SANTA CLARA, Calif. =97 The discovery of life beyond Earth would shake up our view of humanity's place in the universe, but it probably wouldn't seriously threaten organized religion, experts say.

Religious faith remains strong in much of the world despite scientific advances showing that Earth is not the center of the universe, and that our planet's organisms were not created in their present form but rather evolved over billions of years. So it's likely that religion would also weather any storms caused by the detection of E.T., researchers say.

"I think there are reasons that we might initially think there are going to be some problems," said Doug Vakoch, director of Interstellar Message Composition at the SETI (Search for Extraterrestrial Intelligence) Institute in Mountain View, Calif. "My own hunch is they're probably not going to be as severe as we might initially think."

We need to cast off our biological blinkers in the search for life beyond Earth and turn to physics, says cosmologist Charley Lineweaver

What's wrong with the definition of "life"?

Almost everything. For a start, we don't really have one. When you ask a biologist, "Are viruses alive?", half of them will say yes, and half will say no. We don't want a terrestrial-life-only definition. We want one that could apply elsewhere in the universe. This is important because NASA is trying to build an instrument to detect life elsewhere.

So we can't just head off and look for the molecules of life as we know it?

Imagine if some historian wanted to know about the origin of France. Most French people now have passports. So imagine the historian went out on an archaeological dig to look for French passports. That would be ridiculous. France as a nation has evolved over time, and only in the modern version do you get passports. Same for life. You could say all life today has DNA, but in the past, who knows?

Many biologists define life as anything that undergoes Darwinian evolution.

There's an idea among some mathematicians that all mathematical objects - the great universal patterns and non-algorithmic truths - exist perpetually in another realm, awaiting discovery by thinkers. It's usually attributed to Plato so is referred to as mathematical Platonism (Penrose 1989, 2004).

A.R Wallace, the real discoverer of evolution, proposed an extension to his theory - that above a threshold of conscious intelligence, evolution of that intelligence will follow a different (and perhaps universal) pattern. We could maybe label that concept as evolutionary Platonism.

[As S.J Gould has illustrated, simpler evolution is largely contingent - dependent on long series of accidents. I.e. some dinosaurs, minus that comet or asteroid impact, might well have evolved into civilizations equal or superior to ours.]

If evolutionary Platonism is true universally, does this tell us anything about the types of alien intelligences we confront, now or in the future? We can only try to extrapolate from a single instance - humans.

The good news is that the mass of humanity is inclined towards co-operation, kindness and altruism, although, being ignorant of causes and outcomes, that mass is rather easily led astray by fears or by demagogues.

However throughout history there has existed a tiny minority of thinkers or philosophers (including a few physical scientists) who have found that ethical altruism, divorced from violence, racialism or greed, is a long-term survival attribute. Those thinkers have strong ethics supported by logic and are mainly to be found at the hedgerow or the ivory tower, i.e. traditional or academic settings, although they are a minority even there.

Unfortunately for our galactic aspirations, we can't expect to be inter-acting with such thinkers. From our own example the wise ones also tend to be powerless and isolated.

Again from our own example, those who wielding most power are those with the strongest motives: the ignorant, the greedy and the murderous. We see that throughout history and around us today, in our political, military and financial / industrial rulers.

So those are the types we can expect to meet, as foretold by Charles Fort (there is some evidence, from medieval times, that there were squabbles among them, leading to battles in the skies of Earth).

That is a pity, considering that we Earthlings are probably seen by them as mere wild-life or cattle. Because we know how the greedy among us treat our own wild-life and cattle.

Seth Shostak, senior astronomer at the SETI Institute, recently wrote in a The Huffington Post blog that UFOs are "a phenomenon worthy of attention," and I agree. SETI is in the business of searching for signals from intelligent extraterrestrial civilizations, and although Shostak's story continued to highlight some of the wild email correspondence he receives from people convinced that ET is already visiting us, SETI was once viewed as fringe itself. However, devoted scientists worked hard to make their case and in the process have gathered other scientists from multiple disciplines to join in the discussion and research topics related to SETI. Now their work is accepted by the mainstream, so much so that it seems hardly a week goes by without some major media outlet writing about what SETI is up to lately.

I think this is a great model for what needs to happen in the UFO research community, so I am working to make that happen. Just like the brilliant, forward-thinking scientists that helped develop the field of scientific study we now refer to as SETI, there are brilliant, forward-thinking scientists from multiple disciplines who are interested in looking deeper into the UFO mystery. I am gathering some of these academics and members of the mainstream media to take a serious hard look at the phenomena in relation to other space mysteries. This event is called the Cosmic Exploration Conference: Science, UFOs and the Search for Extraterrestrial Life and is being held in Las Vegas in October. I have also launched a Kickstarter project to seek funding to video tape the lectures and post them on YouTube.

Why I'm Not Giving Up On The Search For Extraterrestrial Life by Jill Tarter

When you've spent your career chasing the ultimate, changeeverything cosmic brass ring, how do you retire without feeling disappointed? I've been asked that question, or some variation, dozens of times in the past month, and I've answered it the same way I have over my many decades as a research scientist searching for extraterrestrial intelligence.

I'm not disappointed. I understand how little searching we've done so far, and I'm excited about how much we will do in the future. Now it is time for me to shift from looking for extraterrestrial intelligence to looking for intelligent benefactors to help support that quest. The late Mac Tonnies - author of The Cryptoterrestrials and After the Martian Apocalypse - once said: "I find it most interesting that so many descriptions of ostensible 'aliens' seem to reflect staged events designed to misdirect witnesses and muddle their perceptions." Mac was not wrong. In fact, he was right on target. One can take even the most cursory glance at ufological history and see clear signs where events of a presumed alien and UFO nature have been carefully controlled, managed and manipulated by the intelligence behind the phenomenon.

