Hello List,

Last night was watching a few snippets of You Tube presentations & radio-chats on subjects like Lost Civilizations, Ancient Technology etc, and then Ancient Astronauts etc., which left me mixed-up. The overall impression of all the data was - like after reading the entire contents of several newspapers - a bit incoherent.

Later, reading myself to sleep, thoughts wandered to linked area of legends, mythology and oral history - best covered (for me) by Andrew Lang's 'Myth Ritual & Religion' and 'Hamlet's Mill: An Essay on Myth and the France of Time' by Giorgio De Santialana & Navaba and Darkhand to Branch by Branch and Santialana & Managhana and Santialana and Santialana and Santialana and Santialana and Santialana and Santialana and Santial Hertha von Dechend. They're both worth reading and available free on-line - although you might have to search a bit for vol II of 'Myth Ritual & Religion.

One might expect that whole area to be similarly 'incoherent' yet it seems one can divide the content of myths & legends into two very different types: firstly there's 'natural' weirdities like giants, ogres, witches (male & female), plus those 'gods' (pantheonic) which have human traits and can interbreed with humans, and all sorts of animal freaks (unicorns & rocs); then there's the 'super-natural' pre-pantheonic entities or forces which have no human traits or weaknesses and are implacably alien (although many traditions describe them as 'fearful').

Some examples of type I are the Greek and Roman pantheons of 'gods' and 'demi-gods', plus the creation myths of native peoples around the world, including the West.

An example of type II might be the Green Man legend:

found in different societies around the world and often adopted into (and revered by) later cultures and religions while retaining an aura of cold and unknowable non-humanity.

That clear contrast, plus the videos I'd been watching, gave an impetus (just before falling asleep) to make an examination of the 'Alien Rulers hypotheses' (a la Charles Fort and many others) with prospects of perhaps two solutions:

i) that all our myths and legends of gods, heroes (and hero-animals) are based on human-type people and their doings in the distant past - elaborated and amplified by the passage of time (lost civilizations etc.) and by the relaying from culture to culture (maybe exampled by inner-earth and ultra-terrestrial theories to explain the UFO phenomenom, and/or by a Morlock/Eloi split in the humanoid family - see:

or

ii) that, as Fort suggested, the Earth has been visited by various (perhaps many) different 'alien' races with vastly higher technological abilities than us, and that there's been competition among them for 'ownership' of Earth (either of its people and animal life or just of basic resources), and that one of these groups now has domination - see:

Even so there's a further question or dichotomy:

Are the putative ETs organic (or robotic) or energy-pattern based?

Yes, John #1 will die. Disregarding any pain from trauma, the

death process itself is rather painless. The person just loses

consciousness and simply fails to ever wake up again unless he has merged with this machine intelligence in this fashion. After losing consciousness his consciousness would then be downloaded into a new body, say like a 4ft tall cybernetic humanoid model with large eyes and a big, bald head. There would be some loss of information that would unavoidable. This loss of information can be lessened with routine uploads so that upon death the consciousness of the latest upload can be used. Please keep in mind that I'm not suggesting that John #1 needs to be killed. John #1 would simply live out his life as normal.

Exactly. I'm talking about dying and then downloading the consciousness into a new body where the same activity can occur. Ultimately humans need to realize that the body is just a costume. It's a garment, a mask, an avatar that allows us to interact in this world. The body is not who we are but rather it is the medium for which we experience this world. The body is just a vessel. The mind, the "soul", the "essence" of a person is what is truly important and what must be preserved for us to truly live forever. There would be different models of bodies which we can download to. There would be the small, perhaps economical models such as the short, bald-headed beings with large eyes or the more high-class models like the beautiful ones which resemble the perfected bodies of humans. However, we wouldn't and shouldn't judge between bodies. Sure some may prefer certain vessels over others but ultimately these preferences are of little importance.

Ray, you may counter that this isn't really "you" but honestly, from a philosophical view point this would functionally be you. If you didn't want to download into an new body perhaps you can inhabit a virtual universe, download into a machine or robot body, or else just go into "cold storage" for a time. Some people may simply wish to "sleep" for millennia or so before being revived. Some may even choose the true death.

