner solar system, smack Earth in 2012, and bring an end to it all. (Brown assures us there is no such planet, and no such looming scenario known to science.)

The emails have been increasing of late. And recently one concerned citizen went a step farther and called and left Brown a voice mail: "I've got kids; this really scares the hell out of me. Is there something I should be doing? Is this real?"

The planet hunter reassured the man that it was all just a hoax. The man was grateful.

But the man got Brown's attention.

"This guy was inherently skeptical about the 2012 claims, and was happy when someone with a ring of authority told him there was nothing to it, but, still something had made him worried enough that he had tracked down some astronomer he had never met

and called him to reassure him about the safety of his family," Brown wrote in his blog this week.

Then Brown found some spam among his email, an ominous missive that purports to be from the director of the Institute for Human Continuity. It warns: "The IHC has uncovered evidence indicating that the disasters of 2012 are both real and unavoidable. We believe with 94% certainty that ... cataclysmic events will devastate our planet and many who inhabit it. December 21, 2012 cannot be ignored."

A link in the email to the IHC's supposed web site actually takes you to a site that is so cleverly designed, an unsuspecting person who doesn't recognize the actors on the page might think the IHC is real, that the end is near, and that buying a ticket (to somewhere, on something, who knows?) is the only hope of survival.

Truth is the web site (it's here, it's fake, you've been warned) is designed by Sony Pictures. Okay, score 1 point for Sony, no harm done, right?

Well, not so fast.

Brown, who is a pretty smart guy, admits that unlike many doomsday websites designed by quacks, it took him a while to figure out this web site is a fake.

"It is slick. It is professional. There is no obvious sign anywhere that this is the work of kooks," he said.

We all hate spam. And sometimes we think its deceptiveness is distasteful, especially when little old ladies are bilked of billions by a faux Nigerian banker. And hoaxes sometimes go too far. Some pranksters in New Jersey who lofted flares on balloons in the night sky in January, as a social experiment, were fined \$250 by a court that determined their UFO hoax "posed a potential fire hazard and could have interfered with air traffic." It didn't, but their deceptiveness, and the harm it could have caused, was enough for the judge.

Brown wonders if this one goes too far, scaring people who may never learn the truth that would alleviate their fears.

"If the spam email had tried to scare me about the end of the world and then directed me to a web site which turned out to simply advertise the movie, that would have been distasteful," Brown writes. "But what is the right word for a spam email that tries to scare me to go to a web site which then tries to scare me even more and doesn't even admit to being simply an ad for a movie?"

That's for you to answer. I've combined some of Brown's choice words with a few of my own in this poll:

Two Simple Facts Prove Roswell UFO Is Real

It is time once again for the annual Roswell UFO Festival, July 2-5. This is, in my opinion, the top UFO-related event in the world, because the Roswell incident of 1947 has proven to be definitive in validating the UFO phenomenon.

Skeptics refuse to accept this, and even believers don't seem to realize just what it is about the Roswell story that proves UFOs are real. The debate just goes on and on, on radio talk shows mostly, although the solution has been right out in the open since the public was first informed, back on July 8, 1947. The continuing performances of dedicated skeptics deriding UFOs is a monstrous fraud upon the public, which the public has been witless enough to let pass, because it has had little incentive and therefore little abiding interest in focusing upon the certain but supremely awkward truth.

The facts that prove the reality of the UFO crash near Roswell are these (and they are deceptively simple, so listen closely):

1) The military itself reported the crash to the world media as genuine, and 2) The day after the initial public release of the story, higher military authority changed that story, claiming that the wreckage recovered was in fact a weather balloon array, mistaken for alien material by the Roswell air field personnel.

Why do these facts prove the UFO? Because both the intelligence officer and commanding officer of the Roswell military post examined the wreckage and confirmed its alien nature. (I won't dwell on the details here. You can best get them on roswellufomuseum.com and other sites dedicated to the event.) These officers, with the added concurrence of the post's information officer, put out to the world the original story that they had retrieved a bonafide UFO of non-man-made materials.

These were the top officers of a wartime bomber group, one of the most serious occupations in the world. (If you haven't been in the military and don't know just how serious it was and is, in and out of war, check out the movie "Twelve O'Clock High", made in 1949 about a wartime bomber group.) They would not begin to think of fooling around with such a story, they would have to have been insane to risk both their own and, even worse, the military's reputations. They were entirely professional and competent. They would not have identified the craft as alien without overwhelming evidence. They were sincere in their identification and honest and quick in sending out the story to

the world. These career military officers were never impugned in their character, honesty or on-going competence in their duties.

Military higher-ups did, however, impugn their basic competence to recognize military hardware, when they issued pictures of the intelligence officer, Jesse Marcel, with supposed crash material, in which that material was obviously flimsy tin foil attached to thin wooden sticks - a childish fake, perpetrated upon an all-too-trusting public more than ready to laugh rather than look closely, in the years following a long and desperate war. The Roswell officers went along with this deception, under orders, but the issuing of this obviously flimsy story in fact proved the reality of the UFO, because it is simply inconceivable that a competent army intelligence officer, of a wartime bomber group (post-World War II, in 1947, but into the Cold War by then), would not see what any teenage model builder could see was faked "crash" material.

No, the Roswell officers knew what they had recovered was real. They reported it so, to the world. The quick effort to portray their identification as premature and in fact embarrassingly wrong, should have shown any competent investigator that their superiors were engaging in a cover-up of the truth. It was such a paper-thin cover-up (literally, given the flimsy "wreckage" brought out) that it counts rather as confirming evidence of the reality of the UFO. Yet the public has let the cover-up slide over them ever since, even after Jesse Marcel finally came forward, in 1978, with the truth as he knew it, better than anyone.

You need to know that many old, ongoing debates really should have been settled long ago, but the solutions have been suppressed through misdirection, and vainglorious impugning of the clear facts, by higher authorities - in both government and in science - unwilling to face self-correction, and by a public content with easy dogmas (both ancient and modern) and unwilling to face new truths. This is the defining crisis of our time. See theendofthemystery for information about the discovery that overturns much that science pretends to know about our world and its origin.

Yesterday I wrote about how Caltech planet-hunter Mike Brown was disturbed by a variation of the "World Will End in 2012" hoax perpetrated by a big media company's movie promotion that leaves some people genuinely worried.

This hoax has been floating around in various forms for years now, but it's reached critical mass lately (and one can only hope that means an apex, too).

Now NASA astrobiologist and asteroid expert David Morrison weighs in. That's good, because Dave is really smart, knows a lot about science, has been around long enough to see plenty of these doomsday predictions come and go (like the May 5, 2000 planet alignment that was supposed to wipe us out, since Y2K didn't), and is not afraid to speak frankly about it all.

It'd be nice if there was not really much to say here. But the fact is, from self-described (and underperforming) psychics to religiously oriented doomsday prophets (like the one who predicted there would be riots by Christmas 2008 due to President Obama's election) and out-and-out profiteers who prey on the basic human desire to believe, there is plenty of debunking that needs to be done.

Morrison has posted 20 questions, with answers, surrounding all this. In the first one, reproduced here, he sums up how silly this all is (see the key phrase in bold):

Question No. 1: What is the origin of the prediction that the world will end in December 2012?

Morrison: "The story started with claims that Nibiru, a supposed planet discovered by the Sumerians, is headed toward Earth. Zecharia Sitchin, who writes fiction about the ancient Mesopotamian civilization of Sumer, claimed in several books (e.g., The Twelfth Planet, published in 1976) that he has found and translated Sumerian documents that identify the planet Nibiru, orbiting the Sun every 3600 years. These Sumerian fables include stories of 'ancient astronauts' visiting Earth from a civilization of aliens called the Anunnaki. Then Nancy Lieder, a self-declared psychic who claims she is channeling aliens, wrote on her website Zetatalk that the inhabitants of a fictional planet around the star Zeta Reticuli warned her that the Earth

was in danger from Planet X or Nibiru. This catastrophe was initially predicted for May 2003, but when nothing happened the doomsday date was moved forward to December 2012. Only recently have these two fables been linked to the end of the Mayan long-count at the winter solstice in 2012 =97 hence the predicted doomsday date of December 21, 2012."

1. What is the origin of the prediction that the world will end in December 2012?

The story started with claims that Nibiru, a supposed planet discovered by the Sumerians, is headed toward Earth. Zecharia Sitchin, who writes fiction about the ancient Mesopotamian civilization of Sumer, claimed in several books (e.g., The Twelfth Planet, published in 1976) that he has found and translated Sumerian documents that identify the planet Nibiru, orbiting the Sun every 3600 years. These Sumerian fables include stories of "ancient astronauts" visiting Earth from a civilization of aliens called the Anunnaki. 2. The Sumerians were the first great civilization, and they made many accurate astronomical predictions, including the existence of the planets Uranus, Neptune and Pluto. So why should we not believe their predictions about Nibiru?

Nibiru is a name in Babylonian astrology sometimes associated with the god Marduk. Nibiru appears as a minor character in the Babylonian creation poem Enuma Elish as recorded in the library of Assurbanipal, King of Assyria (668-627 BCE). Sumer flourished much earlier, from about the 23rd century to the 17th century BCE. The claims that Nibiru is a planet and was known to the Sumerians are contradicted by scholars who (unlike Zecharia Sitchin) study and translate the written records of ancient Mesopotamia. Sumer was indeed a great civilization, important for the development of agriculture, water management, urban life, and especially writing. However, they left very few records dealing with astronomy. Certainly they did not know about the existence of Uranus, Neptune or Pluto. They also had no understanding that the planets orbited the Sun, an idea that first developed in ancient Greece two millennia after the end of Sumer. Claims that Sumerians had a sophisticated astronomy, or that they even had a god named Nibiru, are the product of Sitchin's imagination.

3. How can you deny the existence of Nibiru when NASA discovered it in 1983 and the story appeared in leading newspapers? At that time you called it Planet X, and later it was named Xena or Fris

IRAS (the NASA Infrared Astronomy Satellite, which carried out a sky survey for 10 months in 1983) discovered many infrared sources, but none of them was Nibiru or Planet X or any other objects in the outer solar system. There is a good discussion from Caltech to be found at:

Briefly, IRAS cataloged 350,000 infrared sources, and initially many of these sources were unidentified (which was the point, of course, of making such a survey). All of these observations have been followed up by subsequent studies with more powerful instruments both on the ground and in space. The rumor about a "tenth planet" erupted in 1984 after a scientific paper was published in Astrophysical Journal Letters titled "Unidentified point sources in the IRAS minisurvey", which discussed several infrared sources with "no counterparts". But these "mystery objects" were subsequently found to be distant galaxies (except one, which was a wisp of "infrared cirrus"), as published in 1987. No IRAS source has ever turned out to be a planet. A good discussion of this whole issue is to be found on Phil Plait's website:

The bottom line is that Nibiru is a myth, with no basis in fact. To an astronomer, persistent claims about a planet that is "nearby" but "invisible" are just plain silly.

4. Maybe we should be asking about Planet X or Eris, not Nibiru. Why does NASA keep secret the orbit of Eris?

"Planet X" is an oxymoron when applied to a real object. The term has been used by astronomers over the past century for a possible or suspected object. Once the object is found, it is given a real name, as was done with Pluto and Eris, both of which were at some time referred to as Planet X. If a new object turns out to be not real, or not a planet, then you won't hear about it again. If it is real, it is not called Planet X.

Eris is one of several dwarf planets recently found by astronomers in the outer solar system, all of them on normal orbits that will never bring them near Earth. Like Pluto, Eris is smaller than our Moon. It is very far away, and its orbit never brings it closer than about 4 billion miles. There is no secret about Eris and its orbit, as you can easily verify by googling it or looking it up in Wikipedia.

5. Do you deny that NASA built a South Pole Telescope (SPT) to track Nibiru? Why else would they build a telescope at the South Pole?

There is a telescope at the South Pole, but it was not built by NASA and not used to study Nibiru. The South Pole Telescope was supported by the National Science Foundation, and it is a radio telescope, not an optical instrument. It cannot take images or photos. You can look it up on Wikipedia. The Antarctic is a great place for astronomical infrared and short-wave-radio observations, and it also has the advantage that objects can be observed continuously without the interference of the day-night cycle.

- I should add that it is impossible to imagine a geometry in which an object can be seen only from the South Pole. Even if it were due south of the Earth, it could be seen from the entire southern hemisphere.
- 6. There are many photos and videos of Nibiru on the Internet. Isn't that proof that it exists?

The great majority of the photos and videos on the Internet are of some feature near the Sun (apparently supporting the claim that Nibiru has been hiding behind the Sun for the past several years.) These are actually false images of the Sun caused by internal reflections in the lens, often called lens flare. You can identify them easily by the fact that they appear diametrically opposite the real solar image, as if reflected across the center of the image. This is especially obvious in videos, where as the camera moves, the false image dances about always exactly opposite the real image. Similar lens flare is a source of many UFO photos taken at night with strong light sources such as streetlights in the frame. I am surprised that people don't recognize this common photo artifact. I am also amazed that these photos showing something nearly as large and bright as the Sun (a "second sun") are accepted together with claims made on some of the same websites that Nibiru is too faint to be seen or photographed except with large telescopes.

One widely reported telescopic photo:

www.greatdreams.com/nibiru-possible.jpg

shows two views of an expanding gas cloud far beyond the solar system, which is not moving; you can see this from the fact that the stars are the same in both pictures. A sharp-eyed reader of this website identified these photos as a gas shell around the star V838 Mon. Wikipedia has a nice write-up and a beautiful photo of it from Hubble. Another high school student was initially impressed by posted images of a red blob that were said to be of Nibiru. Then he worked out in his Photoshop class how to make just such pictures starting from scratch.

One video posted in summer 2008 on Youtube:

www.youtube.com/watch?v=3DqDKtkWIx00A

shows a guy standing in his kitchen claiming that one of the objects discovered by a NASA x-ray telescope is Nibiru. What is his evidence? That since this false-color x-ray image released by NASA is blue, this must really be a nearby planet with an ocean. This would be hilarious if it were not used to frighten people.

7. Can you explain the fact that the area at $(5h\ 53m\ 27s,\ -6\ 10'\ 58")$ has been blackened out in Google Sky and Microsoft Telescope? People suggest that these have been blackened out because those are the co-ordinates where Nibiru is located at present.

Several people have asked me about this blank rectangle in Orion in Google Sky, which is a presentation of images from the Sloan Digital Survey. This can't be a "hiding place" for Nibiru, since it is a part of the sky that could be seen from almost everywhere on the Earth in the winter of 2007-08 when much of the talk about Nibiru began. That would contradict the claims that Nibiru was hiding behind the Sun or that it could be seen only from the southern hemisphere. But I too was curious about this blank rectangle, so I asked a friend who is a senior scientist at Google. He replied that he "found out that the missing data is due to a processing error in the image stitching program we use to display the Sloan survey images. The team assures me that in the next run through, this will be fixed!"

8. If the government knew about Nibiru, wouldn't they keep it a secret to avoid panic? Isn't it the government's job to keep the population at ease?

There are many objectives of government, but they do not include keeping the population at ease. My experience is that sometimes parts of the government do just the opposite, as in the frequent references to various terrorist threats or warnings about driving accidents on long holiday weekends, which are no more dangerous than any other time. There is a long history of associating bad things with political opponents (older readers will remember the "missile gap" in the 1960 election, younger ones will note the many current references to who is or is not keeping the U.S. safe from terrorists). Further, social scientists have pointed out that many of our concepts of public panic are the product of Hollywood, while in the real world people have a good record of helping each other in a time of danger. I think everyone also recognizes that keeping bad news secret usually backfires, making the issue even worse when the facts finally come out. And in the case of Nibiru, these facts would come out very soon indeed.

Even if they wanted to, the government could not keep Nibiru a secret. If it were real, it would be tracked by thousands of astronomers, amateurs as well a professional. These astronomers are spread all over the world. I know the astronomy community, and these scientists would not keep a secret even if ordered to. You just can't hide a planet on its way to the inner solar system!