A look back at many of the early books, periodicals and fanzines on the Flying Saucers of yesteryear will show they were filled with encounters between astonished humans and aliens "taking soil samples". "Radar-visual" encounters were all over the place. People were always in the right place - or, depending on your perspective, the wrong place! - to see the surprised and rumbled ETs hastily scoop up their little tools and race back to the safety of their craft. And they would always be sure to take to the skies in view of the witness.

If, however, we critically analyze events of this type, it becomes obvious that a trend is at work. These were not matters of an accidental or stumbled upon nature - at all. The entities were seen because they clearly wished to be seen. The reason: almost certainly to encourage the spreading of a belief in aliens amongst us - and in definitive meme-like style. And it has undeniably worked. After all, barely 65-years after the Kenneth Arnold encounter at Washington State in June 1947, the UFO phenomenon - and what it potentially implies, whether you're a believer or not - is, today, known of just about here, there and everywhere.

In another category, which has come into prominence the past couple of years, a photographer shooting some scenic view discovers one or more UFOs in one or more of his picture or video frames a few minutes or days later.

Besides educating us, the UFO aliens are thereby manipulating or

playing with the obstinacy of negative skeptics. We should not be surprised if certain aliens who have been investigating and observing us for decades and centuries are not only smarter than we are, but more clever too.

Pangenesis - "all-producing" - a pet belief of Darwin's

Darwin thought that tiny particles called `gemmules' were produced by body cells and that these eventually traveled to the sex organs and influenced future offspring.

Importantly - Daewin thought these `gemmules' picked up on parents' activities and passed those temporary traits on to any children.

Telegony - "offspring at a distance" - a belief held from before and through Victorian times.

Unbelievably, Telegony was taught, and decreed as a fact in text books for up to 70 years without any real attempt at verification. No viable tests were ever made, the idea being dropped from science fashion only when Mendel's basic logic began to dominate.

Last month, Rep. Peter King, R-NY, received yet another letter concerning the alleged surveillance and/or deactivation of nuclear missiles by UFOs during the 1960s and '70s. The authors wanted to know why the chair of the House Committee for Homeland Security continues to ignore affidavits from seven Air Force veterans warning of a serious breach surrounding America's weapons of mass destruction. The retired airmen shouldn't have been - but almost certainly are - strangers to Capitol Hill. In September 2010, they sounded the alarm at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., and CNN streamed the event live. The USAF declined to refute their claims and stood by a moldy "fact sheet" last modified in 2005.

One of those who signed the appeal to King was former USAF captain Bob Salas, who was on duty at Malmstrom AFB with the 490th Strategic Missile Squadron in 1967 when 10 nuclear Minuteman weapons went offline as topside security reported UFOs overhead. Salas argues the UFO threats to Uncle Sam's nuclear arsenal are ongoing, and that "I could get [active duty] Air Force personnel to come forward and testify to his committee about the 50 missiles that went down in Wyoming in 2010."

But King's office has not responded, to either the letter or to De Void's request for a statement. "We just want him to do his job as chairman of the Homeland Security Committee," says Salas. "We're ready and willing to give our testimony, and we're going to keep pressing him for answers. If he doesn't respond, we will pursue other members of the Committee."

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This sort of foolishness, I'm afraid, says more about Ray's sense of moral entitlement - intellectual naivete, too - than it does about the complexities a sophisticated student of history encounters when he or she deals with persons who lived in another time and culture, when issues that appear self-evident to us were barely imaginable (if that) to those who resided in the different country that is the past. Examples that come to mind are many. These will suffice:

There is Thomas Jefferson, the author (along with James Madison)

of American democracy. Both Jefferson and Madison owned slaves -Jefferson notoriously fathered children by one of them, Sally Hemings - and each considered black people mentally inferior to their white masters. In a word that hadn't been invented in their time, they were racists. Both grew up in the plantationslave culture of Virginia, where these lamentable (and worse) sentiments were held by just about everybody, with possibly the exception of George Washington, who favored gradual emancipation and freed his own slaves upon his death.

In any event, the verdict of history and historians is clear: these men, whatever their personal moral blindnesses, were pioneers of democratic governance. Their ideas, in other words, were greater than they were as flawed individual human beings.

Likewise, Martin Luther King. Like Ray D. on Charles Darwin, FBI director (also obsessive racist) J. Edgar Hoover was in a constant stew about Dr. King's private failings. Hoover judged him a "degenerate" (not a scare quote, by the way). In this case, King's private life was indeed tawdry in some regards. Hoover enthusiastically oversaw the FBI's snooping into his personal affairs. FBI operatives tried to blackmail him with the bureau's findings, at one time even seeking to engineer his suicide. As a strategy in their defense of the apartheid order that King and allies were challenging, Southern racists picked up on the theme. They wanted onlookers to believe that King's rampant adultery was all that finally mattered about him.

Thus, all depictions of King's courageous, morally driven effort to undo centuries of wrong to America's black minority were countered with arguments like Ray's. By the way, while we're at it, King was also, in the fashion of nearly all men of his time, something of a homophobe. His views of women, as manifested in his personal treatment of them (beginning with his longsuffering wife), also leave much to be desired.

So much for those so-called heroes of liberty - all of them, incidentally, subject to industries of their own. The number of biographies and other studies of the above-mentioned historical figures is uncountable. Of course that's not all they have in common with Charles Darwin. Like him, they don't measure up to the standards of cool, unblemished guys like Ray, whom future centuries will regard with envy for his timeless moral clarity.

In any event, I refuse to participate in further discussion. It only gives Ray's arguments a pretense to seriousness that they in no way deserve.