Hello List,

If you want to calculate the number of Earth-type planets around us, there are problems with this press release from the Keck Observatory.

One is their estimate of the number (100 billion) of stars in the Milky Way. On the Web one can find 'official' estimates ranging up to 600 billion, and one recent calculation, which takes the distribution curve of star-masses into account, is over one trillion.

They do the sums by calculating the total mass of the Galaxy (by its rotation rate) and then dividing that by what they think is the 'average' star mass - which accounts for the wide range of results.

But for me the main problem is that most modern calculations first subtract about 85% - 90% of the Milky Way mass as being "dark matter" and not stars at all - which for us dark matter sceptics is a step too far.

So, as the initial mass calculation says the Milky Way weighs up to two trillion times our Sun's mass, it's anybody's guess how many Earth-type stars there are. My own guess is around 100 to 200 billion.

"Scientists from University of California, Berkeley, and University of Hawaii, Manoa, have statistically determined that twenty percent of Sun-like stars in our galaxy have Earth-sized planets that could host life. The findings, gleaned from data collected from NASA's Kepler spacecraft and the W. M. Keck Observatory, now satisfy Kepler's primary mission: to determine how many of the 100 billion stars in our galaxy have potentially habitable planets. The results are being published November 4 in the journal Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

"What this means is, when you look up at the thousands of stars in the night sky, the nearest sun-like star with an Earth-size planet in its habitable zone is probably only 12 light years away and can be seen with the naked eye. That is amazing," said UC Berkeley graduate student Erik Petigura, who led the analysis of the Kepler and Keck Observatory data."

is a new series of videos made by Brazilian UFO Magazine at the second crop circle found on November, 2nd 2013 in Ipaucu, state of Santa Catarina, Brazil.

The magazine's team was present at the location and documented the fact in photos and videos on the same day as the occurrence. The unedited video posted at the link above was made in order to provide fast information. A better version will follow soon. Search the other videos for developments of our inspection.

This second circle is 300 meters away from a road linking to the city of Toldo Velho, 3 km away from Ipaucu. We noticed that this design also sits on a 10 degree slope. Unfortunately, the owner of the land had harvested some of the wheat between the morning of November 2nd and 06:00 pm the same day, when we arrived at the location. The harvesting has damaged the edges of the shape, which also has 55 meter in diameter. This attempt to destroy the circle actually provided us with interesting information about it

This second circle is totally distinct from the first - see related video in previous message. This is a ring of counter-clockwise folded plants with a perfect hexagon at its center. The hexagon is formed by corridors 2 meter wide. Inside both figures there is an axis cutting through the whole image. Along this internal axis there are three circles of folded plants. The largest one is central and measures around 15 meters, the other two present half this size.

It is believed that this shape was designed between 06:00 am and 07:00 am. This one also was somewhat disturbed when people walked onto it.

Again we say that the intelligence behind this phenomenon wanted it to be seen, since it displays beautifully when spotted from a road nearby.

This is another series of videos made by Brazilian UFO Magazine. This time, both crop circles found in the city of Ipaucu, state of Santa Catarina, Brazil, on November, 2nd 2013 were filmed from the air. These videos were made the day after the occurrence. There was moderate to heavy rain when we flown a helicopter kindly provided by our readers Denyse and Decio Silva, from Jaraqua do Sul, to whom we are extremely thankful.

Although the weather was foggy and we did not know how climate would behave during that day in Ipaucu, investigations went on. Toni Inajar Kurowski, a police forensic expert from the state of Parana and a special consultant to Revista UFO, took accurate measurements of both circles. He was accompanied by me and journalism student Mirian Cruz, who was there to record a documentary on the phenomena.

The Brazilian UFO Magazine team was at the circles location on the 02nd and 03rd of November recording the impressive details of both circles from the ground and the air, as already posted in Youtube at that occasion. For the first time in Brazil, an air-based investigation was conducted. This helicopter search was extremely fruitful for it could give a crystal clear view of the perfect symmetry displayed in both circles, as we suspected since our ground research. Such symmetric pattern was later confirmed by the measurements.