9. Why does the Mayan calendar say the world will end in 2012? I have heard that they have been pretty accurate in the past with other planetary predictions. How can you be sure you know more than they did?

Calendars exist for keeping track of the passage of time, not for predicting the future. The Mayan astronomers were clever, and they developed a very complex calendar. Ancient calendars are interesting to historians, but of they cannot match the ability we have today to keep track of time, or the precision of the calendars currently in use. The main point, however, is that calendars, whether contemporary or ancient, cannot predict the future of our planet or warn of things to happen on a specific date such as 2012.

I note that my desk calendar ends much sooner, on December 31 2009, but I do not interpret this as a prediction of Armageddon. It is just the beginning of a new year.

10. What is the polar shift theory? Is it true that the earth's crust does a 180-degree rotation around the core in a matter of days if not hours? Does this have something to do to do with our solar system dipping beneath the galactic equator?

A reversal in the rotation of Earth is impossible. It has never happened and never will. There are slow movements of the continents (for example Antarctica was near the equator hundreds of millions of years ago), but that is irrelevant to claims of reversal of the rotational poles. However, many of the disaster websites pull a bait-and-shift to fool people. They claim a relationship between the rotation and the magnetic polarity of

Earth, which does change irregularly with a magnetic reversal taking place every 400,000 years on average. As far as we know, such a magnetic reversal doesn't cause any harm to life on Earth. A magnetic reversal is very unlikely to happen in the next few millennia, anyway. But they falsely claim that a magnetic reversal is coming soon (in 2012) and that this is the same as, or will trigger, a reversal of rotational poles. The bottom line is: (a) Rotation direction and magnetic polarity are not related. (b) There is no reason to expect a reversal of magnetic polarity any time soon, or to anticipate any bad effects on life when it does eventually happen. =A9 A sudden shift in rotational pole with disastrous consequences is impossible. Also, none of this has anything to do with the galactic equator or any of the other nonsense about alignments that appears on many of the conspiracy theory websites.

11. When most of the planets align in 2012 and planet Earth is in the center of the Milky Way, what will the effects of this be on planet Earth? Could it cause a pole shift, and if so what could we expect?

There is no planet alignment in 2012 or any other time in the next several decades. As to the Earth being in the center of the Milky Way, I don't know what this phrase means. If you are referring to the Milky Way Galaxy, we are rather far toward the edge of this spiral galaxy, some 30,000 light years from the center. We circle the galactic center in a period of 225-250 million years, always keeping approximately the same distance. Concerning a pole shift, I also don't know what this means. If it means some sudden change in the position of the pole (that is, the rotation axis of the Earth), then that is impossible, as noted in the answer to Question 10. What many websites do discuss is the alignment of the Earth and Sun with the center of the Milky Way in the constellation of Sagittarius. This happens every December, with no bad consequences, and there is no reason to expect 2012 to be different from any other year.

12. When the sun and the Earth line up on the galactic plane at the same time with the black whole being in the center couldn't that cause something to happen, due to the fact that the black hole has such a strong gravitational pull.

There is a giant black hole in the center of our Milky Way galaxy, and like any concentration of mass it exerts gravitational force on the rest of the Galaxy. However, the galactic center is very far away, approximately 30,000 light years, so it has negligible effects on the solar system or the Earth. There are no special forces from the galactic plane or the galactic center. The only important force that acts on the Earth is the gravitation of the Sun and Moon. As far as the influence of the galactic plane, there is nothing special about this location. The last time the Earth was in the galactic plane was several million years ago. Claims that we are about to cross the galactic plane are untrue.

13. I am scared about the fact that the Earth will enter the Dark Rift in the Milky Way. What will this do? Will the Earth be swallowed up?

The "dark rift" is a popular name for the broad and diffuse dust clouds in the inner arm of the Milky Way Galaxy, which block our view of the galactic center. The entire "galactic alignment" scare is pretty crazy. Late in December the Sun is always approximately in the direction of the center of the Galaxy as seen from the Earth, but so what? Apparently the con-men who are trying to scare you have decided to use these meaningless phrases about "alignments" and the "dark rift" and "photon belt" precisely because they are not understood by the public. It is too bad, but there is no law against lying on the Internet or anywhere else except in a court of law. As far as the safety of the Earth is concerned, the important threats are from global warming and loss of biological diversity, and perhaps someday from collision with an asteroid or comet, not the pseudoscientific claims about 2012.

14. I have heard that the Earth's magnetic field will flip in 2012 just when the strongest level of solar storms in history is predicted to take place. Will this kill us or destroy our civilization?

Near solar maximum (which happens every 11 years approximately),

there are many more solar flares and coronal mass ejections than near solar minimum. Flares and mass ejections are no danger for humans or other life on Earth. They could endanger astronauts in deep space or on the Moon, and this is something that NASA must learn to deal with, but it is not a problem for you or me. Large outbursts can interrupt radio transmission, cause bright displays of the aurora (Northern and Southern Lights), and damage the electronics of some satellites in space. Today many satellites are designed to deal with this possibility, for example by switching off some of their more delicate circuits and going into a "safe" mode for a few hours. In extreme cases solar activity can also disrupt electrical transmissions on the ground, possibly leading to electrical blackouts, but this is rare.

The last solar maximum occurred in 2001, so the next one was predicted for around 2012, 11 years later. However, the most recent solar minimum was unusual, with a period of a couple of years with almost no sunspots or other indications of solar activity, so scientists now guess that the next maximum will be delayed, perhaps to 2013. However, the details of the solar cycle remain basically unpredictable.

You are correct that the Earth's magnetic field protects us by creating a large region in space, called the Earth's magnetosphere, within which most of the material ejected from the Sun is captured or deflected, but there is no reason to expect a reversal of magnetic polarity any time soon. These magnetic reversals happen only once in 400,000 years on average.

15. I am confused about a report on the Fox News website that in 2012 a "Powerful Solar Storm Could Shut Down U.S. for Months". They referred to a report from the National Academy of Sciences that was commissioned and paid for by NASA. If nothing is going to happen as a result of the event in 2012, why would NASA allow such nonsense to be reported?

NASA is pleased with the National Research Council report on heliophysics. As you note, this report includes a worst-case analysis of what could happen today if there were a repetition of the biggest solar storm ever recorded (in 1859). The problem is the way such information can be used out of context. There is no reason to expect such a large solar storm in the near future, certainly not in 2012 specifically. Your reference to "the event in 2012" illustrates this problem. There is no prediction of an "event in 2012". We don't even know if the next solar maximum will take place in that year. The whole 2012 disaster scenario is a hoax, fueled by ads for the Hollywood science-fiction disaster film "2012". I can only hope that most people are able to distinguish Hollywood film plots from reality.

16. All my school friends are telling me that we are all going to die in the year 2012 due to a meteor hitting earth. Is this true?

Your friends are wrong. The Earth has always been subject to impacts by comets and asteroids, although big hits are very rare. The last big impact was 65 million years ago, and that led to the extinction of the dinosaurs. Today NASA astronomers are carrying out a survey called the Spaceguard Survey to find any large near-Earth asteroids long before they hit. We have already determined that there are no threatening asteroids as large as the one that killed the dinosaurs. All this work is done openly with the discoveries posted every day on the NASA NEO Program Office website (neo.jpl.nasa.gov), so you can see for yourself that nothing is predicted to hit in 2012.

17. If Nibiru is a hoax, why doesn't NASA issue a denial? How can you permit these stores to circulate and frighten people? Why doesn't the U.S. government do something about it!

If you go to the NASA home page, nasa.gov, you will see many stories that expose the Nibiru-2012 hoax. Try searching nasa.com under "Nibiru" or "2012". There is not much more that NASA can do. These hoaxes have nothing to do with NASA and are not based on NASA data, so we as an agency are not directly involved. But scientists, both within NASA and outside, recognize that this hoax with its effort to frighten people is a distraction from more important science concerns, such as global warming and loss of biological diversity. We live in a country where there is freedom of speech, and that includes freedom to lie. You should

be glad there are no censors. But if you will just use common sense I am sure you can recognize the lies. As we approach 2012, the lies will be come even more obvious.

18. Can you prove to me that Nibiru is a hoax? There are so many reports that something terrible will happen in 2012. I need proof because the government and NASA are keeping so much from us.

It is not logical to ask for proof that the 2012 doomsday is a hoax. Your questions should be to the doomsday advocates to prove that what they are saying is true, not to NASA to prove it is false. If someone claimed on the Internet that there were 50-foot tall purple elephants walking through Cleveland, would anyone expect NASA to prove this wrong? The burden of proof falls on those who make wild claims. Remember the often-quoted comment from Carl Sagan that extraordinary claims demand extraordinary levels of evidence if they are to be believed.

However, I think that astronomers have reached the point where we can offer extremely strong arguments that Nibiru does not exist. A large planet (or a brown dwarf) in our solar system would have been known to astronomers for many years, both indirectly from its gravitational perturbations on other objects and by direct detection in the infrared. The NASA Infrared Astronomy Satellite (IRAS) carried out the first all-sky survey in 1983, and several subsequent surveys would also have seen Nibiru if it were there. Further, if a large mass passed through the inner solar system every 3600 years, we would see its disruptive effects on the orbits of the inner planets, and we don't.

You don't need to take my word for it. Just use common sense. Have you seen Nibiru? In 2008 many websites said it would be visible to the naked eye in spring 2009. If a large planet or brown dwarf were headed for the inner solar system in 2012, it would already be tracked by hundreds of thousands of astronomers, professional and amateur, all over the world. Do you know any amateur astronomers who are watching it? Have you seen any photos or discussion of it in the big popular astronomy magazines like Sky & Telescope? Just think about it. No one could hide Nibiru if it existed.

19. What about the scary ads for the new film 2012? They tell us to look at these Internet sites to verify the doomsday threat.

The pseudoscientific claims about Nibiru and a doomsday in 2012, together with distrust of the government, are being amplified by publicity for the new film from Columbia Pictures titled 2012, to be released in November 2009. The film's trailer, appearing in theaters and on their website, shows a tidal wave breaking over the Himalayas, with only the following words: "How would the governments of our planet prepare 6 billion people for the end of the world? [long pause] They wouldn't. [long pause] Find out the Truth. Google search 2012".

The film publicity includes creation of a faux scientific website:

www.instituteforhumancontinuity.org/

for "The Institute for Human Continuity", which is entirely fictitious. According to this website, the IHC is dedicated to scientific research and public preparedness. Its mission is the survival of mankind. The website explains that the Institute was founded 1978 by international leaders of government, business, and science. They say that in 2004, IHC scientists confirmed with 94% certainty that the world would be destroyed in 2012. This website encourages people to register for a lottery to select those who will be saved; a colleague submitted the name of her cat, which was accepted. I learned from Wikipedia that creating this sort of fake website is a new advertising technique called "Viral Marketing", by analogy with computer viruses.

20. Is it possible that the influx of questions you describe is part of some kind of campaign for a book or movie, in the hopes that the volume of denials is taken as more "evidence" that there is a conspiracy?

I ask myself the same questions every day, as the volume of mail

I receive about Nibiru (along with various alignments and pole shifts) keeps increasing - now more than 20 per week. Clearly there is money to be made from people's fear about an approaching doomsday. Some of this hype is apparently advertising for the science fiction disaster movie 2012 (see Question 19). Many websites are selling books and tapes about $ar{ exttt{N}}$ ibiru or even "s $ar{ ext{u}}$ rvival kits". It is all very sad, $ar{ ext{that}}$ with so many real issues (such as global warming and financial collapse) people are being taken in by these lies. In the final chapter of a new astronomy book (The Hunt for Planet X) by Govert Shilling, he writes: "There is plenty to do for the debunkers =96 the archaeologists and astronomers who take a long and skeptical look at the tidal wave of Nibiru nonsense and explain with scientific precision what is wrong with this cosmic fairy-tale. They will have their work cut out in the next few years. And on December 22, 2012 there will be a new pseudoscientific cock-andbull story doing the rounds and the whole circus will start all over again. Because no matter how many new celestial bodies are found in our solar system, there will always be a need for a mysterious Planet X.

Argentina: Abduction Interrupted?

This report comes to us from one of the most trusted sources in the country - journalist and UFO researcher Quique Mario of the CEUFO group - but we cannot provide our readers at this time with the exact date of these events or the names of the parties involved. Inquiries have already been made and more information shall be provided as soon as it is received.

According to Quique Mario, the incident is one of several that have "continued to occur" in UFO and cattle mutilation-prone La Pampa. The experiencers have requested anonymity although several external sources have confirmed these events. A woman from an undisclosed location in this Argentinean province claims having witnessed the maneuvers of one or several UFOs in the vicinity over the past four years. Moreover, "she managed to discover that the occupants were tall (some 2 meters) and in some cases no taller than 1.60," writes the journalist. Ten days ago, states the CEUFO report, one of the two unidentified objects descended to ground level but without landing, and an effort was made to abduct the witness, who was holding on to her five year-old son at the time. "Her husband's presence kept the beings from carrying out their goal, as he reacted by hanging on to her legs and pulling her downward, even as she was being transported towrd the strange object against her will." CEUFO adds that the incident caused a commotion in the area and that a radio journalist visited the scene of the events.

"This event can be added to a series of occurences that have been taking place in a vast region of the province, without any official explanation having been given to these phenomena," reads the text. "Restlessness prevails in some areas and fear has caused some rural workers to stop working at night."

We are waiting for an update on this report from INEXPLICATA contributing editor Guillermo Gimenez.

If events are indeed as described in the report, we are looking at what could be a "classic" 60s and '70s abduction scenario, lacking any manner of paranormal overtones or bedroom visitations, orchestrated by humanoid-type occupants and their "robotic" minions.

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

Problem with ufology is that we don't have the definitive physical evidence we need to establish the factual foundations needed.

Some folks over the years have attempted to turn it into a science but without enough physical evidence it hovers in the realm of theoretical ufology if such a term is applicable.

We're 60 years into this phenom and we're still theorizing as to origins etc.. Heck we're still theorizing in the field of physics and just about every other science we have. Ufological studies incorporate so many other sciences and humanities that I like it for that fact. Gotta study history, geology, math, art, and it just goes on and on. For my money anyone who can hold a decent debate in ufology for more than 15 minutes should be honored with a bachelor of science or bachelor of arts degree.

I don't know what's more rewarding sometimes, the hunt or the feast.

Anyway, some use ufology as a bona fide scientific interest to help explain present, past, and future phenomena which is what science does. That's how you know if you're on the right track. One of those three matches the other two in harmony. Others use it for humor, others for political gain. It's the use of it for purposes of fraud and greed, control and oppression that is the real danger.

Just take time and read the magazines and websites about the paranormal. Listen to the radio and tv shows. What percentage of them are fear based? Is every other story or guest broadcasting something regarding fear and terror? Then you can be assured you're dealing with an agenda of sinister design.

If you're a scientific researcher in the field it calls for some responsibility to not support fear mongers but also not lose sight that we're still hunting and one hunter might see a deer when you don't. If you expect deer to be only seen on the meadow, then you won't accept the deer in the thicket and you'll go hungry.

Other people have valid points of view too.

De Void is on an e-mail list soliciting support for a ballot initiative in Denver called the Extraterrestrial Affairs Commission (EAC). If it gathers 4,000 signatures by the Aug. 4 deadline, city residents will be asked in November to approve the first municipal outreach program to ET in the United States. And frankly, this puts De Void in a bind.

Among other things, the full text of the petition asserts that "Evidence of extraterrestrial beings has been known by United States presidents since President Franklin Roosevelt," and that the government has deliberately withheld knowledge of ET-related "advanced clean energy, transportation and other technologies."

That's a stretch, but a quibble next to its other provisions. If approved, the non-salaried, seven-person EAC panel would include an "expert" PhD in social sciences or psychology who has "consulted at least 100 people about their alleged close encounters." Plus an MD/published author and an "expert" on UFOs. And a UFO/ET "expert" of unspecified pedigree who has written a book or published three related articles in "scholarly journals." As well as - gulp - somebody with a "certificate or diploma" in any Exopolitics outfit registered as a 501(c)3.