Nat Geo's Chasing UFOs: Investigation As Farce

Despite countless claims to the contrary by debunkers, there really is persuasive evidence - both empirical and anecdotal - to confirm the anomalous nature of the UFO phenomenon. Admittedly, one would never know that by watching the Nat Geo network's new reality series Chasing UFOs, whose entertainment-based formula may best be described as Blair Witch Project meets Inspector Clouseau. If the show's producers are not secretly in cahoots with some intelligence agency to make legitimate UFO research look bad, by association, they have certainly achieved that outcome inadvertently.

But before I further discuss this farce, let's look at the other end of the spectrum. One of the very few scientists to have studied the UFO phenomenon, the late physicist James E. McDonald, repeatedly urged other scientists and the public at large to refrain from uninformed and biased assumptions about UFOs and, instead, investigate the facts:

"One of the principal results of my own recent intensive study of the UFO enigma is this: I have become convinced that the scientific community, not only in this country but throughout the world, has been casually ignoring as nonsense a matter of extraordinary scientific importance."

Dr. James E. McDonald Senior Physicist Institute of Atmospheric Physics University of Arizona

"As a result of several trips to [the U.S. Air Force's UFO] Project Blue Book, I've had an opportunity to examine quite carefully and in detail the types of reports that are made by Blue Book personnel=85There are hundreds of good cases in the Air Force files that should have led to top-level scientific scrutiny of [UFOs] years ago, yet these cases have been swept under the rug in a most disturbing way by Project Blue Book investigators and their consultants."

Dr. James E. McDonald Tucson Daily Citizen March 1, 1967

"My own present opinion, based on two years of careful study, is

that UFOs are probably extraterrestrial devices engaged in something that might very tentatively be termed =91surveillance.'"

On June 22, 2012, I delivered a short presentation at the Society for Scientific Exploration's 31st annual conference in Boulder, Colorado, titled "Unexplained Aerial Incursions at Nuclear Weapons Sites Demand a Renewed Scientific Interest in the UFO Phenomenon", which examined declassified U.S. government documents confirming ongoing UFO activity at American nukesrelated facilities since 1948.

Those documents, coupled with the testimony of U.S. military veterans - I have interviewed more than 130 since 1973 - establish beyond a reasonable doubt the reality of UFO incidents at nuclear missile launch sites, nukes storage depots, fissile material production plants, and weapons test ranges. Seven of those veterans participated in my September 27, 2010 press conference in Washington D.C., which CNN streamed live:

In the video, one may watch former U.S. Air Force ICBM launch and targeting officers discussing incidents during which large numbers of Minuteman missiles simultaneously malfunctioned, just as security personnel were reporting glowing, disc-shaped craft hovering near them. Furthermore, other Air Force veterans, interviewed for my book UFOs and Nukes, unequivocally confirm a UFO-involvement in other missile-shutdown incidents at various USAF bases over the years.

If this were not enough, declassified Soviet government documents and the testimony ex-Soviet Army personnel - which became available after the collapse of the U.S.S.R. in 1991 - confirm that ongoing UFO activity, including missile tampering, was also occurring at nuclear weapons sites in that country during the Cold War era.

In short, the documents and witness statements - from both sides of the ocean - collectively confirm that an as-yet unidentified third party, possessing technology vastly superior to that utilized by the U.S. and U.S.S.R., monitored and occasionally disrupted the superpowers' nukes with impunity for decades.

While this information can not be considered scientific data per se, it nevertheless begs for scientific scrutiny - not arbitrary, smug dismissal by those who consider an investigation of UFOs to be beneath their dignity. As Dr. McDonald said, "There are hundreds of good cases in the Air Force files that should have led to top-level scientific scrutiny of [UFOs] years ago."

In other words, although the military cases in and of themselves do not scientifically establish the reality of UFOs, they are certainly credible enough to warrant serious, unbiased study of the phenomenon by physicists, astronomers, and others in academia.

5% Fact, 95% Fluff

Unfortunately, any scientist - or lay UFO skeptic - who watched one or more of the utterly embarrassing Chasing UFOs episodes that recently aired on the Nat Geo channel, will now be even more convinced that the phenomenon is bunk and those who "investigate" the subject are clueless clowns.

"The series, which claims to use science to investigate reports of sightings of unidentified flying objects (UFOs), is the latest entry in a genre of unscripted TV that follows a formula that can be best described as: Easily frightened people searching in the dark for things that frighten them and getting frightened on camera."

"The core of the show is three adults play-acting out spooky adventures in a manner similar to how children might play cops and robbers=85"

"The idea seems to be that should anyone encounter an actual UFO (Bigfoot, ghost, alien, etc.), it's more important to record the face of the investigator as they see the paranormal event, rather than to record the event itself."

"Our team goes searching for soil samples and bits of residue, or debris, or radiation - at night."

"I can't really see how running around in the dark poorly imitating the idea of geological or archaeological research is public educational outreach."

You get the idea. Sad to say, one of those chasing UFOs on the program, filmmaker James Fox, has an established track record of credibly presenting civilian and military sighting reports, in his two excellent documentaries, Out of the Blue and I Know What I Saw, which I have promoted for years during my lectures at colleges and universities.

In October 2011, Fox approached me and former USAF Captain Robert Salas - who co-sponsored the "UFOs and Nukes" press conference mentioned above - and asked us to participate in some unspecified UFO "documentary" being produced by Nat Geo. Salas and I immediately declined, as we were painfully aware of the network's long track record of generally debunking the phenomenon. Indeed, over the years I had told several people, only half-jokingly, that if the Nat Geo scripts were not actually written at CIA headquarters, the network was at least making the agency very happy by broadcasting its poorly researched, extremely biased, essentially propagandistic shows on the UFO subject.