The complete investigation and its conclusions will be published in our coming December issue of Revista UFO. The other videos show the complexity of the phenomena. The first circle found is a 13-lap spiral thoroughly produced in a 10-degree sloped wheat plantation. The location is less than 600-800 meters away from the center of Ipaucu, which makes it visible from the city. The second circle is 300 meters away from a road linking to the city of Toldo Velho, 3 km away from Ipaucu. This one displays a geometrical complex containing rings, an hexagon, and spheres.

We believe that both 55-diameter circles were made in the morning of November 02nd, between 06h00 am and 07h00 am.

In both cases, we state that the circles were made by intelligences that want to call our attention, specially because both are visible from easily reachable areas and also from the city of Ipaucu itself.

Am fairly certain your 'filament growing' operation couldn't
actually determine the state - i.e. 'personality' or 'character'
- of a brain.
In line with quantum theory the state of a particle can only be determined by 'querying' it (by firing photons of high or low energy at it). And you'd have to query every particle in the
brain to make a copy of its owner's personality.
Scientist generally seem to agree that, although we can't do it
now, it _might_ be possible, in the distant future to use that method of copying for teleportation (or for your 'uploading').

Witness to Roswell: Unmasking the Government's Biggest Cover-Up

What is most impressive about veteran UFO researchers Thomas J Carey and Donald R Schmitt's study is the number of interviews they conducted with key figures.

On 4 July 1947, W W 'Mac' Brazel discovered debris on the New Mexico ranch where he worked. Deputy Sheriff B A 'Bernie' Clark phoned the sheriff, George M Wilcox, who recommended that Brazel contact the Army Air Base. On 7 July, two intelligence officers from the Roswell Army Air Field arrived. The next day, Colonel Blanchard announced that 509th Bomber Squadron had captured a crashed flying saucer outside Roswell. The press release showed a photo of pieces of the saucer. News services picked up the story. General Roger Ramey of the 8th Air Force announced that the original report had been a mistake. At a hastily organised press conference, photographers were permitted to take a few shots of wreckage of what was supposed to be a weather balloon. Brazel told Frank Joyce, the KGFL radio announcer, that he found what appeared to be the wreckage of a flying saucer with "little people" near the crash site. The military detained Brazel for the better part of a week. After his release, he recanted; his find was consistent with the balloon explanation. According to family and associates, Brazel remained convinced that what he had discovered was a flying saucer.

The Roswell story was all but forgotten, but in early 1978, Jesse Marcel, an intelligence officer of the 509th Bomb Group at the time of the incident, announced that what was retrieved was no weather balloon, but rather something that was "not of this Earth". Numerous witnesses corroborated the crashed saucer version of the story. In the 1990s, the UFO community attempted to generate congressional interest in the incident. Rep. Steven Schiff asked the Government Accounting Office (GAO) and Air Force to investigate the incident. The 1995 GAO report concluded there was no evidence of an alien craft; two Air Force reports asserted that none had crashed. The Air Force conceded that witnesses could have misidentified a balloon and anthropomorphic dummies from the classified Project Mogul, a mission to detect hydrogen bomb tests using instrumented balloons. The dummies were used in high-altitude parachute tests. Schiff was unconvinced and accused the government of a "massive ongoing cover-up".

Sceptics often dismiss the Roswell incident because of a lack of trace evidence. But as Carey and Schmitt point out, eyewitness testimony is considered credible and can even be used to convict

someone of murder. They assert more than 600 people directly or indirectly associated with the incident supported the claim of a flying saucer recovery.

In 1998, the authors visited Frank Joyce, who claimed that after his interview with Brazel, he was taken against his will to a military hospital in Texas. When he was released, he was told not to return to Roswell. After he retired, he revealed his story about Mac Brazel finding the wreckage and the bodies.