No doubt you're asking yourself: Why must they be Exopolitics-certified? Why can't they have an Ambassador to the Universe degree from Steven Greer's Center for the Study of Extraterrestrial Intelligence for \$995 (De Void 2/26/09)? Are there two schools of competing thought, like Milton Friedman v. John Maynard Keynes?

Your second question: So how can I get my degree in Exopolitics? Answer: Just Google the sucker and something like the Exopolitics Institute in Hawaii will pop up. Among other things, you'll be learning how to "promote peaceful cooperation with extraterrestrials that evidence suggests are aligned with the advancement of global peace, human empowerment, and human sovereignty."

Five-course tuition for an Exopolitics Certificate runs \$1,875, a Galactic Diplomacy Certicate goes for \$1,500, and \$2,625 will get you an Exopolitics Diploma. The Web site offers "early bird specials" so if you pay early they'll knock a couple of hundred bucks off the top. But even at full price you won't find these sorts of bargains at your local junior college.

Bottom line: these guys are talking about establishing a new priesthood. Just what the world needs - more intermediaries. You

Think it's high drama to watch wisps of smoke streaming from the Sistine Chapel to end the backstage wrangling for a new Pope? Ever seen UFO "experts" jostling for attention? Blowtorch city, man. You'll need asbestos goggles and cornea replacements for this one.

Maybe that's why De Void hovers over the keyboards, fingers unable to tap the delete key. What if Denver actually passed this thing. Somebody could make a mint raffling off front-row seats to cultural anthropologists studying the competition among UFO "experts" hoping to speak for planet Earth. It could provide a windfall in the arena of behavioral sciences.

University Of Colorado Team Finds Definitive Evidence For Ancient Lake On Mars

First unambiguous evidence for shorelines on the surface of Mars, say researchers

A University of Colorado at Boulder research team has discovered the first definitive evidence of shorelines on Mars, an indication of a deep, ancient lake there and a finding with implications for the discovery of past life on the Red Planet.

Estimated to be more than 3 billion years old, the lake appears to have covered as much as 80 square miles and was up to 1,500 feet deep - roughly the equivalent of Lake Champlain bordering the United States and Canada, said CU-Boulder Research Associate Gaetano Di Achille, who led the study. The shoreline evidence, found along a broad delta, included a series of alternating ridges and troughs thought to be surviving remnants of beach deposits.

"This is the first unambiguous evidence of shorelines on the surface of Mars," said Di Achille. "The identification of the shorelines and accompanying geological evidence allows us to calculate the size and volume of the lake, which appears to have formed about 3.4 billion years ago."

A paper on the subject by Di Achille, CU-Boulder Assistant Professor Brian Hynek and CU-Boulder Research Associate Mindi Searls, all of the Laboratory for Atmospheric and Space Physics, has been published online in Geophysical Research Letters, a publication of the American Geophysical Union.

Images used for the study were taken by a high-powered camera known as the High Resolution Imaging Science Experiment, or HiRISE. Riding on NASA's Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter, HiRISE can resolve features on the surface down to one meter in size from its orbit 200 miles above Mars.

An analysis of the HiRISE images indicate that water carved a 30-mile-long canyon that opened up into a valley, depositing sediment that formed a large delta. This delta and others surrounding the basin imply the existence of a large, long-lived lake, said Hynek, also an assistant professor in CU-Boulder's geological sciences department. The lake bed is located within a much larger valley known as the Shalbatana Vallis.

"Finding shorelines is a Holy Grail of sorts to us," said Hynek.

In addition, the evidence shows the lake existed during a time when Mars is generally believed to have been cold and dry, which is at odds with current theories proposed by many planetary scientists, he said. "Not only does this research prove there was a long-lived lake system on Mars, but we can see that the lake formed after the warm, wet period is thought to have dissipated."

Planetary scientists think the oldest surfaces on Mars formed during the wet and warm Noachan epoch from about 4.1 billion to 3.7 billion years ago that featured a bombardment of large meteors and extensive flooding. The newly discovered lake is believed to have formed during the Hesperian epoch and postdates the end of the warm and wet period on Mars by 300 million years, according to the study.

The deltas adjacent to the lake are of high interest to planetary scientists because deltas on Earth rapidly bury organic carbon and other biomarkers of life, according to Hynek. Most astrobiologists believe any present indications of life on Mars will be discovered in the form of subterranean microorganisms.

But in the past, lakes on Mars would have provided cozy surface habitats rich in nutrients for such microbes, Hynek said.

The retreat of the lake apparently was rapid enough to prevent the formation of additional, lower shorelines, said Di Achille. The lake probably either evaporated or froze over with the ice slowly turning to water vapor and disappearing during a period of abrupt climate change, according to the study.

Di Achille said the newly discovered pristine lake bed and delta deposits would be would be a prime target for a future landing mission to Mars in search of evidence of past life.

"On Earth, deltas and lakes are excellent collectors and preservers of signs of past life," said Di Achille. "If life ever arose on Mars, deltas may be the key to unlocking Mars' biological past."

Steve Firmani is looking for New England residents who have their eyes to the sky. He wants people who want to believe.

As the newly appointed director of New England MUFON (Mutual UFO Network), Firmani has been given the task of reorganizing six states into a tightly knit and well-oiled structure.

Previously, the New England chapter was split into various states. Communications broke down, directors came and went, and the organization lacked coherency and stability. The organization wasn't organized.

Firmani saw the problem and brought it to the attention of the National MUFON Director James Carrion, who agreed that steps had to be taken. He charged Firmani with the task of bringing New England together. It may seem like a daunting task, but Firmani has been a dedicated researcher for more than 30 years and gladly rose to the challenge.

His interest in UFOs began as far back as elementary school. A few of his fellow classmates reported a sighting and they were ridiculed by most of the students. Firmani stood by them because he believed there had to be more to this universe than just the comparably small number of people on this planet. His research began in earnest in his early twenties and he's been actively involved in UFO investigation organizations ever since.

While a lot of people may call UFO researchers and believers "crackpots" or worse, Firmani is an example of those who put the name callers to shame.

"You can't prove an unidentified flying object, but you can prove an identified one," says Firmani.

The first thing MUFON does when it receives a report is to investigate all the surrounding possibilities. The incident report form requires that you state the location, time and date of the event. The investigators for MUFON check weather anomalies, FAA reports, military activity, and a host of other possible conditions that may prove the sighting to be something perfectly normal that was simply misconstrued.

"Recently we had reports from several individuals about a series of blue flashing lights in the sky. It turned out to be a blown power transformer."

Like Sherlock Holmes, MUFON takes the approach that when you rule out the impossible, whatever remains, no matter how improbable, must be the truth. Chicken Little, they're not.

There are four classes of sightings. The first two categories are "light in the sky" related. The third category is actual physical ground contact by the object or human contact with an object or being. The fourth involves abductions. If, after ruling out normal terrestrial factors, MUFON cannot discover a natural explanation for the reported incident, and the individual reporting it seems rational, further investigation will be deemed warranted.

Bigelow Aerospace has recently teamed up with MUFON to fund and create SIP (the Star Impact Project). In cases of type 3 encounters, a team of scientists will arrive to investigate on a forensic level within 24 hours of the initial report.

The "regular" investigators for MUFON aren't just a bunch of starry-eyed dreamers. They go through rigorous study and testing, as well as buddy-system training with veteran investigators. Study covers a wide range of subjects from atmospheric phenomenon to astronomy.

New England MUFON encompasses a lot of territory. Included are Connecticut, Massachusetts, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont, as well as working with New York on cases that cross the state lines.

With more than 30 years of research and investigative background under his belt, Firmani has a clear vision of the restructuring of New England MUFON. By making the New England network better organized and grounded, Firmani hopes to attract investigators.

He's not looking to break up the organization into states. He wants to focus on territories that cross state lines; "zone directors" who have the time and willingness to dedicate themselves to their posts.

Along with their organizational and investigative duties, they will host monthly meetings for both members and non-members alike. While youths from ages 12 to 17 are welcomed and encouraged to learn about the field by MUFON, only adults can become investigators.

Although he was invited to speak at the upcoming Exeter UFO Festival, Firmani is more interested in attending the event than speaking.

"Reorganizing New England is quite a task, and I'm not sure I'd have the time to put something together. Besides, there are a lot of presentations I'd like to attend. It's going to be a fun event and I'll definitely be there!"

Firmani recently launched a new Web site that's informative, entertaining, and user friendly. It features tools and links for learning more about Ufology.

The sighting report page was built to be comprehensive and easy to understand in order to aid anyone contacting the organization.

Firmani knows from experience that many people fear being considered whacked by their community if they speak out about UFO sightings, and he wants them to feel comfortable knowing there are people out there with scientific minds who will take them seriously. Firmani wants us to know that we are not alone.

In Praise Of Scientific Heresy

When it comes to scientific facts, the identity of our closest living relative is about as certain as they get. Genome sequencing has confirmed to the satisfaction of pretty much everybody that this dubious honour goes to chimpanzees.

Yet this week sees the publication of a paper that seeks to blow that fact out of the water. The authors argue that the DNA evidence is flawed and that, based on traditional taxonomy, orang-utans are clearly closer to us than chimps (see "Are orang-utans our nearest relatives?").

It's true the locals call orangs the "people of the forest". But recall the old saying about extraordinary claims requiring extraordinary evidence. So far, the research appears to be failing that test. All the experts we contacted dismissed the paper's main conclusion, a reaction that seems likely to be repeated when the paper reaches the wider world.

If its claims are so outlandish, should the research even have been published? Some scientists would clearly have preferred it if the paper had never seen the light of day, and question the judgement of the journal.

That is territory we should tread with care. Ideas that mainstream opinion "knows" to be wrong occasionally turn out to be right. The insights of Galileo, Stan Prusiner - who discovered prions - and many others were once denounced as heresy. And even those that are wrong can be valuable.

Science proceeds by questioning its own assumptions and regarding every "fact" as provisional, so alternative hypotheses should be given an airing, if only to reaffirm the strength of the orthodoxy. Science that pulls up the drawbridge on new ideas risks becoming sterile. The journal recognised that and should be applauded for its decision to disseminate this challenging paper.

One possible outcome, though, is that creationists will trumpet the paper as evidence that the theory of evolution is crumbling. If the experts themselves cannot get their story straight, they will crow, why should we believe anything they say?

That, of course, is shameless intellectual dishonesty (though what else would you expect from a movement built on intellectual dishonesty?). A paper questioning one aspect of evolution is not evidence that evolution itself is in trouble. Quite the

opposite. It is science doing what it is supposed to do. We cannot censor ideas just because we are worried that a small bunch of religious fanatics will twist them for their own ends.

If the paper achieves nothing else, though, it is a reminder of how uncannily similar humans and red apes are, and what we stand to lose when - for sadly it now appears inevitable - these great apes go extinct in the wild.

UFOs Of The 19th Century

For decades, these UFO sightings have been explained away as meteors or other things. But what is interesting that before the Wright brothers launched an airplane, flying crafts were already visible in the skies. None of these crafts could really be explained away as weather balloons or meteorites, to witnesses of the 1800s the crafts were not from this earth.

The Wright Brothers may have been the first to put an machine into the sky, but people had been looking up at flying aircraft for decades before the brothers launched the first airplane.

Reports of UFOs were recorded in newspapers of the 19th century, among the most famous was written in the St. Louis Democrat, Oct. 19, 1865. That article appeared two weeks later in The Cincinnati Commercial, bringing more public awareness to UFOs. The account was of an old Montana fir trapper by the name of James Lumley who saw a UFO fly over him and crash into the forest, exploding like a rocket. The story picked up by the Missouri Democrat and other newspapers, which contributed to national attention or awareness of alien spacecraft.

Most fur trappers may tell tales of Indians, or bears, or mountain lions, but Lumley's account of a flying saucer that crashed into Cadotte Pass was among the most explicit and remains a mystery to this day. It is said that debris from the crash may still be up there, but few there has been no findings since. Nevertheless the story has remained one of the most mysterious of the 1800s.

Lumley was about 175 miles above the Upper Missouri in Great Falls Montana. He was on his way back to his camp site when he saw a "bright luminous body in the heavens." It went rapidly into an eastern direction and was plainly visible for about five seconds. As it flew Lumley saw it burst into an explosion in the sky and he later heard an explosion. It was shortly followed by a strong wind through the forest like a tornado, and the event left the air smelling like sulfur.

The next day, after walking two miles, he saw a path "several rods wide" made through the forest. He followed the path and discovered an object or rather a stone on the side of the mountain. What was unusual about this stone is that it had strange hieroglyphics and glass in it. Lumley felt the fragment he had found had come from an immense body and that the hieroglyphics must have been used for some purpose and made by

human hands.

In April of 1897, people in five Midwestern states reported various accounts of an oblong shape in the sky. The accounts were reported from April 5th to April 19th.

The first recorded sighting was in Omaha Nebraska where more than 100 people witnessed the appearance of a flying object more than 12 feet long. It was shiny and made of steel. The object became so luminous that the brightness awoke people from their sleep.

People in Sioux City, Iowa saw another cigar-shaped craft just a few days later. It was also seen in Cedar Rapids and Burlington and described as a mysterious object with a glaring headlight of some kind and a shiny steel haul, gliding with a hissing sound.

Eyewitnesses in Chicago and Mount Carroll Illinois reported seeing an elongated object with flashing or rotating red and green lights on April 10. Hundreds of people throughout Illinois saw an aircraft hovering about 500 ft in the air and leaving at tremendous speeds. The craft had one bright light in addition to the red and green flashing lights. A Chicago newsstand dealer, Walter McCann was said to have taken two photos of the object at the time, but copies of these photos have not been made public in a very long time. They may still be in a file tucked away in Washington, or so the conspiracy theorists believe.

Later, that same night the people in Wausau Wisconsin looked up to see and egg-shaped craft hovering over city hall in Milwaukee. Thousands of awestruck spectators stood watching the craft as its lights moved back and forth.

On the next night, the same craft or one similar in description was seen in Minnesota and later in Indiana. By April 19, the craft appeared in Cochranville, Ohio and later traveled on to other areas, unknown. All accounts were similar throughout all five states with thousands of witnesses.

One of the most famous of all UFO sightings and crashes in the late 1800s was recorded in Aurora, Texas.

Although no evidence has been found to substantiate the story, the local newspaper account reads as follows: "About 6 o'clock this morning, the early risers of Aurora were astonished at the sudden appearance of the airship which has been sailing around the country. It was traveling due north and much nearer the earth than before. Evidently some of the machinery was out of order, for it was making a speed of only 10 to 12 miles per hour and gradually settled toward the earth."

The craft later crashed into a windmill, bursting into pieces. Some of the material recovered by townspeople revealed material sketched with a type of hieroglyphic.

United Press International, which is now defunct, then picked up the story and it spread throughout the borders of Texas. There were a number of eyewitnesses who all agreed on the basic facts: An unknown craft crashed into the town, and strange debris was found along with a "being not of this world was found in the wreckage."

The townspeople of Aurora discovered the remains of the pilot, or rather extraterrestrial along with the strange debris and gave the creature a "proper burial," respect was due to him as well since he resembled a small man, or humanoid to the town folk. The alien body has long disappeared along with the gravestone after military personnel came to Aurora to "investigate" the incident. The story was so famous it was later made into a movie: The Aurora Encounter" in 1986 starring Jack Elam. The incident is still being studied today.

The Denison Daily News of Denison Texas reported another famous sighting in 1878, when a farmer, John Martin saw a spacecraft. He was later credited for being one of the first to use the term "flying saucer." Martin described the flying saucer as a dark object he saw in the sky. The object moved close to him the whole time he watched.

An interesting story appeared last week in Argentina's Diario Popular concerning the alleged discovery of an "abnormal alloy" at the Los Robles Nature Preserve. Those of you who have been following Inexplicata on a regular basis will remember the visits on horseback performed by members of Argentina's Codigo OVNI group in response to sightings of UFOs and strange creatures.