The most recent example, The Truth Behind UFOs: Popped, was aired by the network the night before the premier of Chasing UFOs, and claimed that half of all UFO sightings in the United States during the late 1950s and throughout the =9160s were due to test flights of the then still-classified U-2 and SR-71 spy planes. This absurd opinion was first publicly touted by the CIA itself, in 1994, after a supposedly comprehensive review of the agency's interest in UFOs by its in-house historian, Gerald K. Haines.

Anyone even remotely familiar with the facts knows that thousands - if not tens of thousands - of UFO sightings by Americans during that era involved observations of disc, cigar, spherical and triangular-shaped craft, often hovering at low altitude, that could not possibly be explained away as ultra-secret surveillance aircraft, which flew at extremely high altitudes and, despite their advanced technology, could not hang stationary in the sky. Only a fraction of those bona fide UFO sightings were reported to the U.S. Air Force's Project Blue Book; a great many more were featured in newspapers, magazines and on local radio and television broadcasts.

Did sightings of the U-2 and SR-71 also number in the many thousands and, therefore, conceivably account for 50% of all UFO reports during those years, as CIA officials claimed? No, of course not, but when the Haines report was published, the agency was obviously counting on the much more influential national media's pervasive sloth and customary disinterest toward investigating the UFO phenomenon and, consequently, knew that it could get away with such tripe because almost no one in the elite journalism crowd would double-check the facts. So, score a win for those who think that we should all be kept in the dark on the UFO topic indefinitely.

(An excellent overview of this situation, journalist Terry Hansen's book The Missing Times: News Media Complicity in the UFO Cover-up, has just been republished as an e-book and is available at Amazon. It has long been on my personal list of must-reads for anyone wishing to learn how the reality of the UFO phenomenon could have been so successfully suppressed for decades.)

Interestingly, CIA higher-ups forgot to give their historian Haines access to files relating to the agency's confiscation of important UFO evidence - films and radar tapes - pertaining to the nukes-related Big Sur Incident and the Alaskan UFO Encounter - when he was compiling his allegedly comprehensive history of the CIA's interest in UFOS. These two cases of evidence-suppression by the agency were divulged by retired USAF Major Florenze Mansmann and retired FAA Administrator John Callahan, respectively.

For whatever reason, Nat Geo's The Truth Behind UFOs: Popped slavishly follows the CIA's party line, claiming that sightings of secret spy planes, coupled with Cold War-era hysteria, had caused millions of Americans to imagine that they were seeing disc-shaped craft in the sky on a semi-regular basis.

Of course, if one looks beyond this blatant smoke screen and actually reviews even a small cross-section of declassified UFO documents, one will find CIA, FBI and U.S. Air Force reports concerning ongoing UFO activity at nuclear weapons sites, numerous radar trackings of the objects - as they flew at speeds and performed maneuvers far beyond the capability of any manmade aircraft - and unsuccessful intercept attempts of the unknown intruders by military jet fighters, to mention but a few of the topics covered in the now-public but still largely-unread files.

To date, millions of Americans who incessantly blog about UFOs, from whatever point-of-view, have not spent even one day reviewing the dramatic disclosures contained in these files, even though they are easily accessible on the Internet.

Hooray, another win for the intelligence community UFO censors and their counterparts at the Pentagon, who badly want to keep us all ignorant of the facts!

During a recent radio interview I was asked, in effect, whether I thought that Chasing UFOs was a CIA ploy, considering how dreadful it is and how it will undoubtedly impact, in a very negative manner, public and scientific perceptions about the legitimacy of studying the phenomenon.

My answer was, basically, "Who knows?" I then said it was more likely that the show's producers were merely doing a job, pumping out product, and hoping to capitalize on the popularity of another mostly-abysmal "reality" series on the History Channel, UFO Hunters. The dumbing-down of ufological research, as presented on TV, certainly can not be laid on Nat Geo's doorstep alone. (Don't get me started on the other "UFO documentary" series currently appearing on the History-2 channel, Ancient Aliens. That travesty makes Chasing UFOs seem scholarly by comparison.)

In the first Chasing UFOs episode, our intrepid trio of "investigators" (Fox, Erin Ryder, Ben McGee) focused on the many sighting reports made by folks living in and near Stephenville, Texas, in January 2008. While the show's town hall meeting segment - during which the witnesses discussed their observations - was valid, did the program's producers ever consider including a mention of the far more convincing FAA radar data, forcibly released via the Freedom of Information Act? Those confirm the presence of multiple, unknown objects during the same period of time that some of the sightings occurred. Radar data, which are empirical, not anecdotal in nature, would have convincingly reinforced the reality of the accounts being discussed at the public meeting.

A recently-published animated display of those radar data is now available, thanks to British programmer Rob Freeman:

This oversight is but one example of Chasing UFOs' misplaced focus and apparent obliviousness regarding missed opportunities. During the same town hall segment, one person presented a video that he had recorded during the midst of the sighting wave, showing a string of lights in the sky. Did the program's producers devote even one minute to a technical analysis of the Investigation As Farce Nat Geo's Chasing UFOs

footage? No, of course not. During other segments in the same episode, two different videos of UFOs were also presented. Rather than spending any time on analyzing those, the producers chose to cut back to the faces of the chasers as they watched the tapes, to record their wonder and/or fear.

This article would have to be several pages longer if I were to summarize all of the breathless hoo-ha passed off as investigation and analysis by the show - in just the first three episodes. (Dear God, there are five more waiting in the wings!)

I like James Fox and respect his earlier, valuable work on the UFO topic. If I seem to him too harsh in my assessment of his current caper, perhaps he will at least briefly consider the merits of my criticism and give more thought to his future projects. It will come as no surprise to him that most of the leading ufologists, who are our mutual acquaintances, consider Chasing UFOs an unfortunate development, to say the least. Hopefully, it represents only a temporary departure from James' otherwise respected work.