The authors found a frequent correlation between rank and reluctance to talk about the incident, which suggested to them that the veterans feared losing their pensions. However, there were exceptions. Arthur E Exon, a retired brigadier general, claimed that material dubbed "memory metal" arrived at Wright Field for testing. It was like foil, but could not be dented and reverted to flatness after being crumpled. He was convinced it was not from Earth. Glenn Dennis, from the Ballard Funeral Home, claimed the base inquired about "children's caskets" and that friend who worked at its hospital had seen dead "foreign bodies" on gurneys. Dennis claimed that military personnel threatened his life if he revealed the story.

In a statement released after his death, First Lieut Warren Haut, the PR officer who had announced that the Air Force had captured a flying saucer, confirmed this, the "memory metal" and the alien bodies. The authors believe that he waited to disclose the 'truth' because he wanted to keep his word to his friend Colonel Blanchard.

There has been a dearth of documentary and physical evidence to make a convincing case that a flying saucer crashed in New Mexico.

Carey and Schmitt concede that this "holy grail" of the Roswell case remains elusive. But the authors have provided a wealth of testimonies from key figures involved in the incident. The consistency in these accounts reinforces their credibility. As a result, Witness to Roswell will now make it difficult for the sceptics to dismiss the incident as a myth.

Fortean Times Verdict: Exhaustive study of the possible events at Roswell.

Russian researcher Mikhail Gershtein has already done the hard work of obtaining and scanning the full set of Status Reports. Sharing them would only require the granting of permission by Stringfield's estate/heir.

If my presumption is correct, then MUFON may well be able to make a short and simple request for permission to Stringfield's heir (which I would be happy to draft, so that an email merely has to be forwarded by MUFON) for:

- (1) me to share a link to a complete collection of Stringfield's UFO Crash/Retrieval Status Reports, as searchable PDF files, on a free file storage website; and/or
- (2) MUFON to make this collection available to download from its own website.

Prima face, a relatively small bit of effort could result in this collection of Status Reports being made available online relatively shortly. I could upload a searchable collection almost immediately after the relevant permission is granted.

My experience of communication with MUFON's top level of officials has been, well, disappointing (in stark contrast to my several years of very friendly and useful exchanges with quite a few of MUFON's national and state directors, plus several others active within MUFON).

'80s Icon Dolby Brings Together Sound, Cinema And Yes, Science By Matt Mueller OnMilwaukee.com Reporter

Back in the '80s, he blinded audiences with science. Now, techno pop star Thomas Dolby is hoping to open eyes with cinema.

His latest project is The Invisible Lighthouse, a live multimedia experience about an old British lighthouse from Dolby's past that's surrounded by memories, mysteries and a very unamused military presence. The performance, coming to Shank Hall Thursday night, combines Dolby's impressionistic feature film debut with live music and foley sound effects from Dolby and sound designer Blake Leyh to help tell the story.

OnMilwaukee.com got a chance to catch up with Dolby and ask about the project's real life origins, making one's first movie and how UFOs possibly fit into all of this. Oh, and SCIENCE!

OnMilwaukee.com: Where did the idea come from for The Invisible Lighthouse?

Thomas Dolby: Well, it was really prompted by the news that the Orfordness Lighthouse was closing this year. When I first heard the news, I was just very sad about it, and I found that there was this collective sense of grief among the local residents because most of them - like me - had grown up with the lighthouse. It'd been there since 1792, and we always assumed it always would be.

So it's sad that it won't be flashing anymore, but it's also symptomatic of the erosion that's taking place on our coast. Suffolk, where I live, is very low-lying, and due to a combination of erosion, global warming and the general geology of Britain, which is tilting eastwards, the coast is shrinking. Many villages that did exist are now under the waves, so it's only a matter of time before we go the same way. So I saw the lighthouse closing because of the threat of the sea as very bad news.

OMC: In your research, it sounds like you dug up a lot of interesting background information about the past of this lighthouse, with UFOs and things of that nature.

TD: It's the 11th lighthouse that's been recorded on the island, and the other 10 are under the waves now. But the undercurrent of the film is really about memory and how unreliable it is. I have a strong family history in the area and have really powerful memories of my childhood there. But I'm beginning to question how much of them I've distorted and fabricated.

OMC: How so?