The story, appearing in the 06.14.2009 issue of the paper, states that a minuscule portion of an alloy whose creation was "impossible to human technology" was collected by members of Codigo OVNI near the Roggero Reservoir in Moreno, which has become the epicenter of UFO activity in the Province of Buenos Aires. The PRG web presence needs to be redesigned and upgraded. It hasn't happened because of the time and effort involved. The site is large (over 800 meg) with thousands of pages, and time and resources are limited. All the PRG sites were done in MS Front Page which has not been cutting edge for years. Since Front Page is a MS product, the pages are often junked up when not viewed in MS Internet Explorer. There have been offers by webmasters to improve the site, but outsourcing this work is no easy matter. There is a lot of great talent in PRG's network, but reorganizing the sites without interrupting the advocacy work is a challenge.

The PRG sites will eventually be upgraded and redesigned with more sophisticated editors. Until then your patience is greatly appreciated.

Noted UFO researcher, lecturer and author Robert Hastings will make his second appearance on CNN's Larry King Live on July 3, 2009. Hastings will discuss important declassified U.S. government documents which confirm a decades-long UFO-Nukes Connection that began with some 150 reports of UFO activity at the Los Alamos atomic weapons laboratory as early as December 1948. According to one FBI document, dated January 31, 1949, these incidents were "considered top secret by Intelligence Officers of both the army and the air forces."

On July 16, 1945, Los Alamos had secretly tested the first atomic bomb in the desert near Alamogordo; bombs two and three were dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Japan on August 6th and 9th respectively, thus ending World War II and ushering in the Nuclear Age. Not long thereafter, according to the declassified documents, someone piloting "flying discs" or "flying saucers" began to monitor America's atomic and thermonuclear weapons program on an ongoing basis.

Information uncovered by Hastings and other researchers reveals that intermittent UFO surveillance of Los Alamos, and other nuclear weapons-related sites, continued throughout and the Cold War era and beyond, occurring as recently as 2006. One Air Force document declassified in 1977 reveals that several UFOs maneuvered near a number of Minuteman nuclear missile sites outside of Malmstrom AFB, Montana, in November 1975. Some of those objects, which alternately hovered and flew around at high velocity, were also tracked on radar and chased, unsuccessfully, by jet fighters. One UFO was reported by missile security personnel to have an "orange white disc" appearance.

These dramatic incidents occurred some six years after the Air Force closed down Project Blue Book-its supposedly definitive UFO investigation-claiming that it had terminated the project because there was no evidence that UFOs posed a threat to national security. However, another now-declassified USAF document states that "Reports of unidentified flying objects which affect national security...are not a part of the Blue Book system." Of course, the American public was never officially informed of this fact, which only became known after the document's release years later. Researchers now have evidence that national security-related UFO incidents, including the missile base cases, were actually investigated by the Air Force

Office of Special Investigations (OSI) and various counter-intelligence groups.

Hastings will also present stunning testimony from a few of the 100-plus former or retired U.S. Air Force personnel he has interviewed, who were involved in one or more of UFO incidents at nuclear missile sites over the years. According to those sources-which include missile launch officers, targeting officers, and maintenance personnel-missiles malfunctioned on a number of occasions, at different bases during the 1960s and '70s, just as UFOs were sighted hovering above their underground silos, or above their launch control facilities.

In other words, if nuclear war with the Soviet Union had erupted during any of those incidents, the affected missiles-which displayed what the Air Force refers to as a "Guidance and Control NO-GO" error-would have sat useless in their silos.

Even more shocking than those cases is the incident reported by former Minuteman missile launch officer David H. Schuur, who was stationed at Minot AFB, North Dakota, in the mid-1960s. According to Schuur, late one night, a UFO actually activated most of the ten missiles he controlled. At the time, he was in the underground Echo Flight Launch Control Capsule, receiving frantic calls from missile security guards topside, who were reporting an extremely bright object in the sky which rapidly moved from missile to missile, briefly hovering over each one. As the UFO lingered, that particular missile's "Launch in Progress" button suddenly lit up on the control panel in the capsule. Schuur states that he had to quickly press an "Inhibit" circuit button to override the launch command apparently being sent to each missile by the UFO.

Schuur told Hastings that he does not know whether the missiles would have actually launched, had he not disrupted their countdown sequence, because several other "spurious indicators" had simultaneously appeared on his missile-readiness display panel. Significantly, a nearly identical incident occurred in Soviet Ukraine, on October 4, 1982, according to two retired Soviet Army officers interviewed by ABC News in 1994. The reporter, David Ensor, later worked at CNN as the network's Chief National Security Correspondent.

Hastings has researched the UFO-Nukes Connection since 1973 and has been invited to speak about his findings at over 500 U.S. colleges and universities since 1981. Fifty two years ago, on June 24th, 1947, Kenneth Arnold saw five objects that he described as "skipping like saucers over water" in the skies over Washington State. The rest is history.

Let us not forget that UFO activity was already beginning to occur elsewhere in the world, and this newspaper article from Chile, courtesy of our friend Raul Nunez at the IIEE, is a good example:

A Flying Disk Over Santiago: Seen Flying Over Los Cerrillos

Mr. Gillermo de la Cerda Simonot, a former civilian officer of the Fleet, states that a shining, silvery and oval-shaped object" appeared before his eyes for ten minutes at noon yesterday.

A flying disk remained stationary for at least ten minutes over the Los Cerrillos airport, at least ten kilometers from the Plaza de Armas, at the very same time that the population of Santiago left its offices and workshops to go off to lunch. The object was seen by Guillermo de la Cerda Simonot, master mechanic of a small bus line, and whose background as a former civilian officer of the Fleet for 30 years, knowledgeable about machinery and vehicles, is a serene, creditworthy individual with good eyesight.

Light Reflected At Noon

It was noon when Guillermo de la Cerda, son of the known racehorse owner of the same name, was returning along the Maip=FA road after having made repairs to a damaged bus. He was wearing sunglasses, which allowed him to face the sun. Suddenly, only a few centimeters over the horizon, he saw something that shined "like the reflection of an airplane's wings when the sun strikes them". He said nothing to his escort, an assistant mechanic of the same bus line, and he continued looking at the object, which remained stationary.

A Silvery, Shining Disk

Finally, convinced that it could not be an airplane, he stopped the bus and got off t for a better look. It was an oval, silvery object, similar to the ones described in newswires regarding "flying saucers". He believed that he could see portholes along its edges, but was uncertain. "I don't want to say something that I didn't say with certainty," he added. His companion saw the same thing as he.

A fiew minutes later, the oval, silvery and brilliant object vanished behind the trees and out of sight.

A "flying disk"? A hallucination? Everything suggests the former. Chile appears to hav been visited by the same extraordinary messengers from space that have already appeared in so many parts of the world.

NASA LUNAR MISSION SUCCESSFULLY ENTERS MOON ORBIT

GREENBELT, Md. -- After a four and a half day journey from the Earth, the Lunar Reconnaissance Orbiter, or LRO, has successfully entered orbit around the moon. Engineers at NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Md., confirmed the spacecraft's lunar orbit insertion at 6:27 a.m. EDT Tuesday.

During transit to the moon, engineers performed a mid-course correction to get the spacecraft in the proper position to reach its lunar destination. Since the moon is always moving, the spacecraft shot for a target point ahead of the moon. When close to the moon, LRO used its rocket motor to slow down until the gravity of the moon caught the spacecraft in lunar orbit.

"Lunar orbit insertion is a crucial milestone for the mission," said Cathy Peddie, LRO deputy project manager at Goddard. "The LRO mission cannot begin until the moon captures us. Once we enter the moon's orbit, we can begin to buildup the dataset needed to understand in greater detail the lunar topography, features and resources. We are so proud to be a part of this exciting mission and NASA's planned return to the moon."

A series of four engine burns over the next four days will put the satellite into its commissioning phase orbit. During the commissioning phase each of its seven instruments is checked out and brought online. The commissioning phase will end approximately 60 days after launch, when LRO will use its engines to transition to its primary mission orbit.

For its primary mission, LRO will orbit above the moon at about 31 miles, or 50 kilometers, for one year. The spacecraft's instruments will help scientists compile high resolution, three-dimensional maps of the lunar surface and also survey it at many spectral wavelengths.

The satellite will explore the moon's deepest craters, examining permanently sunlit and shadowed regions, and provide understanding of the effects of lunar radiation on humans. LRO will return more data about the moon than any previous mission.

Yesterday, June 21, was the 62nd anniversary of one of the still most controversial early episodes of our UFO-conscious modern "Age of Flying Saucers," the so-called Maury Island Affair. On Type 21, 1047, a burst developed a second of the still most control of the still most co June 21, 1947, a huge doughnut-shaped UFO allegedly spewed vast quantities of debris onto Maury Island in Puget Sound near Tacoma, Washington, and onto a boat near the island. The Maury Island incident, dismissed as a hoax by the Air Force and many ufologists, and involving the tragic deaths of two Air Force Intelligence officers in a plane crash, still evokes lively argument. It marks one of the very first reported appearances of the mysterious "Men in Black" (MIB) supposedly intimidating UFO witnesses. The MIB, in this case, appear to have most probably been U.S. government or military agents trying to sow confusion, rather than aliens. The Maury Island incident also has a curious connection with the most controversial episode of modern American history --- the Kennedy assassination. One of the principals of the Maury Island episode, Fred Crisman, was alleged to have connections with supposed conspirators involved in the assassination.

In 1947, Harold L. Dahl (1911-1982) and Fred Lee Crisman (1919-1975) were commercial lumber salvagers in Tacoma Harbor, often incorrectly described as Tacoma harbor patrolmen. Crisman, usually described as Dahl's supervisor, also seems to have been a Federal undercover agent, using his business to keep an eye on suspicious goings-on in Tacoma Harbor and Puget Sound. On the afternoon of June 21, Dahl was on his boat near Maury Island, 3 miles from Tacoma, with his 15-year-old son, their dog, and two crewmen. Dahl claimed to see six huge doughnutshaped metallic craft far overhead. One seemed to be in some sort of trouble, lost altitude, and discharged vast quantities of hot dark lava-like slag and light white aluminum-like metal before flying off West over the sea with the other UFO's. Most of the debris fell on the Maury Island beach--but some hit Dahl's boat, damaging the boat, killing his dog, and burning his son's arm. Dahl and his crew retrieved some of the slag and metal fragments supposedly spewed by the "saucer," and Dahl also tried to take some photographs of the retreating UFO's. When Dahl returned to his Tacoma dock, Crisman at first refused to believe his bizarre story, accusing Dahl and his crew of drinking.

Crisman, however, supposedly changed his mind the next morning after taking the boat out to Maury Island, seeing the piles of slag and metal on the beach, and himself sighting a UFO hovering over the island! That same morning, Dahl allegedly breakfasted with a mysterious visitor wearing a black suit and driving a 1947 Buick sedan, who knew everything about the previous day's sighting, told Dahl he had seen something he should not have seen, and warned him not to discuss his experience with anybody if he loved his family. Dahl, however, at first disregarded this Man in Black as a crackpot. He also

found the photographs he had taken of the "saucers" inexplicably fogged, as if exposed to radiation.

A couple of weeks later, in July, Crisman and Dahl wrote /Amazing Stories/ editor Ray Palmer a letter describing Dahl's sighting, and mailed Palmer some of the alleged "saucer" fragments. Crisman, who was an /Amazing Stories/ fan, had already written Palmer a year earlier, describing his own alleged World War II battle with aggressive underground humanoids with ray-guns in a cave in India! Crisman's underground battle supposedly corroborated Richard Shaver's wild tales of the fiendish subterranean "dero," ballyhooed by Palmer as "fact" in /Amazing Stories/. Palmer asked Kenneth Arnold, already famous for his own June 24 Mt. Rainier sighting of the "saucers," to fly to Tacoma and investigate the Maury Island incident, offering him \$200 in expenses. Palmer, too, had already written to Arnold, and encouraged Arnold in the belief that the "flying saucers" were spacecraft from other planets. John A. Keel later called Palmer "the man who invented flying saucers" because of his early role in popularizing the extraterrestrial theory of UFO's.

Arnold flew to Tacoma on July 29°th --and got caught in a complex, mystifying web of apparent cloak-and-dagger intrigue and skullduggery involving seemingly paranormal aspects while playing amateur detective at Palmer's behest. The seemingly paranormal goings-on recall the "MIB" involvement often reported in later UFO cases, and attributed by some ufologists to extraterrestrial or other-dimensional entities. Arnold, however, appears to have been under constant close Army Air Force and possibly CIA and/or FBI surveillance ever since his June 24 Mount Rainier "flying saucer" sighting. Thus, it is more likely that the "spooks" seemingly dogging his footsteps in Tacoma were U.S. military and government agents themselves trying to keep a mystifying affair under control.

Arnold had not told anyone about his exact plans. Arriving in Tacoma, he called several hotels, to find all of them full with no vacancies. Finally, however, when he called Tacoma's fanciest hotel as a last resort, he found that a room had been reserved there in his name by an unknown benefactor! From July 29 to 31, Arnold met several times in Tacoma with Dahl, who seemed fearful and reluctant to discuss the affair, and Crisman, who seemed to be the more dominant and assertive of the two Maury Island witnesses. He examined Dahl and Crisman's alleged "saucer" debris, which looked like ordinary lava rock and scrap aircraft aluminum. He was called several times by a local United Press stringer, who had been repeatedly called by a mysterious informant who accurately knew everything done and said in Arnold's hotel room! The unknown benefactor reserving Arnold's hotel room, and the mysterious informant "bugging" his room who kept calling the UP man, were most likely military or government agents.

Suspecting a hoax but feeling a little out of his depth, Arnold called for assistance. He first summoned a friend, United Airlines pilot Cap. E.J. "Big Smithy" Smith, who had also seen a UFO, to Tacoma. On the 31'st, he also called two Army Air Force Intelligence officers, Lieutenant Frank Brown and Captain William Davidson. They had debriefed Arnold a few days earlier about his own Mt. Rainier sighting and told him to contact them if he saw or heard anything more unusual. Arriving on the afternoon of July 31, Brown and Davidson interrogated Crisman (the diffident Dahl had left Arnold's hotel room), examined the debris, and also decided the whole thing was a hoax. They left early on the morning of August 1 to return to Hamilton Field in California. Shortly after takeoff, their B-25 bomber crashed, killing both Brown and Davidson.

Sensational newspaper articles charged that the B-25 had been sabotaged and was carrying saucer debris, but an Air Force investigation determined the crash was an accident. The Air Force and FBI officially declared the whole affair a hoax, the supposed "saucer" debris just ordinary industrial slag. Crisman and Dahl had supposedly concocted the hoax to sell a sensational "true" story to Palmer, and had allegedly confessed the whole thing to Air Force and FBI investigators. Later, however, they denied having made any such confession. Arnold flew home to Boise, Idaho, thankful to be relieved of the whole bewildering affair. He later described his investigation of the Maury Island affair, as well as his own original Mt. Rainier sighting, in his

privately printed 1952 book written in collaboration with Ray Palmer, /The Coming of the Saucers/.

Dahl gratefully dropped off into quiet peaceful obscurity after the Maury Island affair. Crisman, however, was first spirited away from Tacoma to Alaska on an Army transport. He later went on to enjoy a curious career as an undercover agent, possibly a CIA operative, while also working as variously a teacher, school administrator, ultra-conservative radio commentator, local politician, and librarian. Crisman was subpoenaed as a witness in New Orleans DA Jim Garrison's 1968 investigation of the Kennedy assassination, because he was reputedly friendly with a lot of shady characters---gangsters, right-wing extremists, and anti-Castro Cuban zealots--allegedly involved in a Kennedy assassination conspiracy. He was later also alleged to have been one of the three "tramps" arrested at Dealey Plaza right after the assassination.