Former prime minister Tony Blair received a briefing about UFOs from the Ministry of Defence because of his concerns over the disclosure of classified information on alien life-forms.

Downing Street requested the advice for the PM in 1998 as the Freedom of Information Act was being introduced, which allowed the public to obtain information on alien mysteries.

Mr Blair's concerns were raised after he received a letter from a member of the public referring to a 'cover-up' and asking him to make UFO reports and other information available.

He was told by staff at the ministry that it has 'only a limited interest in UFO matters' but that they ' remained open-minded' about 'extraterrestrial life forms'.

The ninth collection of UFO files, released by the UK government on 12 July, takes the chronology full circle back to the MoD's decision to `make UFOs history'.

A guide to the highlights of the 25 files can be found on the The National Archives UFO page here and a more detailed analysis can be found on my UFO files #9 page here. I've blogged about the files as a guest on the archives blogpage here.

The documents reveal how influential my Freedom of Information campaign actually was in the decision to end decades of official secrecy by opening the files to the public.

Within the 6,700 pages is a UFO briefing prepared for former Prime Minister Tony Blair by the Ministry of Defence in 1998. New Labour's manifesto included a commitment to a Freedom of Information bill and UFOlogist Nick Redfern took the initiative in a letter to No.10 that urged Mr Blair to 'consider making available for public scrutiny all of the many and varied UFO reports' collected by the government since the end of the Second World War [DEFE 24/1987/1]

Swiss Ban On UFO Posters Was Legal: Court

More than a decade after Swiss police barred a UFO religious group from putting up posters depicting aliens, Europe's top rights court ruled Friday the sect's free speech had not been violated.

Police in the Swiss canton of Neuchatel in 2001 banned the Raelian group, which claims aliens created life on earth, from putting up the posters.

The local ban came after other authorities in Switzerland had allowed the posters.

Neuchatel officials said the posters presented a public order threat because Raelians promote human cloning and "geniocracy", a system where leaders are picked according to their intelligence.

Additionally, a Swiss court found the Raelians had "theoretically" advocated paedophilia and incest, the European Court of Human Rights said in a statement Friday.

The group had also been the subject of criminal complaints about sexual practices involving children, the court said.

In his essay 'A Mirror in the Sky - The Drake Equation' Oliver Morton gives some details of the history of SETI and the characters involved:

[Quotation Begins]

SETI had started as a radio-astronomy project because Morrison, Cocconi and Drake had seen that radio astronomy provided the only way that a civilization such as ours could be detected by another civilization such as ours.

The technicalities of SETI were thus technicalities of radio astronomy, such as the choice of appropriate frequencies ... and signalling strategies. The difference between type I and type II civilizations, for example, was basically a difference in the power of their radio transmitters, and a difference in the strategies that would be suitable for detecting them. (From around the time of the Byurakan conference Drake himself becsme increasingly interested in type IIs - supercivilizations - and in 1974 he and Sagan mounted a search for them. ...they used the newly refurbished Arecibo radio telescope, a vast bowl in the hills of Costa Rica. Instead of looking at individual stars they looked at whole galaxies, simultaneously sampling the emissions of billions of far-off stars on the basis that what the supercivilizations lacked in numbers they would make up for with the sheer power of their beacons.)

There you have it - as many of us have said, by default SETI was initiated to look for primitives - like us.

And even when Drake and Sagan took an interest in advanced civilizations they imagined the only difference would be a matter of scale.

Admittedly it's hard to see into the future, but history tells us that the difference from one era to the next always involves change of paradigm: doing things in entirely different ways - as technology allows.

So if we're really looking for advanced civilizations we shouldn't expect them to still be using radio.

"A recent Huffington Post story included statements from former undercover CIA officer Chase Brandon, who said that in the 1990s, he found a box labeled "Roswell" at CIA headquarters in Langley, Va. Many years have gone by in search of evidence that could give us a minimal glimpse into the reality and existence of the UFO phenomenon and all that the phenomenon entails. "Why are all the good UFOs invisible?" one Gather.com user asked in response to the latest "invisible UFO" report posted to the site.

You might have thought a defining characteristic of a UFO would be visibility. But thanks to zealous alien hunters doggedly scanning the sky with night-vision cameras, a new class of flying objects that only emit infrared light has emerged from the darkness. Are they spies from the great beyond?

"Some people claim to see actual battles between UFOs up in the sky, using night-vision equipment," the ufologist Robert Sheaffer told Life's Little Mysteries. "Those devices magnify faint objects so much that the sky seems to be filled with invisible UFOs. In reality, of course, they are seeing owls, bats, moths, airplanes, satellites, etc." Night-vision optics trade low resolution for high sensitivity, he explained, so that points of light (such as distant satellites) spill out into circles that make the objects appear huge.

Still, De Void gets nervous when researchers attempt to dialogue with politicians about "extraterrestrials". They'd stand a better chance making introductory connections with a racial epithet.

But loaded language is exactly why the latest quixotic "We The People" White House petition from UFO lobbyist Stephen Bassett is noteworthy. Bassett is calling for the Obama administration to investigate a retired senior CIA official's recent claims that the Agency is, in fact, in possession of material confirming the "extraterrestrial nature" of the 1947 Roswell controversy. Man-in-question Chase Brandon wasn't some obscure bit player; he was the CIA's public face in Hollywood when it came to determining whether or not to cooperate with big-screen storylines. Last month he stepped into a massive pile of selfinflicted doo-doo when he volunteered on a national radio show he'd examined a "Roswell" box in the CIA archives containing smoking-gun photos and official records of an ET crash in the desert.

Critics are charging, perhaps correctly, Brandon timed his announcement to coincide with the release of his sci-fi novel The Cryptos Conundrum. But what he's done goes beyond shilling for a book; Chase Brandon's allegation directly repudiates the White House Office of Science & Technology Policy's contention that "The U.S. government has no evidence that any life exists outside our planet, or that an extraterrestrial presence has contacted or engaged any member of the human race."