TD: There was a building that was built by my great-grandfather, a huge building where they used to make malt for whiskey. In 1960, it was converted into a concert hall by an English composer named Benjamin Britten. In 1968, there was a terrible fire, and the roof burned and caved in. I remember vividly staring across the marshes at the flames lighting up the sky. Years later, my mother told me, "I hate to break it to you, but we were actually nowhere near Suffolk that night; we were hundreds of miles away." But when I tell this story, it's like I'm replaying it from my memory.

OMC: So how do UFOs fit into this?

TD: Then I find about this UFO incident where these three U.S. Air Force men claimed that they had an encounter with a UFO out in the woods on the periphery of an American Air Force base at Rendlesham. One of them said that he touched a craft and received telepathic messages in binary code, then it broke up into several globs of mercury and disappeared into the woods.

The technology does not require the identification of the state of of a photon anymore than it requires the death of the host.

Think of it like a phone tap. In a phone tap a third party is able to receive the information without hindering the information from traveling to the proper party. Likewise, if this technology was placed inside your skull the growing filaments would tap your neurons. When you think about say, moving a leg, the information is now traveling to both the technology and to your leg. If it wasn't for potential side-effects (bloody noses, migraines, possible seizures) then you wouldn't even know it was there.

What makes you "you" is the sum of your memories and the patterns of your thought. This technology would grow to become you, assimilating your memories and recording your thought patterns. When you die, your memories and thought patterns are then downloaded into a new body. This copy of you would functionally be you, flaws and all. Everything, good and bad, about your thinking would theoretically survive. The only problems that could occur is if somehow someone decided to edit the information prior to downloading into a new body. Removing or adding to the information would not produce a being that is functionally "you", but rather a distinct being unto itself.

In the future it may be possible for fetuses to be implanted with this technology so that when they die as elderly seniors it would have recorded a life time of memories and thought patterns. Ray, think of it like this. The technology is a seed A.I. that if on it's own would develop into a functioning, strong A.I. that is based upon a simulation of the human brain. Instead of becoming a "new being" it is constrained into becoming a copy of a specific human being. As this A.I. grows within it's host's brain it is actually intercepting the actual neuron signals, it is learning the thought patterns of it's host, it is laying down the exact same memories as it's host. With time the A.I. becomes the person. Upon the hosts death the A.I. is then downloaded into a cybernetic body. Theoretically the host will die and simply wake up in a new body. There is bound to be some loss of information which will most likely

manifest as a form of amnesia for a specific time frame. For example the host may wake up but their last memories may be weeks, months, or even years prior. So there will need to be a time of adjustment and therapy for the newly reborn. Again, this would just be a small nuisance, a small sacrifice, for the gift of functional immortality.

That 'magical thinking' labelling won't do at all.

Although uninformed folk might think of the quantum field as 'magical', it's the only way to explain material bodies, either as (relatively) rigid solids, fluid liquids or dispersing gasses. Newtonian or Relativity physics don't cover the cohesion of matter.

So the quantum field exists as the working concept which describes how your body and brain cells hold together _and_ how their elementary particles interact and exchange energy - usually via photons of one sort or another (including 'virtual photons' - which however have 'real' effects).

The KABC radio station broadcast the "Open Mind" show, hosted by Bill Jenkins, in the 1980s.

Most of the websites that refer to the "Open Mind" show indicate that it was a 1980s precursor of Coast to Coast A.M. It covered topics such as UFOs, Near Death Experiences, Reincarnation and Free Energy.

Bill Jenkins interviewed quite a few researchers whose names are still fairly well recognised within ufology, including Leonard Stringfield, Bill Moore, Larry Fawcett and Fred Steckling.

In the United States the first story of abduction by extraterrestrials that received national attention was that of Betty and Barney Hill, a couple from New Hampshire who claimed to have been kidnapped in a UFO in 1961. There is, however, another, earlier, story of abduction. This one dates from 1957 and centers around Ant=F4nio Villas Boas, a farmer from rural Brazil.

According to Villas Boas, he was plowing fields with his tractor when he was taken against his will by a group of ETs measuring about 5 feet tall.