The whole Maury Island "saucer" slag dumping story has sometimes been interpreted as a "disinformation" cover story concocted by Crisman on his superiors' orders to divert unwelcome public attention from some deep dark government or military hanky-panky, possibly experiments with secret weapons (captured Nazi technology?), or illegal dumping of radioactive waste by the Atomic Energy Commission in Puget Sound. A lot of */VERY/* interesting material on Fred Lee Crisman and his myriad curious shenanigans may be found in Kenn Thomas, /Maury Island UFO: The Crisman Conspiracy/ (Lilburn, GA: IllumiNet Press, 1999), as well as in Richard M. Dolan, /UFO's and the National Security State: Chronology of a Cover-Up 1941-1973/ (Charlottesville, VA: Hampton Roads Publishing Company, 2002), pp. 35-42.

Tres Arroyos, located over 600 km south of Buenos Aires, shall henceforth no longer be known as "Argentina=92s Wheat Capital" but as also as the place where the first humanoid encounter of the country took place.

In early 1971, in mid-summer, I had the chance to spend the season in Orense, a lovely beach resort, which together with Reta and Claromeco represent the main tourist attractions of the season. Logically, and given the fact that I was taking my very first steps in field research, my conversations had mostly to do with the subject [ufology]. Thus, my mind was stirred by anecdotes and remembrances. The cause of this was Mr. Vicente Pedone, who was my host at the time.

According to Don Vicente, in the early 1940s, he was a Sergeant of the Buenos Aires Provincial Police, and his beat covered such locations as Orense, San Cayetano, Copetonas, Oriente, Cristiano Muerto, etc. These towns were well known to him. One night, while in the company of an officer surnamed Gitani in a field warehouse, a local boy came running over to them, breathlessly, saying that he had witnessed "a plane crash to the ground in flames", deep in the fields. Faced with this story, Don Vicente and his subordinate reported to the alleged crash site, accompanied by the young man (whom I shall call NN, given his anonymous status). After covering a good distance in the police car, the guide pointed out the possible crash site: there, two hundred meters away from the group, near a hill, was a very strange disk-shaped luminous object that remained still in their sight. Around the object, an undetermined number of "figures" could be seen "coming and going"

At a distance, the beings seemed very tall and were clad in luminous, metallic outfits. Their movements were sluggish and they carried what appeared to be mugs ("tarros") in their hands.

Evidently, this sight impressed the witnesses to such an extent that they made a prudent retreat. But their astonishment and nervousness increased when Don Vicente tried to get the vehicle going, he was unable to do so. He tried one, two, three and more times to no avail. Therefore, rather than running away across the field, they all agreed to remain in the vehicle to see what developed. "We were abandoned to the outcome of the events," remarked the protagonist of this episode.

Several minutes later, they noticed that what they took for an airplane began to move backward with a slow, even motion and speed, always at ground level. This action caused Don Vicente to try to get his police car going once more, since time had become endless to them. Finally he managed to turn the engine over and

make an abrupt departure. This brought an end to this reminiscence, and it=92s a shame that they didn=92t stay long enough to witness the final phase of the phenomenon. The next morning, Don Vicente obtained confirmation from NN, that the landing site in Oriente betrayed signs of burned grass. Unfortunately, the police did not verify this on-site. Therefore, only the story told by NN remains the proof of such physical evidence.

Murrow Vs. The Saucers By Billy Cox

It's been almost 40 years now since the U.S. Air Force pulled the plug on Project Blue Book and essentially order the news media to shut up already about UFOs. And at a moment when America's dazed free press is poised to take a knee on the canvas, De Void can't help but wonder how one of journalism's 20th-century giants would've responded to the challenges.

For Edward R. Murrow, the CBS Radio lion who survived the technology transition to unmask Red-baiting demagoguery for what it was on national television, mastering a new medium was difficult. "This is an old team," he told a new class of consumers known as viewers, "trying to learn a new trade."

Inevitably, Murrow's running battles with management over commercial and entertainment compromises led to his undoing at the network. But his commitment to telling compelling stories, regardless of the medium or its constraints, never faltered.

On April 7, 1950, a year or so before his TV makeover, the man who once told listeners "If I've offended you by this rather mild account of Buchenwald, I'm not in the least sorry," filed a report on UFOs. His commercial-free half-hour account =97 available at http://www.albany.edu/talkinghistory/arch2004jan-june.html =97 looks relatively tame in retrospect. Especially given the magnitude of the coverup of the Roswell UFO crash not quite three years earlier.

But Murrow's gravitas helped validate as a mainstream issue what were then known as flying saucers. Not surprisingly, he played it straight, plumbing skeptics, witnesses like Kenneth Arnold, and official sources alike. Although he drew no conclusions, Murrow was clearly suspicious of military kiss-offs, grousing that "The figures just don't add up."

He reminded Americans that while the USAF's Project Saucer came up empty-handed 1949, bear in mind "the stubbornness of the saucers to accept the mantle of oblivion." Murrow quoted critics who theorized the flying discs were merely classified American programs. Then he'd come back with a Charles Zimmerman, designer of the most exotic XF5Ul "flying pancake," who countered that "this aircraft never flew."

Although journalism will find a way to morph through the latest turbulence, the star system that helped expedite the shift from radio to television is a museum piece. But we can guess with reasonable certainty how the pugnacious chain-smoker would've reacted to, say, the USAF's refusal to address FAA radar records

confirming eyewitness reports of jet fighters chasing a UFO last year near President Bush's home in Texas.

It'd be the same way anyone whose intelligence is insulted might respond. That is, if anyone was paying attention.

UFO-Spotting Turkish Night-Watchman Regards Aliens As 'The World's Policemen'

With his neatly clipped moustache and checked shirt buttoned up to his neck, 51-year-old Yalcin Yalman doesn't look like a typical trendsetter.

But the images he has filmed since 2007 from the suburban Istanbul holiday village where he works as a night-watchman have helped turn UFO-spotting, once the object of scorn, into a popular pastime among educated Turks.

"For me it's just a hobby, a way of passing the night," Yalman shrugged outside an Istanbul conference centre where more than 1,000 people had paid 35 lira (=8016), a handsome sum by local standards, to listen to him and ufologists from around the world reveal their latest findings.

Holding cups of watery coffee selling at an extortionate three lira, elegantly dressed Turkish ladies with word-perfect English peppered speakers from as far afield as Mexico with questions about 2012 and the end of the Mayan calendar.

Former head of the UK defence ministry's UFO desk and a well-known ufologist, Nick Pope, one of the speakers at the conference, confessed himself amazed at the turnout.

"Ufology has a bit of an image problem back home =96 computer nerds, trainspotters, you know," he said. "But that is not the sense I get here at all. And there seems to be an equal balance between men and women."

Haktan Akdogan, the organiser of last weekend's International UFO and New Age Congress, the fourth of its kind in Turkey, put growing domestic interest in UFO sightings down to the increasingly receptive Turkish media, "more sympathetic than the media in the West".

But he described Yalman's films of bright crescent-shaped objects hovering over the Marmara sea, some of them apparently with humanoid figures inside them, as "a turning point for Turkish UFO studies".

"These are the most remarkable images taken in Turkish history," he said, sitting in the central Istanbul office of the Sirius UFO Space Science Studies Centre, which he set up in 1997.

"The authorities can no longer turn a blind eye to this phenomenon."

Increased Turkish tolerance for aliens has spread well beyond the media and the Istanbul well-off.

When an alien appeared in front of a farmer outside the southwestern Turkish village of Narli in 2001, the farmer responded in time-honoured style: he threw rocks until the creature shot into the air "to the height of a minaret" and disappeared.

Seven years later, when a UFO reappeared in the same village, it was met by cameras, not stones.

This year, however, the most striking UFO revelations have come from members of Istanbul's showbiz scene.

A singer who represented Turkey at the Eurovision Song Contest in 1991, Reyhan Karaca, told Turkish newspapers last month how a "prawn-coloured" alien had plucked her from her bed one night and taken her on a whistle-stop tour of earth.

"They were very friendly," she said of the inhabitants of the spacecraft that abducted her. "We communicated using our thoughts."

A couple of days later, Hulya Avsar, a pop singer and presenter who is a household name in Turkey, told Karaca and her talkshow audience that she had seen a UFO from the balcony of her villa too.

Yalman's images have been savaged on several ufologist websites. Pope described them as "very interesting", before adding that, "unless you get a proper analysis, there is a risk of misinterpretation".

Generally, though, scepticism was in short supply among ticketholders at the UFO conference. And the intensity of their belief paid off. At the end of the first day, as a crowd milled outside the World of Wonders hotel where the conference was held, a UFO suddenly appeared in the sky overhead.

"I think they were showing their support for us: we're here, can you see," Akdogan told a TV channel that ran the footage a couple of days later.

Asked whether he is unnerved by UFOs' apparent predilection for materialising in front of him, Yalman smiled and clicked his tongue, the Turkish equivalent of shaking your head.

"I see them as the world's policemen, up there to keep an eye on us," he said, taking a puff of his cigarette. "I only wish they'd come down for a chat. Then we could drink tea and play a few rounds of backgammon."

Space Shuttle Science Shows How 1908 Tunguska Explosion Was Caused By A Comet

The mysterious 1908 Tunguska explosion that leveled 830 square miles of Siberian forest was almost certainly caused by a comet entering the Earth's atmosphere, says new Cornell University research. The conclusion is supported by an unlikely source: the exhaust plume from the NASA space shuttle launched a century later.

The research, accepted for publication (June 24, 2009) by the journal Geophysical Research Letters, published by the American Geophysical Union, connects the two events by what followed each about a day later: brilliant, night-visible clouds, or noctilucent clouds, that are made up of ice particles and only form at very high altitudes and in extremely cold temperatures.

"It's almost like putting together a 100-year-old murder mystery," said Michael Kelley, the James A. Friend Family Distinguished Professor of Engineering at Cornell who led the research team. "The evidence is pretty strong that the Earth was hit by a comet in 1908." Previous speculation had ranged from comets to meteors.

The researchers contend that the massive amount of water vapor spewed into the atmosphere by the comet's icy nucleus was caught up in swirling eddies with tremendous energy by a process called two-dimensional turbulence, which explains why the noctilucent clouds formed a day later many thousands of miles away.

Noctilucent clouds are the Earth's highest clouds, forming naturally in the mesosphere at about 55 miles over the polar regions during the summer months when the mesosphere is around minus 180 degrees Fahrenheit (minus 117 degrees Celsius).

The space shuttle exhaust plume, the researchers say, resembled the comet's action.

A single space shuttle flight injects 300 metric tons of water vapor into the Earth's thermosphere, and the water particles have been found to travel to the Arctic and Antarctic regions, where they form the clouds after settling into the mesosphere.

Kelley and collaborators saw the noctilucent cloud phenomenon days after the space shuttle Endeavour (STS-118) launched on Aug. 8, 2007. Similar cloud formations had been observed following launches in 1997 and 2003.

Following the 1908 explosion, known as the Tunguska Event, the night skies shone brightly for several days across Europe, particularly Great Britain -- more than 3,000 miles away.

Kelley said he became intrigued by the historical eyewitness accounts of the aftermath, and concluded that the bright skies must have been the result of noctilucent clouds. The comet would have started to break up at about the same altitude as the release of the exhaust plume from the space shuttle following launch. In both cases, water vapor was injected into the atmosphere.

The scientists have attempted to answer how this water vapor traveled so far without scattering and diffusing, as conventional physics would predict.

"There is a mean transport of this material for tens of thousands of kilometers in a very short time, and there is no model that predicts that," Kelley said. "It's totally new and unexpected physics."

This "new" physics, the researchers contend, is tied up in counter-rotating eddies with extreme energy. Once the water vapor got caught up in these eddies, the water traveled very quickly -- close to 300 feet per second.

Scientists have long tried to study the wind structure in these upper regions of the atmosphere, which is difficult to do by such traditional means as sounding rockets, balloon launches and satellites, explained Charlie Seyler, Cornell professor of electrical engineering and paper co-author.

"Our observations show that current understanding of the mesosphere-lower thermosphere region is quite poor," Seyler said. The thermosphere is the layer of the atmosphere above the mesosphere.

Military Jets Spotted Searching For Sphere UFO Over Kansas City, Kansas

A report was made that military planes and helicopters moved quickly onto the scene after an unusually shaped sphere UFO flew into the Kansas City, Kansas, area and hovered, according to witness testimony from the Mutual UFO Network (MUFON) database.

This is a report that I took from a person living in the Kansas City Area who called in this report after seeing a TV interview I did. She wishes to remain anonymous due to her job. She gave me this report over the phone the day after it occurred. The woman was somewhat upset about this and I felt that she was genuine. She wants no publicity. I am going to take another investigator with me in the near future to spend some time watching the area from her house and will add to this report later.

"I went outside on my back deck at 2:00 AM to have a smoke and let the dog out. Behind our subdivision there are woods going back for miles - this is a public park or National forest land.

I noticed a large white light in the Southwest and as it moved slowly closer in my direction it got larger and larger. It stopped and I grabbed my high-powered binoculars to look at it and I could see three large spheres connected together with a large arm or protrusion exending out at an angle underneath the craft.

The arm was moving around in a circle. It was metal looking, but I couldn't tell what material it was made of. The object emitted a very bright white light. It stayed in that position for a long time then just dissapeared.

Right afterwards, many military looking planes and helicopters appeared and combed the area for an hour. I am familiar with the planes coming to and from the Johnson County airport, and these were not commercial planes.

Also notable is that there has been a decrease in air traffic from the JO CO airport in the past three months.

I have lived in this house for four years and have seen many strange objects in the sky, including a black triangle shaped craft that floated by very slowly one evening last winter at 11:00 PM right over the center of our street. It was very close and very large. The lights on the bottom of the craft were so bright they illuminated all of the yards. My neighbor's motion activated yard lights went on and all of the dogs in the neighborhood went crazy - I couldn't believe that people didn't come outside to check to see what all the noise was about! I've also seen multiple white lights high up in the sky that dart around at sharp angles and move very fast, then just stop and look like stars in the sky. Have also seen some strange activities by the military and possibly some alien beings in the woods."

Spain: Marcelino Requejo's New Opus

Agatha de Santos =96 Vigo (Galicia). Marcelino Requejo has spent over 30 years researching the UFO phenomenon, talking to those who claim having seen the phenomenon, and compiling information, a passion that began barely 15 years ago. In that time, he has learned some startling cases, now collected in the book OVNIS: Alto Secreto, with a foreword by journalist and writer J.J. Benitez, author of the Caballo de Troya series of books.

Among the 35 cases featured in this book, and one of the most interesting ones recalled by the Galician ufologist, was an event that took place in Vigo. The extraordinary detail of this September 1999 case was that the witness was only 8 years old. The girl and her father were treated to the sight of a strange vehicle flying over their roof: it was the color of lead and shaped like a rugby ball with numerous portholes through which a number of figures could be seen. Moreover, the girl would later see two large-headed, diminutive entities in her bedroom. She described them as having very large heads and eyes, with no ears or mouth, and they gazed at her fixedly.

What Requejo finds most amazing about this narrative was the clarity with which the girl drew the strange flying machine the next day, without omitting even the shadows that were visible behind the portholes. "Even today, ten years later, she remembers it all in great detail," notes the ufologist, who claims that this book is a tribute to all those who have seen strange flying objects and have not been afraid to share their experience.

"It is very strange today for someone to acknowledge seeing a UFO outside their immediate context," acknowledges the Galician researcher, who has collaborated with such shows as Milenio, La Rosa de los Vientos and Milenio 3.

According to Requejo, Galicia is a community that registers a significant number of UFO cases, while cautioning that the phenomenon is of a cyclical nature. "There are times in which they occur with greater or lesser intensity, which also happens elsewhere in the world."

Requejo also describes the surprising experiences recounted by other Galicians who claim having been "abducted" by UFOs, whisked away from the roads upon which they drove to find themselves on other roadways =96 strange episodes that have been repeated elsewhere and remain a mystery.