Well, there's the Wikipedia article I provided and the 2001 Guardian article linked in it about Mr Brandon. Hardly "conclusive", of course. According to that information, Brandon was the CIA's liason to the movie industry. His task was to encourage the positive portrayal of the CIA by the entertainment industry. During the current story's news cycle, Brandon indicated he wanted to draw a line separating current CIA agents from the activities of agents in the past (apparently re Roswell). Absolving the current Agency and agents from the activities of their long ago bretheren seems inline with Brandon's last position at the CIA.

Brandon said he saw text and photos at the CIA that confirmed for him his belief that a spaceship and aliens were the Roswell incident.

Brandon quoted in the Huffington Post:

"It was not a damn weather balloon - it was what it was billed when people first reported it," said Chase Brandon, a 35-year CIA veteran. "It was a craft that clearly did not come from this planet, it crashed and I don't doubt for a second that the use of the word 'remains' and 'cadavers' was exactly what people were talking about."

Those who think the CIA and Roswell are joined at the hip and those who think they are unconnected will have different interpretations of 'Brandon' being a possible deception operation by the CIA. Since I do not think Roswell and the CIA are connected, I have to wonder why the CIA would want to advertise a connection, as they had none. There would be no need to firewall the current agency from any Roswell misdeeds in the past.

Mr Brandon refers to a "weather balloon", and not AFOSI's Mogul. If "what it was billed as" was a 'flying disc', then "the people" who "first reported it" were from the RAAF.

What to make of "the use of the word 'remains' and 'cadavers' was exactly what people were talking about."?

Do we know of any witness who used those words, specifically? I'm not current on Roswell Witnessology. The only one I can think of who might have was Glenn Dennis. David Rudiak's reading of the Ramey memo has "victims".

Why did Brandon (or the HP) emphasize those two words? Where they in the texts he said he found in a box marked 'Roswell'? Would whoever at AFOSI has the Roswell portfolio recognize the reference(s)?

I'm waiting for (and hoping for) Act II, and (I wish, I wish) a discernable response from the AF.

But, so far. It looks like a publicity stunt to gain some visibility for Mr Brandon and his book.

I've been reading the Spring 1948 Fate article about Maury Island by Kenneth Arnold, and The Coming Of The Saucers (TCOTS), taking the deaths of Davidson and Brown as the fixed point. Both versions have the correct date. The 'time dilation' is enabled by setting the evening interview and trip to the house of Dahl's secretary on the 29th, rather than the 30th. The Fate article does not include going to the house, however, a bad edit leaves in some dialogue between Arnold and Dahl that occurs at the house and does not fit at all in the hotel room.

The following day, Arnold calls Emil Smith. In Fate, Arnold specifies he called Smith and Brown, but Brown first. In TCOTS the events of the 31st are set on the 30th, except for calling Brown which is deferred to its actual spot the following day, the 31st. Much of TCOTS 30th involves Smith. Arnold calls him, Crisman drives Arnold to his plane, Arnold flies to Seattle, gets Smith, and flies back to Tacoma. Smith decides to stay, Crisman drives him to Seattle for his car and an overnight bag, and they drive back separately to Tacoma. For Crisman driving Smith to Seattle, Fate's 31st only has it that Smith and Crisman went out.

TCOTS 31st has the same statement, even though they had already driven to Seattle on TCOTS's 30th. This, I think, indicates we are reading two draft versions of the 31st. In comparing the two day's in TCOTS against the version in Fate, the only evidence in TCOTS 30th and 31st that cannot be accounted for in Fate's 31st is the breakfast with the boat crew which is a nothing scene. The rest is filler, meals and waiting about. In TCOTS there is information about the fragments brought to the room. At first I thought this might have been an addition to the original story because I could not find another witness statement about these fragments, however the AF and FBI reports affirm there were such fragments.

What I think we are reading in TCOTS is an article made out of several drafts of the same material that had not been finalized, rather than an example of poor memory or fabulation by Arnold (or Palmer). Palmer might have been aware of the issue because in his secton of the book, he refers to Maury Island on three occasions, including Arnold's account. Palmer does not refer to any dates.

Not knowing what the relationship was between Ray Palmer and Kenneth Arnold in producing the book, I can't guess how Arnold's story ended up as a kludge. Palmer might have made the best of the situation. I really doubt he did anything more to Arnold's story except perhaps to organize the material as best he could.

"To be accepted by science as a fact any phenomenon must necessarily be repeatable or show some kind of pattern, and until 1954 the erratic UFO did not fulfil any of these requirements. The only thing that could possibly be done was to take the reports of witnesses and note them down; but even this was not truly scientific, for testimony is really the field of the lawyer and not the scientist.

But, despite what he may tell you to the contrary, the scientist has not got this excuse now. On September 17th, 1954, it vanished for ever with the discovery of the first "orthoteny".

Orthotenies are alignments, or, more strictly speaking, great circle courses, plotted by taking UFO sightings (usually during a "flap", the term used for a concentration of sightings) that occur within any particular day. They were first discovered by Aime Michel (a French scientist) during the great French flap of 1954, which, lasting just a month (from September 17 to October 17), was one of the greatest in modern history and forms the basis for Michel's book Flying Saucers and the Straight-Line Mvstery.

This book is really a monumental work of documented evidence, and in it Michel tells of how he first discovered orthoteny after his friend the poet Jean Cocteau had told him to see whether the objects moved along certain lines or traced out patterns. He tried this out with sightings on September 17th at the beginning of the flap, and found his first orthoteny, stretching from Cenon through Clermont-Ferrand and Chaudolas to terminate at Rome."