The conclusion is supported by an unlikely source: the >exhaust plume from the NASA space shuttle launched a century >later.

>The research, accepted for publication (June 24, 2009) by the >journal Geophysical Research Letters, published by the American >Geophysical Union, connects the two events by what followed each >about a day later: brilliant, night-visible clouds, or >noctilucent clouds, that are made up of ice particles and only >form at very high altitudes and in extremely cold temperatures.

Hi Everyone!

In science, one cannot make definitive conclusions based solely on one common connection or interesting fact. A truly scientific conclusion must explain and account for all the known facts. The proposal by the authors that the Tunguska event of 1908 was the result of an impact of a comet - which are now known to be much like rocky asteroids in appearance and composition - still does not explain the reports of (1) the unusually bright night skies in Europe _before_ the event; (2) strange (electrophonic?) sounds _before_ the event; (3) strange seismic activity _before_ the event; (4) anomalous geomagnetic effects _before_ the event; (5) a global atmospheric pressure pulse _before_ the event; (6) the absence of an impact crater and no comet/meteoric fragments; etc.

The widespread firestorm that followed the Tunguska event of 1908 reminds me of other similar events such as the 'Great Chicago Fire' of 1871 and the Tunguska-like event in the Amazon

in 1930, both of which had witnesses reporting fireballs falling from the sky. Although much of Chicago was destroyed by fire in October 8, 1871, we forget that other U.S. cities and towns in surrounding States were also destroyed by fires that same day killing about 1200 people.

Has the Tunguska event finally been explained? No.

Previous speculations that the Tunguska explosion was the result of a comet or meteor have not held up to the facts and neither does this latest explanation.

The Deep Politics of Hollywood: Close Encounters With The Pentagon

For 60 years space aliens have left their mark on the Hollywood box-office in some of the most popular movies of all time, from The Day the Earth Stood Still (1951), E.T: The Extraterrestrial (1982) and Independence Day (1996), to the highly lucrative Monsters vs. Aliens (2009). The new Transformers sequel, Revenge of the Fallen (2009), is also poised for box-office glory this summer with its big-budget blend of eye-popping special effects, fan-fiction and UFO mythology. The most interesting aspects of the Transformers films, however, are evident not so much in celluloid form as they are behind the scenes - in a production process built around the close relationship between Hollywood, the United States military and a variety of government agencies. While the dryer details of this relationship have been relatively well documented, the curious tale of government involvement in Hollywood's UFO movies represents a forgotten chapter in the history of American cinema.

Perception Management: Past and Present

Bizarrely - and for reasons not entirely clear - the U.S. government has taken a keen interest in Hollywood's flying saucer movies since the early days of the phenomenon. Official efforts to debunk UFOs through media channels originated with the CIA-sponsored Robertson Panel which, in 1953, decided that public excitement about flying saucers should be actively discouraged. The panel recommended "That the national security agencies take immediate steps to strip the Unidentified Flying Objects of the=85 aura of mystery they have unfortunately acquired", and that this should "be accomplished by mass media such as television [and] motion pictures..". with specific reference to Walt Disney.i

Unambiguous evidence for the Robertson Panel's covert impact on media representations of UFOs is found in the CBS TV broadcast of UFOs: Friend, Foe, or Fantasy? (1966), a documentary narrated by Walter Cronkite. In a personal letter addressed to former Robertson Panel Secretary Frederick C. Durant, Dr Thornton Page confides that he "helped organize the CBS TV show around the Robertson Panel conclusions", ii even though this was thirteen years later and despite the fact that he was personally sympathetic to the existence of flying saucers.

Government concern over, or involvement in, UFO movies continues to be evidenced in more modern Hollywood productions. Take, for example, the 1996 alien invasion blockbuster Independence Day, which, despite its proud championing of American values and

leadership, was denied cooperation from the Department of Defense (DoD) due in large part to a plotline concerning Area 51 (a super-secret military facility in the Nevada desert long rumoured to be the testing ground for captured extraterrestrial technologies) and the so-called 'Roswell Incident'. The Pentagon specifically requested that "any government connection" to Area 51 or to Roswell be eliminated from the film - a request apparently based on the ridiculous assumption that both the Roswell Incident and Area 51 were not already known to half of America.iii

The DoD may have been unable to dictate script changes on Independence Day, but its involvement with both Transformers movies (2007 and 2009) was much more deep-rooted. The original film's script is loaded with UFOlogical references and laboured rhetoric absolving the U.S. military of complicity in what turns out to be a massive cover-up of alien visitations. The finger is pointed instead at the quasi-governmental "Sector 7" which has been concealing its "Top Secret" alien research for decades within "special access projects" - and all without the knowledge and consent of a shocked and concerned Secretary of Defense.

The United States Air Force (USAF) provided Transformers director Michael Bay with hundreds-of-millions-of-dollars worth of state-of-the-art hardware for use in the 2007 movie, including the F-117 stealth fighter and - in its first ever Silver Screen appearance - the F-22 Raptor fighter. The DoD's support for the Transformers sequel (2009) was no less enthusiastic as Bay was granted every benefit of the Pentagon's coveted "full co-operation".

Managing the Martians

The government found an earlier blockbuster to be rather less welcome. Discussing his classic UFO movie Close Encounters of the Third Kind (1977), Steven Spielberg once revealed in an Australian film journal that he "found [his] faith [in alien life]" when he heard that the government opposed the film. "If NASA took the time to write me a 20-page letter, then I knew there must be something happening", Spielberg said. "When they read the script they got very angry and felt that it was a film that would be dangerous. I felt they mainly wrote the letter because Jaws convinced so many people around the world that there were sharks in toilets and bathtubs, not just in the oceans and rivers. They were afraid the same kind of epidemic would happen with UFOs."iv

Close Encounters raised a red flag to the powers that be, but it wasn't the first UFO movie to do so. During the late 1940s the U.S. government regarded the subject of flying saucers with considerable gravity - 1948 saw the USAF produce its Top Secret and highly controversial 'Estimate of the Situation', an official report concluding flying saucers to be of extraterrestrial origin.v Other USAF factions at the time, however, favoured the more palatable (though no less alarming) idea that the saucers were a dastardly Soviet invention. With the prospect of both Reds and Martians under the bed, it should come as little surprise to learn that when America's very first UFO movie, The Flying Saucer (1950), went into production in 1949 it registered quickly on the USAF radar.

The film's director, Mikel Conrad, had claimed publicly whilst still in production that he had managed to secure genuine footage of a real flying saucer for use in his movie. In September, 1949, Conrad told the Ohio Journal Herald, "I have scenes of the saucer landing, taking off, flying and doing tricks". Conrad further claimed that his remarkable footage was "locked in a bank vault" and would not be shown to anybody prior to his movie's release; shortly thereafter Conrad became the subject of a two month official Air Force investigation. Documents released under the Freedom of Information Act reveal that an agent of the Air Force Office of Special Investigations was dispatched not only to grill Conrad about his claims, but also to attend the first private screening of his completed movie.

Unsurprisingly, Conrad's fantastical claims proved to be without substance - when challenged by the USAF, he admitted that his saucer story was nothing more than an elaborate marketing scam designed to generate media buzz around what was, in reality, a tedious and uneventful movie.vi Nevertheless, what the Conrad

case demonstrates, according to researcher Nick Redfern, "is that the Air Force at the time was taking a keen interest in fictional films about UFOs". Redfern, who has studied the original documentation on the Conrad Case, suggests that the USAF may have considered it "problematic that someone was making a film about UFOs that could have contained real footage".vii Redfern speculates that, from this point on, the USAF learned to be on the lookout for any other pesky UFO movies lurking on the horizon, and to carefully monitor - and even control - their content on grounds of national security.

The above scenario seems plausible in light of the production of a major UFOlogical documentary in 1956, entitled U.F.O., which compelled the USAF to draw up contingency plans to counteract the anticipated fallout from the film upon its release. The director of the USAF's official UFO investigations unit, Project Blue Book, Captain George T. Gregory, was tasked with monitoring not only the film's production process, but its public and critical reception. Believing that the film would stir up a "storm of public controversy", the USAF had set about preparing a special case file that would debunk every saucer sighting examined in the movie and even went so far as to have three of its Blue Book officers provide "technical assistance" to the filmmakers in an effort to control the content of the documentary.viii

"A Hot Potato"

The USAF also made extensive script alterations to a seemingly innocent episode of the Steve Canyon TV series (1958-1959). Backed by Chesterfield Cigarettes and produced at Universal Studios with the full cooperation of the United States Air Force, the NBC show chronicled the daring live-action exploits of Milton Caniff's famous comic strip character. Each episode was bookended with the seal of The Department of the Air Force and with a voice-over announcing: "Steve Canyon! A Salute to the Air Force Men of America!"

The episode to which the USAF took objection was entitled "Project UFO" and saw Colonel Steve Canyon investigate a spate of flying saucer sightings reported to a local Air Force base. According to aviation historian James H. Farmer, "This was an episode that the Air Force did not really want to be aired". In his commentary track for the newly released Steve Canyon DVD (available at:

http://stevecanyondvd.blogspot.com/

Farmer notes that the USAF was uncomfortable with the episode because UFOs were, at the time of the show's production, "causing them a lot of public relations problems... from Roswell in '47 to the UFO over-flights over Washington DC in '52... the Air Force wanted nothing to do with it [the UFO issue]", said Farmer, "it was a hot potato that they were very happy to get rid of when Project Blue Book was discontinued in December of '69".

By the time the USAF had finished with the script, it was, in Farmer's words, "pretty tame... compared to the earlier renditions". Indeed, in the episode as eventually aired the UFO sightings are attributed to a combination of hoax-induced hysteria and - in support of the Air Force's original Roswell cover story - misidentifications of weather balloons.

Producer John Ellis of the Milton Caniff Estate is likewise intrigued by the number of revisions to which the script was subjected: "The thing that's interesting is that when you look at the original scripts... every single page got re-written, and re-written, and re-written...". ix David Haft, the show's producer, was more to the point in his recollection of the Air Force's reaction when he submitted the first script draft for official approval: ""Oh, oh, oh! No, no, no, no!" Haft also noted that the USAF had difficulty in deciding what was acceptable for broadcast.x

A number of alterations to the "Project UFO" script are particularly revealing. In one of the earliest early drafts, for example, Steve Canyon speaks to his Commanding Officer, Colonel Jamison, in defence of a civilian UFO witness: "Why call him a jerk?" asks Canyon, "Seems to me like he acted like a pretty solid, clearheaded citizen..." This dialogue was removed.

Elsewhere in the draft, Canyon appears to be enthusiastic about flying saucers. At one point, when a fresh UFO report comes into the base from the local town, Canyon, "Jumps to [his] feet, rushes to [the] door", and cries "This I gotta see!" before making "a hurried exit". Interestingly, in the final scene as originally written, Canyon is actually seen opening a book on flying saucers, "and sits there quietly reading..". Needless to say, this scene failed to make it to the final draft, and, in the version as aired, Canyon's excitement about UFOs is replaced with scepticism or plain indifference. It is important to remind ourselves that such changes are neatly in line with the Robertson Panel's recommendations to "strip the Unidentified Flying Objects of the=85 aura of mystery they have unfortunately acquired", through, "mass media, such as television...".

Perhaps the most significant alteration to the "Project UFO" episode involved the removal of an entire plot strand concerning the recovery and scientific analysis of what is initially suspected to be flying saucer debris (but which eventually turns out to be nothing of the sort). The draft included dialogue like: "That thing [flying saucer] dropped a small metal ball enclosing an electrical apparatus so intricate, so ingenious, nobody yet has been able to figure out its purpose", and, "the metal wouldn't respond to any of the standard tests". With such obvious shades of Roswell, it is unsurprising that the Air Force was concerned.xi

Despite its content having been tamed to the point of banality, the USAF preferred that the episode not be aired at all. "It got stuck on a shelf", says Ellis in his DVD commentary, "it was finished... but they held on to until near the end of the series to air it". In fact, it was only through a last act of defiance on the part of the show's producers toward the end of its run in 1959 that the episode was screened at all.

That the Pentagon should have seen fit to involve itself in UFO-related entertainment in a debunking capacity makes sense in light of its repeated attempts over the decades to publicly wash its hands of the flying saucer problem. But this approach seems to be at odds with a number of instances dating back to the 1950s in which the U.S. military (possibly in conjunction with the CIA) has actually facilitated the production of UFO-related media content promoting not only the idea of UFO reality, but of extraterrestrial visitation.

Disney and the Aliens

Intriguing testimony along these lines came from Oscar-winning Disney animator Ward Kimball. Kimball was best known for bringing to life beloved Disney characters such as Jiminy Cricket, The Cheshire Cat and The Mad Hatter, and for redesigning Mickey Mouse in 1938. He also worked as Directing Animator on the Disney classics like Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs (1938), Pinocchio (1940), and Fantasia (1940).

In 1979, Kimball claimed that in the mid-1950s the USAF had approached Walt Disney himself to request his cooperation on a documentary about UFOs that would help acclimatise the American public to the reality of extraterrestrials. Even more intriguing was that, in exchange for his cooperation, the USAF would apparently supply Disney with real UFO footage for exclusive use in his documentary. According to Kimball, Disney accepted the deal and began work immediately on the USAF project, which would not have been unusual considering Disney's established relationship with the U.S. government (during WWII Disney made approximately 80 propaganda shorts for the military).

While Disney waited patiently for the USAF to provide the UFO footage, his animators produced conceptual designs of what an alien might look like. Predictably, the offer of the UFO footage was eventually withdrawn, provoking Kimball to challenge the official military liaison for the project, a USAF Colonel who told Kimball that "there was indeed plenty of UFO footage, but that neither [he], nor anyone else was going to get access to it".xii Needless to say, the project was abandoned and forgotten by all but the few who had worked on it.

The Glittering Robes of Entertainment

In connection with research she was conducting for a UFO documentary in 1983, Emmy award winning filmmaker and journalist

Linda Moulton Howe was told by government sources that the 1951 version of The Day the Earth Stood Still, which depicted an alien landing in Washington D.C., was, in her words, "inspired by the CIA", and "one of the first government tests of public reaction to such an event".xiii As farfetched as this may seem, the screenwriter for The Day the Earth Stood Still, Edmund H. North, was actively serving as a Major in the Army Signal Corps just months before being selected by 20th Century Fox to pen the script. During his time in the Corps, North had been in charge of "training and educational" documentaries, and later established himself as a Hollywood scribe of patriotic war films including Sink the Bismark! (1960) and Submarine X-1 (1968), as well as Patton (1970), for which he received an Oscar - all of which raises the possibility that he maintained an official or quasi-official role in the government's cinematic propaganda campaigns throughout his career.

The man responsible for overseeing the production of The Day the Earth Stood Still - 20th Century Fox production chief Darryl Zanuck - was himself in charge of an Army Signal Corps documentary unit during the Second World Warxiv and said that, "If you have something worth while to say, dress it up in the glittering robes of entertainment and you will find a ready market=85 without entertainment, no propaganda film is worth a dime".xv

Disclosure through Documentary?

In 1972, filmmaker Robert Emenegger - formerly Creative Director at Grey Advertising - and his producing partner Allan Sandler were encouraged by the USAF to make a major documentary feature about the UFO phenomenon. Emenegger told us that Sandler "had very strange connections" for a producer and thought that he "did things for the CIA, and maybe even the FBI=85 they all seemed to work together". Emenegger himself had worked for the U.S. government in various media-related capacities and evidently the pair had been deemed suitable for the sensitive assignment.

Emenegger described to the authors how he was briefed on the UFO project at Norton Air Force Base in "a clean room used by the CIA=85 so there was no way anyone could eavesdrop on us". In an offer similar to that made some twenty years earlier to Walt Disney, the USAF promised Emenegger real UFO footage - this time allegedly showing a UFO landing at Holloman Air Force Base in 1971 and the subsequent face-to-face meeting between alien visitors and delegates of the U.S. government. Emenegger was sceptical, but was assured by the USAF that the footage existed, and was genuine.

Whilst he waited for the footage to materialise, Emenegger and his crew continued with their wider production research for which they were given unprecedented access to DoD facilities, including the Pentagon. Emenegger was even granted time with high-ranking military officers apparently well-versed in UFO-related matters, among them Colonel William Coleman, a former spokesman for Project Blue Book, and Colonel George Weinbrenner, then head of Foreign Technology at Wright Patterson Air Force Base - the location where alien materials and bodies allegedly recovered from the 1947 Roswell crash are said to have been stored.

But who in the Air Force would sign off on such a controversial project? Emenegger put this question to Pentagon spokesman Colonel Coleman, who informed him that "the Secretary of the Air Force gave us the order to cooperate". Thus, in an unprecedented move, the Air Force, Army, and Navy gave their full backing to a UFO-related production, so too did NASA, who provided Emenegger's research team with previously unreleased photographs of what appeared to be UFOs in space taken by Gemini astronauts. "We had carte blanche to go anywhere, ask any questions", Emenegger told us, "there were no restrictions put on us". Emenegger even claims to have been shown "Top Secret" footage shot at Vandenberg Air Force Base which showed two UFOs "playfully running behind" a U.S. missile.

After months of shooting, Emenegger's documentary was complete, save for one crucial ingredient - the much-hyped alien landing footage. At the eleventh hour the USAF withdrew its permission for use of the material; the political climate had changed, it said, and was now deemed inappropriate due to the Watergate scandal which had recently broken. "I felt like we had egg on

our face", Emenegger told us, "I felt cheated that we were not allowed to see this film. It was taken back to the Pentagon=85 I stupidly expected to have this footage, which would have been earth-shattering". 36 years on and Emenegger seems as baffled by the whole affair as anyone: "Were we had? Were we being used?" he asks.xvi

Emenegger's Golden Globe nominated documentary, entitled UFOs: Past, Present and Future, was finally released in 1974 and was ground-breaking in extensive use of information provided by the DoD. In addition to the aforementioned photographs from NASA, it featured sit-down interviews with the former heads of Project Blue Book, and footage shot inside the Pentagon of Colonel Coleman talking open-mindedly about the Extraterrestrial Hypothesis. In the absence of the landing footage, Emenegger was forced to include an animated reconstruction of the event as described to him by the USAF, complete with artistic renderings of the alleged aliens. The documentary presented the incident as "one that might happen in the future - or perhaps could have happened already".

It should be noted, however, that the landing footage wasn't entirely absent - at least not according to Emenegger. During the dramatic reconstruction of the alleged landing, the observant viewer can catch a few frames of what appears to be a genuine, self-luminescent Unidentified Flying Object descending slowly in the distance against the backdrop of Holloman's surrounding landscape. These frames, Emenegger claims, were taken from the original landing footage and authorised by the USAF during the editing stage for use his completed documentary.

Interestingly, echoes of Emenegger's deal with the Department of Defense would resound decades later in the production of the aforementioned Transformers (2007) when director Michael Bay was granted the rare privilege of shooting scenes of his alien movie at the Pentagon. The DoD even threw open the gates to Holloman Air Force Base - the highly sensitive location of the alleged alien landing described to Emenegger (and it would do so again for the Transformers sequel). To this day, the only two Hollywood filmmakers to have been granted access to Holloman are Emenegger and Bay - both of whose films dealt with the subject of alien visitation - and this in flat contradiction to the DoD's policy as stated to other filmmakers that it will not work with UFO-related productions because "UFOs do not exist".

Colonel Coleman Returns

The plot thickened in 1978 when Colonel William Coleman - who had acted as the USAF's official liaison for Robert Emenegger's documentary - produced an NBC drama series called Project UFO (1978-79) (not to be confused with the Steve Canyon episode of the same name), a sort of '70s equivalent of the X-Files, but which, oddly enough, simultaneously seemed to promote and debunk the idea of UFO reality in each episode. It is unusual to say the least for a commercial television series to be produced by a high ranking military officer, but that this was the very same officer who had promised UFO landing footage for use in a government-approved documentary just a few years prior, coupled with the fact that the series was entirely based upon official Project Blue Book reports, suggests that a political agenda was being pursued.

What on Earth=85? By now, many a sane reader will probably be puzzled, seeking an answer to the first rational question that comes to mind: "what on earth is going on here?" Why has the government's concern about flying saucers of all things been so far reaching that it has actually seen fit to manage public perception of UFOs by attempting to influence the content of major films, as appears to be the case?

Lieutenant Colonel Phillip J. Corso, who served on the National Security Council during the Eisenhower Administration and who was formerly chief of the Pentagon's Foreign Technology desk, claimed that the production of flying saucer movies was actively encouraged by government-led UFO study groups during the 1950s. The goal, claimed Corso, was simultaneously to fictionalise UFOs (through their association with Hollywood entertainment) and to actualise them in the mind of the viewer, thereby acclimatising the public to UFO reality and politically manipulating their perceptions of the phenomenon in the process. Corso referred to this strategy as "camouflage through limited disclosure". "We

never hid the truth from anybody", he said, "we just camouflaged it. It was always there [in documents, books, TV shows and movies], people just didn't know what to look for or recognise it for what it was when they found it. And they found it over and over again".xvii

Although the CIA Robertson Panel appears to have exerted a sustained impact on media representations of UFOs, at least in the '50s and '60s, this does not constitute concrete proof of a longer-term, conscious and coherent government conspiracy along these lines. However, unless we assume that numerous individuals highly respected in their professions are either lying or deluded, it is difficult to explain the DoD's apparent "smoke and mirrors" media tactics with regard to the extraterrestrial hypothesis.

Perhaps - as some believe - the government has made a number of attempts to acclimatise the public to the notion of alien visitation. Or perhaps efforts like those involving Emenegger and Kimball are part of a smokescreen for more mundane, though no less secretive, government projects. UFO movies may even be a facet of a U.S. psychological warfare programme. As farfetched as this may sound, CIA records show that as early as 1952 the Agency's then Director Walter Bedell Smith was sufficiently concerned about UFOs to seriously discuss, "the possible offensive or defensive utilisation of these phenomena for psychological warfare purposes".xviii

Government/military involvement in UFO movies continues to this day. The 20th Century Fox remake of The Day the Earth Stood Still (2008) had Pentagon involvement in the form of official DoD Hollywood liaison Phil Strub and a number of high-ranking military officers whose names can be found at the tail end of the film's closing credits. Also featured is a special thank you from the film's producers to "the men and women of the United States military for their production assistance". Similarly, Disney's UFO-themed Race to Witch Mountain (2009) received assistance not only from the military but from the CIAxix - a curious arrangement since the latter is not even represented on screen; what's more, the film's portrayal of the military is decidedly negative. In accordance with the media policies of both DoD and CIA, these facts would tend to disqualify a film from receiving production assistance from either party. In this case, however, both were only too willing to lend a helping hand, as Andy Fickman, the film's director, told Premiere Magazine: "the military advisors and intelligence advisors constantly helped to keep us honest every step of the way".xx

Conclusions

To paraphrase The X-Files' agent Mulder: we may "want to believe" the U.S. government when it says it no longer takes an active interest in UFOs. Certainly we all "want to believe" that Hollywood entertainment is just that - entertainment, rather than disinformation.

Judging by the examples outlined in this article, official policy regarding media representations of UFO phenomena seems to have shifted from project to project, from decade to decade, between concerted debunking efforts at one end of the spectrum and, at the other, more subversive attempts to quietly monitor and even seed the content of UFO-related media for purposes of psychological warfare and/or perception management. If nothing else, this should provide incentive for us to sit up and pay greater attention to the fleets of flying saucer movies that will undoubtedly continue to land in our multiplexes in the years to come.

The Deep Politics of Hollywood:

Close Encounters With The Pentagon By Robbie Graham and Matthew Alford

For 60 years space aliens have left their mark on the Hollywood box-office in some of the most popular movies of all time, from The Day the Earth Stood Still (1951), E.T: The Extraterrestrial (1982) and Independence Day (1996), to the highly lucrative Monsters vs. Aliens (2009). The new Transformers sequel, Revenge of the Fallen (2009), is also poised for box-office glory this summer with its big-budget blend of eye-popping special effects, fan-fiction and UFO mythology. The most interesting aspects of the Transformers films, however, are evident not so much in celluloid form as they are behind the scenes =96 in a production process built around the close relationship between Hollywood, the United States military and a variety of government agencies. While the dryer details of this relationship have been relatively well documented, the curious tale of government involvement in Hollywood=92s UFO movies represents a forgotten chapter in the history of American cinema.

Perception Management: Past and Present

Bizarrely =96 and for reasons not entirely clear =96 the U.S. government has taken a keen interest in Hollywood=92s flying saucer movies since the early days of the phenomenon. Official efforts to debunk UFOs through media channels originated with

the CIA-sponsored Robertson Panel which, in 1953, decided that public excitement about flying saucers should be actively discouraged. The panel recommended =93That the national security agencies take immediate steps to strip the Unidentified Flying Objects of the=85 aura of mystery they have unfortunately acquired,=94 and that this should =93be accomplished by mass media such as television [and] motion pictures...=94 with specific reference to Walt Disney.i

Unambiguous evidence for the Robertson Panel's covert impact on media representations of UFOs is found in the CBS TV broadcast of UFOs: Friend, Foe, or Fantasy? (1966), a documentary narrated by Walter Cronkite. In a personal letter addressed to former Robertson Panel Secretary Frederick C. Durant, Dr Thornton Page confides that he =93helped organize the CBS TV show around the Robertson Panel conclusions,=94ii even though this was thirteen years later and despite the fact that he was personally sympathetic to the existence of flying saucers.

Government concern over, or involvement in, UFO movies continues to be evidenced in more modern Hollywood productions. Take, for example, the 1996 alien invasion blockbuster Independence Day, which, despite its proud championing of American values and leadership, was denied cooperation from the Department of Defense (DoD) due in large part to a plotline concerning Area 51 (a super-secret military facility in the Nevada desert long rumoured to be the testing ground for captured extraterrestrial technologies) and the so-called =91Roswell Incident.=92 The Pentagon specifically requested that =93any government connection=94 to Area 51 or to Roswell be eliminated from the film =96 a request apparently based on the ridiculous assumption that both the Roswell Incident and Area 51 were not already known to half of America.iii

The DoD may have been unable to dictate script changes on Independence Day, but its involvement with both Transformers movies (2007 and 2009) was much more deep-rooted. The original film=92s script is loaded with UFOlogical references and laboured rhetoric absolving the U.S. military of complicity in what turns out to be a massive cover-up of alien visitations. The finger is pointed instead at the quasi-governmental =93Sector 7=94 which has been concealing its =93Top Secret=94 alien research for decades within =93special access projects=94 =96 and all without the knowledge and consent of a shocked and concerned Secretary of Defense.

The United States Air Force (USAF) provided Transformers director Michael Bay with hundreds-of-millions-of-dollars worth of state-of-the-art hardware for use in the 2007 movie, including the F-117 stealth fighter and =96 in its first ever Silver Screen appearance =96 the F-22 Raptor fighter. The DoD=92s support for the Transformers sequel (2009) was no less enthusiastic as Bay was granted every benefit of the Pentagon=92s coveted =93full co-operation.=94

Managing the Martians

The government found an earlier blockbuster to be rather less welcome. Discussing his classic UFO movie Close Encounters of the Third Kind (1977), Steven Spielberg once revealed in an Australian film journal that he =93found [his] faith [in alien life]=94 when he heard that the government opposed the film. =93If NASA took the time to write me a 20-page letter, then I knew there must be something happening,=94 Spielberg said. =93When they read the script they got very angry and felt that it was a film that would be dangerous. I felt they mainly wrote the letter because Jaws convinced so many people around the world that there were sharks in toilets and bathtubs, not just in the oceans and rivers. They were afraid the same kind of epidemic would happen with UFOs.=94iv

Close Encounters raised a red flag to the powers that be, but it wasn=92t the first UFO movie to do so. During the late 1940s the U.S. government regarded the subject of flying saucers with considerable gravity =96 1948 saw the USAF produce its Top Secret and highly controversial =91Estimate of the Situation,=92 an official report concluding flying saucers to be of extraterrestrial origin.v Other USAF factions at the time, however, favoured the more palatable (though no less alarming) idea that the saucers were a dastardly Soviet invention. With the prospect of both Reds and Martians under the bed, it should come as little surprise to learn that when America=92s very first

UFO movie, The Flying Saucer (1950), went into production in 1949 it registered quickly on the USAF radar.

The film=92s director, Mikel Conrad, had claimed publicly whilst still in production that he had managed to secure genuine footage of a real flying saucer for use in his movie. In September, 1949, Conrad told the Ohio Journal Herald, =93I have scenes of the saucer landing, taking off, flying and doing tricks.=94 Conrad further claimed that his remarkable footage was =93locked in a bank vault=94 and would not be shown to anybody prior to his movie=92s release; shortly thereafter Conrad became the subject of a two month official Air Force investigation. Documents released under the Freedom of Information Act reveal that an agent of the Air Force Office of Special Investigations was dispatched not only to grill Conrad about his claims, but also to attend the first private screening of his completed movie.

Unsurprisingly, Conrad=92s fantastical claims proved to be without substance =96 when challenged by the USAF, he admitted that his saucer story was nothing more than an elaborate marketing scam designed to generate media buzz around what was, in reality, a tedious and uneventful movie.vi Nevertheless, what the Conrad case demonstrates, according to researcher Nick Redfern, =93is that the Air Force at the time was taking a keen interest in fictional films about UFOs.=94 Redfern, who has studied the original documentation on the Conrad Case, suggests that the USAF may have considered it =93problematic that someone was making a film about UFOs that could have contained real footage.=94vii Redfern speculates that, from this point on, the USAF learned to be on the lookout for any other pesky UFO movies lurking on the horizon, and to carefully monitor =96 and even control =96 their content on grounds of national security.

The above scenario seems plausible in light of the production of a major UFOlogical documentary in 1956, entitled U.F.O., which compelled the USAF to draw up contingency plans to counteract the anticipated fallout from the film upon its release. The director of the USAF=92s official UFO investigations unit, Project Blue Book, Captain George T. Gregory, was tasked with monitoring not only the film=92s production process, but its public and critical reception. Believing that the film would stir up a =93storm of public controversy,=94 the USAF had set about preparing a special case file that would debunk every saucer sighting examined in the movie and even went so far as to have three of its Blue Book officers provide =93technical assistance=94 to the filmmakers in an effort to control the content of the documentary.viii

=93A Hot Potato=94

The USAF also made extensive script alterations to a seemingly innocent episode of the Steve Canyon TV series (1958=961959). Backed by Chesterfield Cigarettes and produced at Universal Studios with the full cooperation of the United States Air Force, the NBC show chronicled the daring live-action exploits of Milton Caniff=92s famous comic strip character. Each episode was bookended with the seal of The Department of the Air Force and with a voice-over announcing: =93Steve Canyon! A Salute to the Air Force Men of America!=94

The episode to which the USAF took objection was entitled =93Project UFO=94 and saw Colonel Steve Canyon investigate a spate of flying saucer sightings reported to a local Air Force base. According to aviation historian James H. Farmer, =93This was an episode that the Air Force did not really want to be aired.=94 In his commentary track for the newly released Steve Canyon DVD (available at: http://stevecanyondvd.blogspot.com/) Farmer notes that the USAF was uncomfortable with the episode because UFOs were, at the time of the show=92s production, =93causing them a lot of public relations problems... from Roswell in =9247 to the UFO over-flights over Washington DC in =9252... the Air Force wanted nothing to do with it [the UFO issue],=94 said Farmer, =93it was a hot potato that they were very happy to get rid of when Project Blue Book was discontinued in December of =9269.=94

By the time the USAF had finished with the script, it was, in Farmer=92s words, =93pretty tame... compared to the earlier renditions.=94 Indeed, in the episode as eventually aired the UFO sightings are attributed to a combination of hoax-induced hysteria and =96 in support of the Air Force=92s original Roswell

cover story =96 misidentifications of weather balloons.