Summary of Results

Contrary to what some people might think, UFOs don't seem to have gone away.

There were 986 UFO sightings reported in Canada in 2011, approaching three each day. This is near the record for numbers of reports in one year, when 1,004 reports were received in 2008.

Ontario had an all-time record high number of UFOs reported in 2011. In fact, the percentage of reports in Ontario compared with the rest of Canada has been increasing steadily during the past ten years.

In 2011, about 11 per cent of all UFO reports were judged unexplained. This percentage of "unknowns" falls to less than one per cent when only higher-quality cases are considered.

Approximately one in ten Canadians believe they've seen UFOs

There is an average of two witnesses per UFO sighting.

The typical UFO sighting lasted approximately 11 minutes in 2011.

The study found that more than half of all UFO sightings were of simple lights in the sky. Witnesses also reported point sources of light, spheres and boomerangs.

Results of this study show that many people continue to report unusual objects in the sky, and some of these objects do not have obvious explanations. Many witnesses are pilots, police and other individuals with reasonably good observing capabilities and good judgement.

Numbers of reported UFO sightings remain high. Several theories for this can be suggested: more UFOs are present and physically observable by witnesses; more secret or classified military exercises and overflights are occurring over populated areas; more people are unaware of the nature of conventional or natural objects in the sky; more people are taking the time to observe their surroundings; more people are able to report their sightings with easier access to the Internet and portable technology; or even that the downturn in the economy is leading to an increased desire by some people to look skyward for assistance.

Although the largest percentage of reported UFOs is simply lights in the night sky, a small number are objects with definite shapes observed within the witnesses' frame of reference. 2011 Canadian UFO Survey

Popular opinion to the contrary, there is no incontrovertible evidence that some UFO cases involve extraterrestrial contact. The continued reporting of UFOs by the public and the yearly increase in numbers of UFO reports suggests a need for further examination of the phenomenon by social, medical and/or physical scientists.

It's been said there's no such thing as bad publicity, but when the stars of your own show give it a thumbs-down, that might be the exception.

The National Geographic Channel premiered Chasing UFOs, an eight-episode reality TV show last month, focusing on a trio of investigators traversing America in search of the truth of unexplained UFO reports, alleged alien abductions and reported military cover-ups.

On the heels of less-than-positive reviews and viewer comments, two of the show's stars - James Fox and Ben McGee - revealed their own dissatisfaction with Chasing UFOs, complaining that the show had placed more emphasis on entertainment value than a serious look at the UFO subject.

Fox: "I know how disappointed all of you are. I am too. It's not the show that was sold to both myself and scientist Ben. Two months into it, we were off to a great start; good locations, solid witnesses and some opportunities for Ben to apply his field research as a geologist at some crash sites. Very exciting stuff. Unfortunately, when we actually got out in the field, we began to realize that they were more interested in poking around at night than allocating the time necessary during the day as, apparently (so we were told), Americans love watching others sneak around at night from the comfort of their couches. For the most part, it was gratuitous nighttime baloney. ... I promise I'll either quit or change my position within the show because at least I can make it all make some sense. The show does get a bit better further down the road, but not a lot. ... My credibility and reputation has, deservedly, taken a serious hit."

However, it has to stay on my radar and in my bookmarks for several reasons:

First, as Charles Fort repeatedly queried in his books, there seems to be a dichotomy between our scientific picture of Earth as a rotating (and orbiting) sphere in space, and incidences of incoming (or visiting) aerial phenomena which _should_ be random in timing and across the face of the Earth (according to that picture) - but which in fact seem to operate to a geophysical _and_ chronological pattern or patterns.

Second, as Stanton Friedman and Don Ledger said in the foreword for Paul Kimball's 'Best Evidence: Top 10 UFO Sightings'

those aerial phenomena seem to have been essentially unchanging throughout all of our history, and. as Mac Tonnies implied in his tailpiece for the same video, their most important aspect is their influence on human minds, in forming our concept of 'the alien'.

[A vital point from Mac was that the phenomena could be physical or 'para-physical' (or a combination maybe?) and that "I don't think we have the proper vocabulary for that - frankly".]

Lastly, I'm fond of asking the 'naive question' (as recommended by Buckminster Fuller for research and discovery), because that tends to cut through the undergrowth of faulty assumptions, propaganda and trendy science-fashion (often only formed by repeated propaganda - like "black holes", "dark matter", "dark energy") which mostly surrounds the concepts which we (and the PTB) think are most important.

As an example, a battered copy of 'The New Background of Science' (1933) by James Jeans, still provides one with the best skeleton outline of classical and quantum facts, free of most of the maybe false assumptions concerning the 'conscious observer' which clutter our minds today. (All one has to do is bear in mind the extra evidence obtained since 1933, which you can get from Penrose's 'Road to Reality' maybe.)

It would be great if a similar book or series of books did the same job on the aerial phenomena, and all their epiphenomena, considered without bias or assumptions; including contacts, abductions etc. and therefore having to also include all claimed 'religious events' - ie. the supernatural and the paranormal.

being used to try to dictate what UFOs can and cannot be.

Here's the Vallee quote in full (I was surprised, seeing it was Vallee's, by the apparent lack of logic in parts of it):

[Quote Begins]

(1) Unexplained close encounters are far more numerous than required for any physical survey of the earth;

(2) The humanoid body structure of the alleged 'aliens' is not likely to have originated on another planet and is not biologically adapted to space travel;

(3) The reported behavior in thousands of abduction reports contradicts the hypothesis of genetic or scientific experimentation on humans by an advanced race;

(4) The extension of the phenomenon throughout recorded history demonstrates that UFOs are not a contemporary phenomenon; and

(5) The apparent ability of UFOs to manipulate space and time suggests radically different and richer alternatives."