Producer John Ellis of the Milton Caniff Estate is likewise intrigued by the number of revisions to which the script was subjected: =93The thing that=92s interesting is that when you look at the original scripts... every single page got re-written, and re-written, and re-written...=94 ix David Haft, the show=92s producer, was more to the point in his recollection of the Air Force=92s reaction when he submitted the first script draft for official approval: =93"Oh, oh, oh, oh! No, no, no, no!" Haft also noted that the USAF had difficulty in deciding what was acceptable for broadcast.x

A number of alterations to the =93Project UFO=94 script are particularly revealing. In one of the earliest early drafts, for example, Steve Canyon speaks to his Commanding Officer, Colonel Jamison, in defence of a civilian UFO witness: =93Why call him a jerk?=94 asks Canyon, =93Seems to me like he acted like a pretty solid, clearheaded citizen...=94 This dialogue was removed. Elsewhere in the draft, Canyon appears to be enthusiastic about flying saucers. At one point, when a fresh UFO report comes into the base from the local town, Canyon, =93Jumps to [his] feet, rushes to [the] door,=94 and cries =93This I gotta see!=94 before making =93a hurried exit.=94 Interestingly, in the final scene as originally written, Canyon is actually seen opening a book on flying saucers, =93and sits there quietly reading...=94 Needless to say, this scene failed to make it to the final draft, and, in the version as aired, Canyon=92s excitement about UFOs is replaced with scepticism or plain indifference. It is important to remind ourselves that such changes are neatly in line with the Robertson Panel=92s recommendations to =93strip the Unidentified Flying Objects of the=85 aura of mystery they have unfortunately acquired,=94 through, =93mass media, such as television...=94

Perhaps the most significant alteration to the =93Project UFO=94 episode involved the removal of an entire plot strand concerning the recovery and scientific analysis of what is initially suspected to be flying saucer debris (but which eventually turns out to be nothing of the sort). The draft included dialogue like: =93That thing [flying saucer] dropped a small metal ball enclosing an electrical apparatus so intricate, so ingenious, nobody yet has been able to figure out its purpose,=94 and, =93the metal wouldn=92t respond to any of the standard tests.=94 With such obvious shades of Roswell, it is unsurprising that the Air Force was concerned.xi

Despite its content having been tamed to the point of banality, the USAF preferred that the episode not be aired at all. =93It got stuck on a shelf,=94 says Ellis in his DVD commentary, =93it was finished... but they held on to until near the end of the series to air it.=94 In fact, it was only through a last act of defiance on the part of the show=92s producers toward the end of its run in 1959 that the episode was screened at all.

That the Pentagon should have seen fit to involve itself in UFO-related entertainment in a debunking capacity makes sense in light of its repeated attempts over the decades to publicly wash its hands of the flying saucer problem. But this approach seems to be at odds with a number of instances dating back to the 1950s in which the U.S. military (possibly in conjunction with the CIA) has actually facilitated the production of UFO-related media content promoting not only the idea of UFO reality, but of extraterrestrial visitation.

Disney and the Aliens

Intriguing testimony along these lines came from Oscar-winning Disney animator Ward Kimball. Kimball was best known for bringing to life beloved Disney characters such as Jiminy Cricket, The Cheshire Cat and The Mad Hatter, and for redesigning Mickey Mouse in 1938. He also worked as Directing Animator on the Disney classics like Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs (1938), Pinocchio (1940), and Fantasia (1940).

In 1979, Kimball claimed that in the mid-1950s the USAF had approached Walt Disney himself to request his cooperation on a documentary about UFOs that would help acclimatise the American public to the reality of extraterrestrials. Even more intriguing was that, in exchange for his cooperation, the USAF would apparently supply Disney with real UFO footage for exclusive use in his documentary. According to Kimball, Disney accepted the

deal and began work immediately on the USAF project, which would not have been unusual considering Disney=92s established relationship with the U.S. government (during WWII Disney made approximately 80 propaganda shorts for the military).

While Disney waited patiently for the USAF to provide the UFO footage, his animators produced conceptual designs of what an alien might look like. Predictably, the offer of the UFO footage was eventually withdrawn, provoking Kimball to challenge the official military liaison for the project, a USAF Colonel who told Kimball that =93there was indeed plenty of UFO footage, but that neither [he], nor anyone else was going to get access to it.=94xii Needless to say, the project was abandoned and forgotten by all but the few who had worked on it.

The Glittering Robes of Entertainment

In connection with research she was conducting for a UFO documentary in 1983, Emmy award winning filmmaker and journalist Linda Moulton Howe was told by government sources that the 1951 version of The Day the Earth Stood Still, which depicted an alien landing in Washington D.C., was, in her words, =93inspired by the CIA,=94 and =93one of the first government tests of public reaction to such an event.=94xiii As farfetched as this may seem, the screenwriter for The Day the Earth Stood Still, Edmund H. North, was actively serving as a Major in the Army Signal Corps just months before being selected by 20th Century Fox to pen the script. During his time in the Corps, North had been in charge of =93training and educational=94 documentaries, and later established himself as a Hollywood scribe of patriotic war films including Sink the Bismark! (1960) and Submarine X-1 (1968), as well as Patton (1970), for which he received an Oscar =96 all of which raises the possibility that he maintained an official or quasi-official role in the government=92s cinematic propaganda campaigns throughout his career.

The man responsible for overseeing the production of The Day the Earth Stood Still =96 20th Century Fox production chief Darryl Zanuck =96 was himself in charge of an Army Signal Corps documentary unit during the Second World Warxiv and said that, =93If you have something worth while to say, dress it up in the glittering robes of entertainment and you will find a ready market=85 without entertainment, no propaganda film is worth a dime.=94xv

Disclosure through Documentary?

In 1972, filmmaker Robert Emenegger =96 formerly Creative Director at Grey Advertising =96 and his producing partner Allan Sandler were encouraged by the USAF to make a major documentary feature about the UFO phenomenon. Emenegger told us that Sandler =93had very strange connections=94 for a producer and thought that he =93did things for the CIA, and maybe even the FBI=85 they all seemed to work together.=94 Emenegger himself had worked for the U.S. government in various media-related capacities and evidently the pair had been deemed suitable for the sensitive assignment.

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But who in the Air Force would sign off on such a controversial

project? Emenegger put this question to Pentagon spokesman Colonel Coleman, who informed him that =93the Secretary of the Air Force gave us the order to cooperate.=94 Thus, in an unprecedented move, the Air Force, Army, and Navy gave their full backing to a UFO-related production, so too did NASA, who provided Emenegger=92s research team with previously unreleased photographs of what appeared to be UFOs in space taken by Gemini astronauts. =93We had carte blanche to go anywhere, ask any questions,=94 Emenegger told us, =93there were no restrictions put on us.=94 Emenegger even claims to have been shown =93Top Secret=94 footage shot at Vandenberg Air Force Base which showed two UFOs =93playfully running behind=94 a U.S. missile.

After months of shooting, Emenegger=92s documentary was complete, save for one crucial ingredient =96 the much-hyped alien landing footage. At the eleventh hour the USAF withdrew its permission for use of the material; the political climate had changed, it said, and was now deemed inappropriate due to the Watergate scandal which had recently broken. =93I felt like we had egg on our face,=94 Emenegger told us, =93I felt cheated that we were not allowed to see this film. It was taken back to the Pentagon=85 I stupidly expected to have this footage, which would have been earth-shattering.=94 36 years on and Emenegger seems as baffled by the whole affair as anyone: =93Were we had? Were we being used?=94 he asks.xvi

Emenegger=92s Golden Globe nominated documentary, entitled UFOs: Past, Present and Future, was finally released in 1974 and was ground-breaking in extensive use of information provided by the DoD. In addition to the aforementioned photographs from NASA, it featured sit-down interviews with the former heads of Project Blue Book, and footage shot inside the Pentagon of Colonel Coleman talking open-mindedly about the Extraterrestrial Hypothesis. In the absence of the landing footage, Emenegger was forced to include an animated reconstruction of the event as described to him by the USAF, complete with artistic renderings of the alleged aliens. The documentary presented the incident as =93one that might happen in the future =96 or perhaps could have happened already.=94

It should be noted, however, that the landing footage wasn=92t entirely absent =96 at least not according to Emenegger. During the dramatic reconstruction of the alleged landing, the observant viewer can catch a few frames of what appears to be a genuine, self-luminescent Unidentified Flying Object descending slowly in the distance against the backdrop of Holloman=92s surrounding landscape. These frames, Emenegger claims, were taken from the original landing footage and authorised by the USAF during the editing stage for use his completed documentary.

Interestingly, echoes of Emenegger=92s deal with the Department of Defense would resound decades later in the production of the aforementioned Transformers (2007) when director Michael Bay was granted the rare privilege of shooting scenes of his alien movie at the Pentagon. The DoD even threw open the gates to Holloman Air Force Base =96 the highly sensitive location of the alleged alien landing described to Emenegger (and it would do so again for the Transformers sequel). To this day, the only two Hollywood filmmakers to have been granted access to Holloman are Emenegger and Bay =96 both of whose films dealt with the subject of alien visitation =96 and this in flat contradiction to the DoD=92s policy as stated to other filmmakers that it will not work with UFO-related productions because =93UFOs do not exist.=94

Colonel Coleman Returns

The plot thickened in 1978 when Colonel William Coleman =96 who had acted as the USAF=92s official liaison for Robert Emenegger=92s documentary =96 produced an NBC drama series called Project UFO (1978-79) (not to be confused with the Steve Canyon episode of the same name), a sort of =9170s equivalent of the X-Files, but which, oddly enough, simultaneously seemed to promote and debunk the idea of UFO reality in each episode. It is unusual to say the least for a commercial television series to be produced by a high ranking military officer, but that this was the very same officer who had promised UFO landing footage for use in a government-approved documentary just a few years prior, coupled with the fact that the series was entirely based upon official Project Blue Book reports, suggests that a political agenda was being pursued.

What on Earth=85? By now, many a sane reader will probably be puzzled, seeking an answer to the first rational question that comes to mind: =93what on earth is going on here?=94 Why has the government=92s concern about flying saucers of all things been so far reaching that it has actually seen fit to manage public perception of UFOs by attempting to influence the content of major films, as appears to be the case?

Lieutenant Colonel Phillip J. Corso, who served on the National Security Council during the Eisenhower Administration and who was formerly chief of the Pentagon=92s Foreign Technology desk, claimed that the production of flying saucer movies was actively encouraged by government-led UFO study groups during the 1950s. The goal, claimed Corso, was simultaneously to fictionalise UFOs (through their association with Hollywood entertainment) and to actualise them in the mind of the viewer, thereby acclimatising the public to UFO reality and politically manipulating their perceptions of the phenomenon in the process. Corso referred to this strategy as =93camouflage through limited disclosure.=94 =93We never hid the truth from anybody,=94 he said, =93we just camouflaged it. It was always there [in documents, books, TV shows and movies], people just didn=92t know what to look for or recognise it for what it was when they found it. And they found it over and over again.=94xvii

Although the CIA Robertson Panel appears to have exerted a sustained impact on media representations of UFOs, at least in the =9150s and =9160s, this does not constitute concrete proof of a longer-term, conscious and coherent government conspiracy along these lines. However, unless we assume that numerous individuals highly respected in their professions are either lying or deluded, it is difficult to explain the DoD=92s apparent =93smoke and mirrors=94 media tactics with regard to the extraterrestrial hypothesis.

Perhaps =96 as some believe =96 the government has made a number of attempts to acclimatise the public to the notion of alien visitation. Or perhaps efforts like those involving Emenegger and Kimball are part of a smokescreen for more mundane, though no less secretive, government projects. UFO movies may even be a facet of a U.S. psychological warfare programme. Serious Media, Serious Integrity by Billy Cox

LA Times columnist Tim Rutten raises a good point in attributing the MSM's 24/7 Michael Jackson coverage to the triumph of "consumer sovereignty."

At week's end, Basij goons were busting more heads in Tehran, Barak Obama and Kim Jong Il got hissy over missiles, and historic climate-change legislation was moving in Washington. But none could gain much traction against the Jackson monopoly, thanks to collective editorial decisions driven in large part by a massive Internet stampede toward the fate of The Gloved One.

Rutten lamented "the fact of simple, brute commerce: popular culture in the form of film, music and TV now provides an outsized share of the financially strapped media's advertising revenue." And he warned, "surrendering to it ultimately undercuts what's genuinely valuable about serious news media."

As a member of the serious news media, which is collapsing on an hourly basis, De Void is also having trouble resisting those commercial pressures.

At one point, in a craven impulse to squeeze out a few extra Web hits, De Void actually reached for Michael Luckman's "Alien Rock" book to shamelessly parrot some of Jackson's more obscure idiosyncrasies. But what would be gained by mentioning how, during his convalescence after the 1984 Pepsi hair-fire incident (from which his addiction to painkillers allegedly began), of all the videos he could've chosen to watch, he picked "Close Encounters of the Third Kind"?

And wouldn't it be the worst kind of pandering to try to lure Jackson fans into a UFO blog with his 2001 claim that he came from a planet outside our solar system named "Capricious Anomaly in the Sea of Space"? Or to regurgitate quotes from his 1980 UFO sighting from the cockpit of a plane one night?:

"(I saw) illusions in the air that man has never seen. It was total dark and you saw these big icebergs that were glowing in the night. And then I looked far out into the sky and saw purple, green, and blue crystals sparkling, and turning in the air. I said, 'What is that?' And the pilot said that he didn't know, they'd only seen that once before. I said, 'My God, I'll never forget this.'"

Would it add anything to our knowledge of the man - or of UFOs - to mention how MJ edited an "I Was Abducted" tabloid headline into his "Black or White" video? Of course not. It'd be rightly perceived for just what it was - a cheap stunt. And that won't happen here. Now or ever. Because this is serious news media.

The long debate about the existence or nonexistence of extraordinary phenomena, from supernatural entities and fantastic monsters to mystery airships and UFOs, has long been predicated on an unexamined literalism. Either these things exist, it is presumed, or they are the products of error and deception. To a degree, this is a defensible approach. Beyond that, however, the frame of reference is woefully inadequate, failing to explain vividly felt encounters with otherworldly beings and beasts which over all of history human beings have experienced, even as no compelling evidence of their presence in consensus reality has ever emerged. Clark=92s lecture discusses anomalous events vs. experience anomalies, which =96 though epistemologically unrelated =96have a curiously parasitic relationship, and calls for a radical new understanding of the strange occurrences that have plagued, infuriated and fascinated human beings at all times and places.

A mysterious cylindrical object has been spotted in the skies above the Black Country.

Retired teacher Mike Tunnicliffe was left scratching his head after seeing the UFO from his Walsall garden yesterday afternoon.

Mr Tunnicliffe, who works part time at County Bridge Primary School, ran to get his camera and snapped the strange shaped object. He's hoping Express & Star readers might know what it is.

The 63-year-old of Sutton Road said: "It was a long shiny black cylinder shape, pointed at one end like a pencil.

From where I was standing it was around 30ft long and around 400ft off the ground. It was vertical, pointing at the ground.

It came so quickly then within five minutes it was gone again.

I live close to the arboretum where there have been balloon festivals before, but I am sure it wasn't a hot air balloon.

Nor was it a tethered balloon or blimp. I am at a loss at to what it could possibly be."

Mr Tunnicliffe said he saw the shape at 2.45pm yesterday. It appeared over the Mellish Road area, over Calderfields golf course then towards Lichfield Road.

A recent siting of a UFO pictured in the Black Country was hailed as one of the most important pieces of evidence of alien life.

The image, which caused excitement among UFO boffins, was captured by a visitor to Dudley Castle and is the latest in a string of sightings in the region.

In 2007 there were reports of a Dorito-shaped flying object which was spotted in Dudley and Wednesfield.

The photograph was sent to a detective constable, Gary Heseltine, who collects sightings of UFOs.