If not extraterrestrial hardware, what are the UFOs? Vallee has three suggestions:

(1) they are "earth lights" a la P. Devereux; that is, an unappreciated terrestrial phenomenon that impresses mental images on the minds of observers;

(2) They are artifacts of a "control system" operated by a nonhuman intelligence or, perhaps, a Gaia like manifestation of supernature (of which we are a tiny part) that is trying to modify our behavior; and

(3) They are apparitions caused by entities ma nipulating space and time; viz,. time travellers from our own past and/or future. (Vallee, Jacques F.; "Five Arguments against the Extraterrestrial Origin of Unidentified Flying Objects," Journal of Scientific Exploration, 4:105, 1990.)

However, that piece by Peter Khoury features a quote with almost opposite conclusions:

[Quote Begins]

Conway Morris, one of the world's leading evolutionary paleobiologists, argued intelligent extraterrestrial life, if it existed at all, would most likely look like us, that is human in appearance, and that it would possibly share our propensity for exploitation of other life, for violence and greed. He still thinks it is awfully quite out there, that ETs should have been evident by now, and wasn't bringing UFO aliens into the discussion.

Mainstream science examining if ETs are here on Earth! Aliens likely to look human! Both points are against the traditional positions of science. But things are clearly changing. I could argue I told you so. <snip>

"... Simon Conway Morris ... in (his book) Life's Solution: Inevitable Humans in a Lonely Universe (using) our best evidence for life, our own on planet Earth, (argues) against the prevailing scientific evolutionary paradigm, he states that because of the ubiquity of evolutionary convergence, not only does life have an extraordinary propensity for navigating multiple pathways to precise biological solutions, but that it repeatedly reprises the same evolutionary solution, mediated powerfully by "the weirdest molecule in the Universe" - DNA. In short, Morris contends that on suitable planets out there the genetic tape of life will play out into more "inevitable humans." But, contends Morris, the rarity of Earth-like planets means that we are most likely living in a lonely universe. Others argue, however, that life is everywhere, driven by a "life principle" that favors the spread of life through the universe."

So 'science' seems undecided on the matter.

However, regardless of all above it still seems wise to expect several or many different types of beings, operating different types of craft - and maybe even using different types of energy and matter.

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The Forgetting Pill

I ran across this interesting article yesterday about a pill to erase selected memories and wondered what relevance this might have to the UFO abduction scenario.

I mean if we are can so effectively tamper with memory now, is it not reasonable to assume a far more advanced civilisation might have learned how to program us to their advantage?

Although I disliked reading of the experiments with rats I mused that we might also be the rats in some cosmic experiment.

Here's a brief summary of what the piece is about followed by a couple of paragraphs taken at random from the body of the article to tempt your brain palate.

Memory Erasure: How It Works

For years scientists have been able to change the emotional tone of a memory by administering certain drugs just before asking people to recall the event in detail. New research suggests that they'll be able to target and erase specific memories altogether. Here's how.

1 - Pick a memory.

It has to be something deeply implanted in the brain, a longterm memory that has undergone a process called consolidation- a restructuring of neural connections.

2 - Recall requires neural connections by protein synthesis.

To remember something, your brain synthesizes new proteins to stabilize circuits of neural connections. To date, researchers have identified one such protein, called PKMzeta. Before trying to erase the targeted memory, researchers would ensure that it was ensconced by having the patient write down an account of the event or retell it aloud several times.

3 - Nuke the memory.

To delete the memory, researchers would administer a drug that blocks PKMzeta and then ask the patient to recall the event again. Because the protein required to reconsolidate the memory will be absent, the memory will cease to exist. Neuroscientists think they'll be able to target the specific memory by using drugs that bind selectively to receptors found only in the correct area of the brain.

4 - Everything else is fine.

If the drug is selective enough and the memory precise enough, everything else in the brain should be unaffected and remain as correct-or incorrect-as ever.

Extract 1

'Consider the study of flashbulb memories, extremely vivid, detailed recollections.

Shortly after the September 11 attacks, a team of psychologists led by William Hirst and Elizabeth Phelps surveyed several hundred subjects about their memories of that awful day.

The scientists then repeated the surveys, tracking how the stories steadily decayed. At one year out, 37 percent of the details had changed.

By 2004 that number was approaching 50 percent. Some changes were innocuous-the stories got tighter and the narratives more coherent-but other adjustments involved a wholesale retrofit.

Some people even altered where they were when the towers fell. Over and over, the act of repeating the narrative seemed to corrupt its content. The scientists aren't sure about this mechanism, and they have yet to analyze the data from the entire 10-year survey.

But Phelps expects it to reveal that many details will be makebelieve.

"What's most troubling, of course, is that these people have no idea their memories have changed this much," she says. "The strength of the emotion makes them convinced it's all true, even when it's clearly not."

Extract 2

The problem with eliminating pain, of course, is that pain is often educational. We learn from our regrets and mistakes; wisdom is not free.

If our past becomes a playlist-a collection of tracks we can edit with ease-then how will we resist the temptation to erase the unpleasant ones?

Even more troubling, it's easy to imagine a world where people don't get to decide the fate of their own memories. "My worst nightmare is that some evil dictator gets a hold of this,"

Sacktor says. "There are all sorts of dystopian things one could do with these drugs." While tyrants have often rewritten history books, modern science might one day allow them to rewrite us, wiping away genocides and atrocities with a cocktail of pills.'

Having commenced the take-off operations for a C-130 cargo plane from said air force base=92s runway, a white, flashing light, resembling a very large flare and made up of two tangential spheres, one of them somewhat larger than the other, landed and rose from the head of the runway. It caused astonishment among the personnel stationed at the control tower.

However, the cargo plane did not stop, and proceeded to take off when the light was high the air. The object immediately placed itself behind the aircraft=92s tail before losing itself in the distance.
